REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 30 of 1905, masters of vessels and others are informed that on and after the night of the 22nd March, 1911, an improved light will be exhibited from an open iron pile structure, painted white, instead of a wooden structure, as formerly. The characteristics of the light are the same as originally notified, viz.:—Situated on the eastern point of Cape Donnington; the focal plane of the light is 80 feet above sea level, and visible in clear weather over a radius of 14 miles.

Also that on and after the night of the 29th March, 1911, an unwatched bright light will be exhibited from an iron pile structure 20 feet high, surrounded by a close fence painted white on the south-eastern end of Wedge Island. The light will flash every three (3) seconds; its focal plane will be six hundred and eighty (680) feet above ordinary sea level, and it will be visible in clear weather for a distance of about 12 miles all round the horizon.

## THE NEW MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

## TRUSTEES:

The Corporations of The City of Melbourne,  
The City of Essendon,  
The City of Brunswick,  
The Borough of Coburg,  
The Shire of Broadmeadows.

## Regulations.

UNDER and by virtue of the *Northern Suburbs Cemetery Act 1904*, and the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne; the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon; the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick; the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Coburg; and the Corporation of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadmeadows, as the trustees appointed in accordance with the first-named Act for the management of the land acquired for the purpose of a Cemetery, and known as The New Melbourne General Cemetery, rescind Part I. of the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th November, 1906, page 4826, *et seq.*, and make the following regulations, that is to say:—

## PART I.

## General.

1. All fees and charges shall be paid to the managers when applications are made or orders given, but any person who so desires may, with the consent of the managers, lodge with the managers such a sum of money as may be estimated to be sufficient to cover the amount of fees and charges likely to be incurred by him during a period of one month, and to the extent of the sum so lodged an account for such fees and charges will be rendered to him monthly. In default of payment within three days after the rendering of the account such deposit shall be used by the managers to pay such fees and charges.

2. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, or monument, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the managers therefor. If approved, the managers, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.

3. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance shall be open daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on week days, and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sundays.

4. No vehicles, except hearses and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the cemetery. No vehicle shall be allowed on the avenues between the Sydney-road and the entrance gates except for the purpose of driving up to the entrance gates to set down or take up passengers, and immediately driving away again.

5. No photographs shall be taken in the cemetery without the authority of the managers being first obtained, and no photograph of any memorial work in the cemetery shall be permitted to be taken without the written authority of the owner being produced at the cemetery office.

6. No child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

7. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery.

8. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

9. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or climb over any fence, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, monument, tombstone, fence, or any other erection therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave, or burying place.

10. No person in the cemetery shall carry firearms or pea rifles, or go bird-nesting, or catch or trap birds, or destroy eggs or nests.

11. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards, or otherwise.

12. Any workman or other employé, whether employed by the managers or by any other person, shall at all times while in the cemetery, be subject to the supervision, directions, and control of the surveyor or other officer duly appointed by the managers, and shall obey all such directions, and may be removed from the cemetery upon any breach of the regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

13. The surveyor, or other officer duly appointed by the managers, as referred to in these rules, means the person for the time being employed by the managers as the surveyor or other officer in charge of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the managers, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these rules, and subject to the provisions of the

Cemeteries Acts the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the managers.

14. No person employed under the managers shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the managers, and any person employed under the managers accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

15. Any person committing any breach of any of these regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, may be thereupon forthwith removed from the cemetery by the managers or the surveyor, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

16. The managers shall have power to remove from any burial allotment any unsightly ornaments, such as glass bottles, jars, tins, decayed and broken wreaths, and dead flowers, and to prune, cut down, dig up and remove any shrubs, and plants planted on any burial allotment when such, in their opinion, shall have become unsightly or over-grown.

17. All rubbish is to be placed in the receptacles provided in the cemetery for that purpose.

18. No person, other than relatives or friends of the deceased, shall be allowed to dress or decorate graves unless he is the holder of a licence from the managers.

