Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRO-PLATERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating;
- (b) Metal polishing;
- (c) Enamelling or japanning metals;

other than persons subject to the Determination of any one of the following Boards:—

Bedstead Makers Board
Brassworkers Board
Jewellers Board
Ovenmakers Board
Tinsmiths Board

has made the following Determination, viz:—

ADULTS.

WAGES.

1. That the Determination of the Electro-platers Board, dated the 3rd August, 1910, shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.
2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—
 - (a) Electro-plating;
 - (b) Metal polishing;
 - (c) Enamelling or japanning metals; shall be as follows, viz:—

ELECTRO-PLATERS AND POLISHERS.

- (1) Electro-platers, i.e., persons engaged—
 - (a) Mixing electro-plating solutions; or
 - (b) Keeping such solutions in proper working order; or
 - (c) Controlling the supply and generation of the electric current for electro-plating;

and employed within a radius of 70 miles of Melbourne 66s. per week of 48 hours

ELECTRO-PLATERS AND POLISHERS—*continued.*

- (2) Electro-platers, *i.e.*, persons engaged in—
 (a) Mixing electro-plating solutions; or
 (b) Keeping such solutions in proper working order; or
 (c) Controlling the supply and generation of the electric current for electro-plating;
 and employed outside a radius of 70 miles of Melbourne 60s. per week of 45 hours
- (3) Wetstone grinders 55s. " "
- (4) Grinders and polishers employed within a radius of 70 miles of Melbourne 51s. " "
- (5) Grinders and polishers employed outside a radius of 70 miles of Melbourne 45s. " "
- (6) Lacquerers and burnishers 46s. " "
- (7) Persons not otherwise provided for 48s. " "

ENAMELLERS AND JAPANNERS.

- (1) Liners and hand decorators 54s. per week of 48 hours
- (2) Finishing coaters 49s. " "
- (3) Rim centrers 49s. " "
- (4) Frame-cleaners by machine, for enamelling 48s. " "
- (5) Persons employed as dipping hands, hand polishers, rubbers down, or wheel coaters 42s. " "
- (6) First coaters 43s. " "
- (7) Transferrers and frame cleaners by hand 40s. " "
- (8) Persons not otherwise provided for 48s. " "

PROPORTION OF IMPROVERS.

3. (a) That the number of improvers who may be employed in any factory or work-room or shop or place in which the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating;
 (b) Metal polishing;
 (c) Enamelling or japanning metals;

is carried on shall be—

One improver to every four persons or fraction thereof receiving not less than 42s. per week.

APPRENTICES.

WAGES.

4. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating;
 (b) Metal polishing;
 (c) Enamelling or japanning metals;

shall be as follow:—

ELECTRO-PLATING.

Apprentices.

- (a) 1st year's experience 7s. 6d. per week of 48 hours
- 2nd " 12s. 6d. " "
- 3rd " 17s. 6d. " "
- 4th " 22s. 6d. " "
- 5th " 27s. 6d. " "
- 6th " 35s. " "
- and thereafter the minimum wage.

POLISHING.

Apprentices.

- (b) 1st year's experience 11s. 3d. per week of 48 hours
- 2nd " 16s. 3d. " "
- 3rd " 27s. 6d. " "
- 4th " 40s. " "
- and thereafter the minimum wage.

ENAMELLING, JAPANING, LINING, AND DECORATING.

Apprentices.

- (c) 1st year's experience 7s. 6d. per week of 48 hours
- 2nd " 12s. 6d. " "
- 3rd " 17s. 6d. " "
- 4th " 22s. 6d. " "
- 5th " 27s. 6d. " "
- 6th " 35s. " "
- and thereafter the minimum wage.

IMPROVERS.

WAGES.

5. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to male improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating ;
- (b) Metal polishing ;
- (c) Enamelling or japanning metals ;

shall be as follow :—

1st six months' experience	10s. per week of 48 hours
2nd "	12s. 6d. " "
3rd "	15s. " "
4th "	17s. 6d. " "
5th "	25s. " "
6th "	30s. " "
4th year's experience	40s. " "

and thereafter the minimum wage.

GENERAL WORKERS.

6. Boys (other than apprentices or improvers) employed only at slinging and unslinging, hanging, cleaning, scouring, scratch brushing, drying out, or cleaning old enamel off cycle wheels—

14 to 15 years of age...	9s. per week of 48 hours
15 to 16 " "	11s. 6d. " "

OVERTIME.

7. That any male person engaged in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating ;
- (b) Metal polishing ;
- (c) Enamelling or japanning metals ;

who works for more than 48 hours per week shall be paid time and a quarter for such extra time so worked.

HOLIDAYS—SPECIAL RATES FOR.

8. That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons, or classes of persons, for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Eight Hours' Day, New Year's Day, and Good Friday, shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons, or classes of persons.

9. That this Determination shall come into force on and after the 30th day of January, 1911.
