REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition or surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

SHIRE OF TOWONG.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903 (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Towong described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Towong and constituted a new municipality, under the name and title of "The Shire of Corryong."

Area described in petition:—Commencing at a point on the Murray River at the north-west corner of allotment 2, section 11, parish of Burrowye; thence southerly by the west boundary of that portion to the main road; thence by

that road westerly to the north-west corner of allotment 31 of same section; thence south along west boundary of that allotment; thence east to the north-west corner of allotment 33; thence south along west boundary of allotments 33 and 35 and 38 to its south-west corner; thence easterly to the north-west corner of allotment 11A, parish of Koetong; thence by east boundary of allotments 11A, 11, 18, 28, and 28A to south-east corner of last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly to north-east corner of allotment 38; thence south by east boundary of that portion and allotment 48 to south-east corner of allotment 7, section A; thence by south-east boundary of that portion to main Koetong-road, and by road westerly to Koetong Creek; thence southerly by west bank of that creek to top of divide between Tallangatta Creek and Koetong Creek watersheds; thence southerly and easterly along said divide to "Half Way"; thence southerly and easterly by road from Cravensville to Glendart to Dart River, and by that river southerly to the junction of Brown's Creek; thence by Brown's Creek southerly to the Gib Range, and along that range to boundary of Omeo Shire; thence easterly by that boundary to the Murray River, and by that river northerly and westerly to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the Shire as at present constituted is too large for effective administration from one centre. The area is 2,545 square miles, and it is all very mountainous country. That the Shire is practically divided by a large belt of unsettled mountainous country, and there is very little community of interest between the two portions, and that under present conditions it is impossible to give the outlying parts of the Shire adequate attention, and the interests of the ratepayers suffer in consequence.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Towong and constitute it a separate shire, under the name and title of "The Shire of Corryong," and that the proposed new municipality be divided into three Ridings.

The Education Acts.

REGULATION XXV. RESCINDED, REGULATION MADE.

At an Executive Council held at the Railway Station, Spencer-street, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of February, 1911.

WHEREAS by the Education Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Acts into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXV. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, in so far as it relates to Boards of Advice, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

SCHOOL COMMITTEES.—NOMINATION AND APPOINTMENT.

1. For each school or group of schools, the Governor in Council may appoint a School Committee, such Committee to consist of not more than seven persons. Before any arrangements are made for the appointment of a School Committee for a group of schools, the approval of the Minister must first be obtained.

2. As soon as convenient after the passing of the *Education Act 1910* authorizing such appointments, the first meeting of the parents of children attending the school or group of schools shall be summoned by the head teacher for the purpose of nominating candidates for appointment to the School Committee, and parents' meetings for a like purpose shall thereafter be held during the month of February once every three years.

3. If from any unforeseen cause a parents' meeting as provided for above shall not be held, arrangements may be made by the Minister of Public Instruction for a special parents' meeting at a time and on a date to be fixed.

4. No person shall be appointed a member of a School Committee for more than three years.

5. All members of the School Committee shall retire on the day preceding the date of the next triennial parents' meeting succeeding the date of their appointment.

6. Whenever, during a period which elapses between two triennial appointments, a vacancy occurs through death, resignation, or other cause, in any School Committee, and it may not be advisable or practicable to hold a ballot for nomination to fill such vacancy, the Governor in Council may appoint some suitable person to fill up such vacancy, and the person so appointed shall hold office until the date of the next triennial parents' meeting succeeding the date of his appointment.

7. Seven days prior to the date fixed for the parents' meeting, the head teacher shall announce to the children attending the school the date, hour, place, and object of such meeting, and shall notify parents. A notice containing these particulars shall be posted on the door of the school building seven days prior to the parents' meeting.

8. The head teacher shall preside at such meeting or appoint a deputy.

9. Nominations shall be made at the meeting, and received by the head teacher or his deputy. If any person so nominated be not present at the meeting, his written consent to such nomination must be produced.