19. The managers may undertake the keeping of burial allotments in order, turfing, planting with flowers, re-lettering, &c., according to such fees and charges as shall be made by the managers from time to time.

#### *Memorial Work.*

Where used in these regulations the words "memorial work" shall mean any building, tomb, vault, tombstone, kerbing, memorial inscription, or other work erected or placed on any burial allotment.

20. The position of all memorial work shall be subject to the regulation of the managers for general effect and order having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the cemetery in an appropriate manner.

21. On burial allotments on which, having regard to the general appearance of the cemetery, it is, in the opinion of the managers, desirable that a certain class or style of monument shall be erected, the managers may sell the right of burial in such allotments with a condition that the purchaser must erect upon such allotment a monument of the description specified by the managers.

22. Any person desiring to construct, erect, add to, or alter any memorial work, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall, at least seven days before it is proposed to commence the erection thereof, apply in writing to the surveyor for permission to do so, and at the same time submit the certificate of right of burial for indorsement, and shall also submit, upon the form issued by the managers, a drawing of the proposed works, with full particulars, including the position and size of foundation piers, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

23. Every person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery shall submit a copy thereof to the surveyor, and shall obtain his written permission for the same.

24. When a kerbing or other permitted enclosure is placed upon an allotment, the whole of that allotment as shown upon the cemetery plan shall be enclosed with the kerbing or other enclosure; that is, for instance, an owner of a 6 feet by 6 feet allotment may not enclose half of it, but must enclose the whole.

25. A payment of £1 shall be made by all masons and others prior to the commencement of any work which they may be engaged to perform in the cemetery, which sum will be repaid to them upon their having complied with all the regulations of the cemetery, and upon their having cleared away all surplus soil, and removed out of the cemetery all refuse caused by the performance of such work, and made good to the satisfaction of the surveyor all damage caused by them, or, in their default, it shall be applied towards such purpose, as far as it will extend, they being liable for any deficiency.

26. All memorial work above the level of the ground is to be composed of stone or metal of such varieties as the managers may from time to time by resolution approve, but in such sections of the cemetery as may be specified by the managers from time to time, kerbing composed of concrete, and constructed by the managers, may be placed around allotments with or without a tablet or head-stone, such tablet or head-stone to be at least 1½ inches thick and not more than 2 ft. 6 in. high.

27. In estimating the value of memorial work, the total cost of the work is to be taken, including all foundations and work under and above the ground.

28. All materials required in the completion of any memorial work must be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and no vehicles conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

29. No memorial work shall be brought into the cemetery unless the number and the compartment letter of the allotment upon which such work is to be placed shall be cut thereon in 1-in. figures.

30. No stone or other material shall be rolled or levered along roads or pathways or over lawns, but must be moved upon a hand truck, and, where considered necessary by the surveyor, the hand truck must be drawn over planks.

31. If it is desired to drop stones from a vehicle on to a roadway, pads must be provided on to which the stone may fall.

32. No material for memorial work shall be brought into the cemetery on Saturday.

33. The designer's or mason's name, or both, may, with the owner's consent, be placed upon memorial work, in half-inch letters, provided that no address or other particulars be added.

34. Foundations shall be built to the depth below the surface of the ground directed by the surveyor, and the holes and trenches shall be submitted for the surveyor's inspection before any work is built therein.

35. All piers and foundations shall be of brickwork, except that in special cases other material may be allowed.

36. Where the weight upon any pier exceeds two tons, or where the weight upon any pier exceeds one ton per square foot the pier shall be carried down to the level of the bottom of the grave. Where any pier or foundation comes nearer than 6 inches, measured horizontally, from any grave, such pier or foundation shall be carried down to the bottom of the grave.

37. Where white pebbles, marble chippings, or similar material are used over a grave, they shall be laid on a cement, mortar, or concrete slab, of at least 1½ inches in thickness, with approved metal re-inforcement.

38. Stones used in kerbing shall not be less than 6 inches wide, and stones carrying head-stones shall not be less than 12 inches wide.

