## Private Advertisement.

The *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* and the Acts amending the same.

APPLICATION BY THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KOROIT FOR AN ORDER UNDER THE SAID ACTS AUTHORIZING SUCH COUNCIL TO SUPPLY ELECTRICITY FOR ANY PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PURPOSES, INCLUDING LIGHTING AND MOTIVE POWER, IN THE BOROUGH OF KOROIT.

THE Council of the Borough of Koroit hereby gives notice of its intention to apply for an order under the provisions of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* and the Acts amending the same.

(a) The object of the application is to obtain an order under the said Acts authorizing the applicant Council to use or supply electricity for any and all public and private purposes, including lighting and motive power, within the area hereinafter described.

(b) The applicant is the Council of the Borough of Koroit, whose address is "Borough Council Chambers, Koroit."

(c) The proposed area of supply is all that land included within the borough of Koroit, county of Villiers; such area will be set out and shown in red on the deposited map referred to in the proposed Order in Council.

In case of difference between the above description and the area and lines delineated upon the deposited map, the latter shall prevail.

A copy of the deposited map of the said proposed area will be deposited for public inspection with the Postmaster at Koroit, and another at the Borough Council Chambers, Koroit, before the application is lodged.

(d) 1. The streets dedicated to public use in and along which it is proposed that electric lines shall be or may at some time be laid down or erected are the whole of the streets, roads, and rights-of-way in and throughout the said area.

2. But the applicant at present contemplates or proposes the laying down or erection of electric lines and works only in the following streets within the area:—

Commencing at the Power House, High-street, Koroit; thence south-easterly along High-street to Queen-street; and thence along Queen-street to Albert-street south to the Pumping Station.

From High-street along Garden-street to Albert-street.  
From High-street along Mill-street to Midgley-street;  
thence north along Midgley-street.

From Power House along High-street across Commercial-road along Spring Creek-road north to Railway Reserve.

From intersection of High-street and Commercial-road east to Butter Factory.

From intersection of High-street and Commercial-road west to Nine Mile Creek-road.

From Commercial-road north along Station-street to Railway Reserve.

From Commercial-road south along Commercial-place to King-street; and thence along King-street.

All of which said lines are indicated in yellow on the plan lodged with the application.

(e) The applicant proposes to lay or erect the lines referred to in clause (d) 2 above within two years from the final granting of the Order, and to extend them as may become necessary from time to time throughout the area; but the times within which such extensions shall be made cannot now be specified.

(f) The applicant does not propose to take power under the said order to interfere with or break up any tramway or railway.

(g) Printed copies of the draft order and of the order when made will be obtainable as soon as the application is made at a price of Five shillings each by any person at the Borough Council Chambers, Koroit, and at the office of the Municipal Association of Victoria, 369 Collins-street, Melbourne.

(h) Copies of notices of objections and other documents may be served on the applicant at the office of the Town Clerk of the Borough of Koroit, Borough Council Chambers, Koroit.

The application will be made within twenty-eight days of the twenty-second day of December, 1911, being the date of the *Government Gazette* in which this notice appears.

Every council, company, person, or persons desirous of bringing before the Minister of Public Works, by whom the said Act is administered, any objection respecting the application, must do so within three months from the twenty-second day of December, 1911 (the date of the

*Government Gazette* containing this advertisement), by notice, addressed to the Hon. the Minister of Public Works, the outside of the cover containing such notice being marked "*Electric Light and Power Act 1896*," and a copy of every such notice of objection must also be forwarded to the applicant for the now proposed order.