10. If for any cause, no nominations, or a less number of nominations than is necessary for the School Committee, shall be made at the parents' meeting called for the purpose, a report to that effect shall be sent by the head teacher to the Minister of Public Instruction, who may order arrangements for a further meeting, or may take such steps as may be considered desirable for appointment of the Committee.

11. If the number of persons who shall have become candidates shall not exceed the number of persons to be appointed to the School Committee, the head teacher or his deputy shall then declare such candidates to be duly nominated, and shall notify same to the Minister of Public Instruction, and the names of the persons appointed shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

12. If, however, the number of candidates shall exceed the number of members to be appointed, the head teacher or his deputy shall at the parents' meeting hereinafter provided for proceed to hold a ballot. Two scrutineers shall be appointed by those present at the meeting.

13. The ballot shall be held in the school building.

14. The head teacher shall have entire control of the ballot, and may appoint a deputy, or deputies, to act for or on his behalf.

15. The scrutineers shall hand to each parent entitled to vote a paper on which the voter shall write the names of not more than the number of candidates for whom there are vacancies. The list of candidates may be written by the head teacher on a blackboard.

16. Should any question or dispute arise during the progress of the ballot, and having reference to the same, the matter shall be referred at once to the head teacher, or his deputy, who shall have power to decide the same. The scrutineers shall collect the voting papers, count the number of votes given to each candidate, and report to the head teacher the result of the voting. Both parents of a child attending the school shall be entitled to vote. The head teacher shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes, to be duly nominated for appointment to the School Committee, shall post a notice to like effect on the school door, and shall notify the Minister of Public Instruction, in the form of the First Schedule, of the names of the persons so nominated. The names of the persons appointed shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

17. If two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the names of these candidates shall be announced, if a further ballot is thus rendered necessary, and the head teacher, or his deputy, shall forthwith take steps to hold a ballot to determine which of such candidates shall be included in the required number of persons to be nominated for appointment.

18. If from any cause, after a parents' meeting shall have been duly summoned for the purpose of a ballot, no such ballot shall take place, the parents' meeting shall stand adjourned until the same day of the following week, and the head teacher shall give not less than three days' previous notice thereof by announcement to the children.

19. Three members of the School Committee shall form a quorum.

20. Any member of a School Committee who shall absent himself from the meetings of the Committee for three months consecutively, having been duly summoned to attend, shall be liable to be removed, and may thereupon be removed by the Governor in Council.

21. The removal by the Governor in Council of any member of a School Committee for misconduct shall render every such person ineligible for re-election, and incapable of holding the position of a member of a School Committee for a period of three years from the date of such removal, or for such further period as may be determined by the Governor in Council.

22. It shall be the duty of the head teacher to summon the School Committee to its first meeting within a reasonable time after appointment for the purpose of electing officers and arranging for the carrying out of the duties of the Committee.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

For Business Sites.

1. Where samples are provided for, the supplies are to be equal in quality, finish, and in all other respects to, and of the same colour as, the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification. In cases where supplies of a particular maker or of a particular brand or trade mark

or of a particular distinguishing mark of such maker, brand, or trade mark are required, the supplies shall conform in all respects with the specified requirements. All supplies are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

HEALTH BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under sections 31, 32, and 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 26, for the proper management and construction of privies.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. A suitable privy shall be attached to every house, shop, or building erected or hereafter to be erected within the City of Bendigo.

2. Every such privy shall have (a) an entrance door; (b) a trap door for removing the pan; (c) a wooden covering for the seat; (d) a sufficient ventilator pipe rising up to and through the roof; (e) a fly-proof middenstead; (f) a proper and effectual screen from public view. No privy shall be deemed to be a suitable privy unless it is equipped with each of these requirements.

3. Every such privy shall be kept in good repair and condition.

4. The owner or occupier of such house, shop, or building shall be liable for any breach of this By-law.

5. The penalty for a breach of this By-law shall not exceed £5; and shall not exceed £1 for each day during which such breach shall be continued.
