BUSHETT SHOAL, OFF CHEVIOT COAST.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 7 of 1911, issued by this Department on the 24th January, 1911, Captain Hollons, of the Government s.s. *Hinemoa*, reports, after further examination of the rocks reported by Mr. C. Bushett, of the fishing vessel *Wairoa*, that the patch of foul ground extends 500 feet in an E.S.E. and W.N.W. direction, and 200 feet N.N.E. and S.S.W., carrying from 12 to 16 fathoms of water on its outer edge, and from 5 to 10 fathoms towards the centre, from which rise several pinnacles, two of them having only 15 feet to 17 feet of water over them at low-water spring tides.

These rocks are free of kelp.

The bottom between these rocks and the four-fathom shoal is rocky, carrying from 18 to 19 fathoms of water.

This dangerous reef lies S. 27 deg. E. (true), distant three-quarters of a mile from the south end of the four-fathom shoal, and its position is indicated by the following true bearings taken from the 15-ft. pinnacle rock:—

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within Divisions 1, 2, and 3 of the Waterworks District of the Trust, such Divisions having been limited and defined by Orders in Council bearing date the 4th May, 1909, and 21st December, 1910.

1. Division I.—A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within such Division.

2. Division II.—A rate of Fourpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within such Division.

3. Division III.—A rate of Threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within such Division.

4. For the supply of water within the said Divisions 1, 2, and 3 to gardens and special plots of land, on or near any of the Trust's channels, or to land not included therein, the charge shall be such as the Commissioners of the Trust, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

5. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1911, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1911, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1911.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.—BY-LAW No. 13.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the By-law following for The Ballarat Water Supply District:—

1. A rate for the year 1911 is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1903*, within the said Water Supply District, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated, for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

(a) On every house or tenement of the net annual value of £20 and under, the minimum sum of One pound; except for unoccupied lands, where no water is laid on, and on these the sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(b) On every house or tenement above the net annual value of £20, and not exceeding £300, the sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(c) On every house or tenement above the net annual value of £300, and not exceeding £500, the sum of £4 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(d) On every house or tenement above the net annual value of £500, the sum of £4 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

(e) On every warehouse and wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes, the sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1911, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1911, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1911, at the office of The Ballarat Water Commissioners, in Grenville-street.

3. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1911.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety and become due on the 1st day of March, 1911.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive

under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, or plastering.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

5. That the licensee shall keep the area licensed in a cleanly and orderly condition to the satisfaction of the Minister.

6. That the licensee shall on the area licensed, and on a rear corner thereof, erect a closet, with floor measurement of not less than five (5) feet by three (3) feet, to be constructed of wood with iron roof, and the pan door to be placed in the wall abutting on the right-of-way.

7. That this licence shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any Bailiff of Crown Lands.

8. That the non-observance of or non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the obligations or conditions set forth in this licence shall render such licence null and void, and the Governor in Council may thereupon cancel such licence and cause the land described

therein to be re-entered by any Bailiff of Crown Lands and dealt with as unoccupied Crown land. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF
DONALD.

WE, George Frederick Oakley, William Geake Pearse, Edwin George Gustavus Lamplough, Maurice Lederman, and Arthur Percival Schafer, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the Town of Donald, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection of and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not to exceed forty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, *fêtes*, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve. And provided always that the Committee of Management shall apply all moneys received for the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names in the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, or ride or drive over the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF
POOWONG.

WE, Richard Terrell Crowl, Thomas Walker Horsley, Charles Robert Mair, Henry Moorhead Osborne, and Edward Spink Revell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 18th January, 1909, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Poowong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for entertainments, cricket, or football matches, sports, *fêtes*, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Lands and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No bookmaker shall ply his trade or calling in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

FARM ALLOTMENTS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE,
HURSTWOOD ESTATE.

THE several allotments included in the Schedule hereunder are declared available as Farm Allotments until 1st March, 1911. Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The lessee must reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by a wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.
