## ROCK OFF S.W. CAPE, STEWART ISLAND.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 145 of 1910, Captain Bollons, of the Government steamer *Hinemoa*, reports that he surveyed the rock off Evening Island on the 8th instant. It is 250 feet in extent N.E. and S.W., and 100 feet N.W. and S.E., and is not marked by kelp. There is 9 feet of water over the shallowest part at low water, spring tides. The ebb stream runs to the S.W. over the rock at the rate of 2 to 4 knots.

The rock is situated 5 cables S. 88 deg. E. of the south end of Evening Island, and the following marks and bearings were taken to determine its position.

East ext. of Long Island in line with the high bluff of Weather Point N. 11 deg. E.

Murphy Islet open one-third of its own length clear of the south cape of Stewart Island N. 82 deg. E.

The south and S.W. capes in line N. 87 deg. E. clear the rock (see *erratum* below).

Bearings are correct magnetic.

## SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI.

A By-law of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 12, for Sanitary Service.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws and Regulations on the matter and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed, except as to the acts done and penalties incurred and proceedings in law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. Every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.
4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service herein provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council of the said Shire may at any time, and from time to time, license or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the hereinafter described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.
6. No occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises save in accordance with this By-law.
7. Once at least in each week the Council shall cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the day-time in a cart or other conveyance having springs and covered in so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia, and at the time of such removal as aforesaid a pan cleansed by some efficient means shall be left in the place of the pan so removed.
8. All night-soil when removed shall be deposited only at such place or places and in such manner within the Shire as the Officer of Health or Inspector of Nuisances shall approve.
9. The system will be known as the Double-pan Day System.
10. Every occupier or other person having the control or management of any premises shall provide and keep in use in every closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.
11. No person shall place any slops, rubbish, or kitchen, or other refuse, in any pan, or anything that may prove injurious to such pan.
12. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, urine, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, and no person shall place or deposit any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, urine, or other offensive matter in any public drain, or in any position from which it may be carried to any public drain by a flow of water or other liquid.
13. No closet door or trap shall abut upon or be within six feet of any footpath, lane, street, or right-of-way.
14. Every occupier of any premises shall collect all dust, mud, ashes, broken glass, crockery, tins, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, and for the temporary deposit

of such refuse shall provide and keep on the premises one or more covered boxes sufficient to contain the collection of one week. The dimensions of each box shall not exceed three cubic feet and in weight, when filled, 112 lbs., so that the same may, with the contents thereof, be readily and conveniently movable by one man. Every occupier or person having control of premises shall cause all such refuse to be deposited as soon as convenient in such box or receptacle.

15. The said Council shall have power from time to time to make such sanitary rate or rates or such charge or charges as to the said Council may seem meet to provide for the cost of the work herein specified; also a charge on each occupier or person having the control of premises for the first pan supplied, the amount of such rate or rates, charge or charges, to be paid by each occupier or person having the control of premises at such time or times as the said Council shall by resolution from time to time fix, and in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

16. The Council may, on the recommendation of the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises from the operation of this By-law.

17. Any person who shall commit a breach of, or fail to observe or perform any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

18. This By-law shall apply to that part of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai comprised within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point on the sea coast at the south-east angle of allotment 50, parish of Wonthaggi; thence northerly along the east boundary of said allotment 50 to the south-west angle of allotment 23B; thence easterly, northerly, and easterly and northerly along the south boundary of said allotment 23B to the south-west angle of allotment 25A<sup>2</sup>; thence along the south boundary of said allotment 25A<sup>2</sup> to the south-east angle thereof; thence south to the south-west angle of allotment 25D; thence easterly and northerly along the south and east boundaries of allotment 25D to the north-east angle thereof; thence south-easterly along a road to the south-east angle of allotment 32; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of said allotment 32 to the north-east angle thereof; thence westerly to the north-west angle of said allotment 32; thence northerly along a road on the east boundaries of allotments 15 and 10 to the Powlett River; thence westerly along the Powlett River to the south-east angle of allotment 10A, parish of Wonthaggi North; thence along a road on the eastern and northerly boundaries of allotment 10A to the north-west angle thereof; thence northerly by a road on the eastern boundaries of allotments 117 and 115A to the north-east angle of allotment 115A; thence westerly along the north boundaries of allotments 115A, 115, 115C to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly to the south-west angle of said allotment 115C; thence along a road to the north-east angle of allotment 73A, parish of Woolamai; thence westerly along north boundary of said allotment 73A to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly along the western boundaries of allotments 73A and 73B to the south-west angle of said allotment 73B; thence by a line due south to the southern boundary of allotment 93B; thence easterly along the said south boundary of allotment 93B to the south-east angle thereof; thence southerly by a road on the west boundary of allotment 77 to the south-west angle thereof; thence south-westerly along the western boundary of allotment 93D to the Powlett River; thence along the Powlett River to the sea coast; thence south-easterly along the sea coast to the commencing point.

