Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the Determination of the Board dated 1st May, 1907, be cancelled and annulled on and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.

(2) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier shall be-

Foreman (i.e., a responsible person in charge of a fire) 57s. 6d. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week All other journeymen 50s. ,, ,, ,, ,, ,, ,,

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

NUMBER.

(5) That the number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place in which the process, trade, or business of a farrier is carried on shall be one apprentice and one improver to every three adult males or fraction thereof.

OVERTIME.

- (6) (a) That any male employé over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a farrier who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of double time.
- (b) That the wages price or rate which shall be paid to any person engaged in the process, trade, or business of a farrier outside the hours fixed as the time of beginning and ending work upon each day shall be at the rate of double time.

TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

(7) That the time of beginning and ending work in any factory or work-room or shop or place in which is carried on the process, trade, or business of a farrier, shall be

HOLIDAYS .- SPECIAL RATES FOR.

- (8) That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, and the 26th day of January in each year or such other day as may be observed as a Public Heliday in lieu thereof, shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons or classes of persons.
 - (9) That the above Determination shall come into force on and after the 5th day of March, 1911.
