#### SHIRE OF KARKAROOC.—BY-LAW No. 5.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of any other power thereunto enabling them on that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Karkarooc, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township boundaries of Hopetoun, Beulah, Woomelang, and the portion of the township of Rainbow within the Shire of Karkarooc.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied, and kept supplied, with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan of such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid, and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolutions for passing this By-law, No. 5, agreed to by the Council the seventeenth day of January, 1911, and confirmed the 21st day of February, 1911.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of the said Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives: Now therefore in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act His Excellency the Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of Explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1 made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality, and character of which are hereby defined:—

## CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

*Division 1.*

Pitsea Powder, consisting of neutral nitrate of ammonium, nitro-glycerine, and wood-meal, provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 9 per cent. of the finished explosive. Provided that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

*Division 2.*

Curtisite, consisting of a mixture of neutral nitrate of ammonium, tri-nitro-tolnol, mono-nitro-naphthalene, and with or without starch.

Rendite, consisting of potassium nitrate, potassium carbonate, sulphur, picric acid, and woodmeal, with or without the addition of graphite; provided that (1) the amount of picric acid or graphite shall not exceed 2 per cent. of the finished explosive; (2) the amount of potassium carbonate added shall be sufficient to impart an alkaline reaction to the finished explosive.

Nobels' Rendite, consisting of a mixture of neutral nitrate of ammonium and tri-nitro-tolnol.

WHEREAS by the 52nd section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that notwithstanding anything in the First Part of the said Act the Governor in Council may from time to time by order prohibit either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such order: And whereas in the judgment of the Governor in Council, it is expedient for the public safety to make

this Order: Now therefore in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act His Excellency the Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

That the undermentioned explosives shall not be imported from any place out of Victoria, kept, conveyed, or sold, except upon the conditions or restrictions set forth in Order in Council No. 6 of the 12th day of October, 1909:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers, under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Northcote order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence to erect any hoarding for advertising or other similar purposes until he shall have lodged with the Town Surveyor a complete plan and specification showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such hoarding, and the manner in, and the materials of which it is proposed to construct the same, and until the Town Surveyor shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, with such modifications or additions thereto as in his opinion are necessary in the interests of public safety, and no person shall erect any such hoarding except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

2. If the Town Surveyor shall certify, in writing, that any hoarding is in such a state as to be dangerous to public safety, the owner of such hoarding, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove the said hoarding, shall pull down or remove such hoarding within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

3. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any hoarding, the Council may, immediately on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such hoarding, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such hoarding or materials, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

4. The following fees shall be payable by the owner of any property:—

On approval of plan and specification under clause 1 —£2 2s.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