Resolution for passing this By-law, No. 12, agreed to by the Council the 20th day of December, 1910, and confirmed the 23rd day of January, 1911.

#### Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893.

### THE NORADJUHA AND TOOLONDO RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT AND THE NORADJUHA AND TOOLONDO RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., by an Order in Council dated the third day of February, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of February, 1911, and in the *West Wimmera Mail and Natimuk and Goroke Advertiser*, a newspaper circulating in such proposed district, announced my intention to constitute, under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the land hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the Noradjuha and Toolondo Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by me praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the line of railway from Noradjuha to Toolondo, authorized by the *Noradjuha to Toolondo Railway Construction Act 1909* be not constructed: Now therefore I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby by this my Order constitute the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title

of the Noradjuha and Toolondo Railway Construction District, and I do hereby constitute a Trust for the said Railway Construction District, consisting of twelve (12) trustees, being the members for the time being of the Central and South Ridings of the Shire of Arapiles, the East Riding of the Shire of Kowree, and the Balmoral Riding of the Shire of Wannon. The land above referred to:—

## REGULATION NO. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY  
FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE  
TRUST.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

- "(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- "(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- "(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Noradjuha and Toolondo Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz. :—

1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.
27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.
28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.
29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.
30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.
31. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.
32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.
33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.
34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.
40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.
41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.
44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.
45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its content do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.
46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.
47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.
48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.
49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.
50. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.
51. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.
52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, without any petition, make Orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the conterminous boundaries of the Shires of Wodonga and Yackandandah, doth hereby declare the boundaries herein set forth and described to be in lieu of those previously proclaimed, which are hereby cancelled, that is to say:—

#### SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.—REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN WEST COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, as Managers of the Chiltern West Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations hitherto in force in respect of such Common.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oven, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within the Shire of Rutherglen may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of April and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse, 12s. per annum; for every head of other large cattle, 9s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 5s. per annum. Provided also that for every additional beast after the number of fifteen registered by one owner, double rates shall be charged.

Cattle, weaned from their mothers or the bucket and not more than twelve months old depasturing on the Common, half rates. Progeny (under nine months old) of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free, provided always that such progeny of stock shall be registered by the herdsman.

4. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portion only of the Common as the Managers may set apart for the purpose.

6. No bull shall be allowed on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the Managers.

7. In the event of stock duly registered to depasture on the Common being impounded, the herdsman shall, as soon as he is aware thereof, notify the owner of such stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds) for each offence.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated around the Cow Plains Station, on the Ouyen-Cow Plains railway line, now in course of construction, and is from 2 to 18 miles east from Murrayville, and from 49 to 67 miles south-west from Ouyen.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated to the north and east of Ouyen, and is from 3 to 10 miles from the Ouyen Railway Station.

Applications (with uncanceled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount, affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Wednesday, 19th April, 1911.

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land to the value of 2s. 6d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the licence, another 2s. 6d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 7s. 6d. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the licence.

The first half-year's rent and licence-fee must be paid prior to issue of licence, and, provided improvements equivalent in value to the amount of rent due for each year be expended on the land during each of such years, in addition to the value required by the ordinary improvement condition, as set forth above, further payment of rent may be suspended until the end of the third year, and such suspended payments, without interest, will be collected in instalments during the remaining term of the licence.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. 6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 15 of these conditions.

12. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railway Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

17. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

18. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

19. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Clause 18.

20. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 18 and 19 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

The contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for services rendered, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under this contract have been employed in accordance with clause 22 of these conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workmen as is provided for under that clause.

The times and hours during or at which respectively any such registered hall or other building used for public meetings or any registered building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be closed shall be from Twelve o'clock midnight on each week-day night to the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding week-day, save that on Saturday night the closing hour shall be half-past Eleven o'clock. Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall extend or be applied to any registered hall or building to prevent the holding of public worship therein on Sundays.