39. When kerbing consists of a single course of stone the stones shall not be less than 12 inches high, and where kerbing consists of more than one course the bottom course shall not be less than 12 inches high.

40. Where a kerbing consists of a single course only, and a ledger is not used, the stone shall be pitched, faced, or rubbed bluestone or granite.

41. Kerbing up to the length of 9 feet shall be one stone in length.

42. A continuous metal railing round an allotment shall have a continuous stone kerb under it.

43. Kerbing shall be fixed to a level given by the surveyor.

44. Masons will be held responsible that the outer face of all kerbing is accurately placed upon the proper boundary lines of the allotments, to the satisfaction of the surveyor, and if it is not so done it will have to be reset.

45. On narrow paths, and where required by the surveyor, a stone 6 inches high shall be placed along the length of the front under the kerbing.

46. No head-stone shall be less than 1½ inches thick, and no head-stone over 2 ft. 6 in. high shall be less than 2 inches thick, or over 4 ft. 6 in. high less than 3 inches thick.

47. No memorial work shall be allowed upon a common grave.

48. The erection of memorial work shall commence not later than on the next working day after any material therefor is delivered in the cemetery, and all memorial work when commenced shall be proceeded with from day to day until completion, save for delay caused by bad weather, or the permission given for the erection thereof shall be void.

49. All mortar shall be mixed on a proper mortar board.

50. Small wooden or tin or cast-iron labels may be temporarily used to mark graves by the owners thereof, subject to removal by the cemetery managers upon their becoming dilapidated or tarnished. Any such label shall conform to one of the standard patterns approved by the managers.

51. The managers may, upon due notice and payment of the costs and charges, undertake the removal and replacement of head-stones, kerbing, slabs, monuments, &c., when graves or vaults are required to be opened; but will not be responsible for any damage which may occur in the performance of such work.

#### *Interments.*

52. All applications for interment shall be made at the cemetery office, at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

53. The managers shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug.

54. All applications for interment shall be made upon the official form issued by the managers, and the name and age of deceased, the name and place of abode of the person to whom the exclusive right of burial will belong, and the other particulars mentioned on the form are to be furnished at the time of giving the order.

55. No interment shall be permitted in any private allotment without the production of the certificate of the right of burial, or other evidence to the satisfaction of the managers that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so; and in the case of an application for interment in any private allotment, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

56. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

57. The hours fixed for burials shall be—On week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.; on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, between such hours and under such conditions as may be fixed from time to time by resolution of the managers.

58. When a funeral comes to the cemetery by road, the time fixed for the burial shall be the time when the funeral is within the cemetery gates, and the same shall be punctually observed, or an extra charge of Two shillings and sixpence for each quarter of an hour, or portion thereof, after the time appointed may be charged by the managers. When a funeral comes by train the time for the burial shall be fixed by the officer in charge of the cemetery.

59. Corpses sent by train shall have attached to the coffin a card stating the name of deceased, the denomination, and whether a minister has been ordered to attend, and the coffin is to be furnished with a handle at one end, *i.e.*, the end which faces the railway platform when unloading at the cemetery.

60. Acceptance of delivery of any body at the mortuary railway station at the cemetery shall not be taken by the managers unless the official form mentioned in clause 54 of these regulations has been accurately and completely filled in and delivered at the cemetery office.

61. No corpse shall be received into the cemetery if carried upon a vehicle engaged in another funeral.

62. No person being the owner of an exclusive right of burial shall transfer such right without the consent of the managers, and no transfer shall be consented to by the managers except to a near relative of the owner. Upon the managers having consented, and the transferor having delivered up the existing certificate of right of burial, and paid the charge prescribed by the managers, a new certificate shall be issued.

63. Upon satisfactory evidence being produced to the managers that a certificate of right of burial has been lost or destroyed, and upon the charge prescribed by the managers being paid, a fresh certificate shall be issued by the managers.

the said cemetery may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said managers.

BOROUGH OF TALBOT.—TALBOT BOROUGH  
WATER SUPPLY RATING BY-LAW FOR THE  
YEAR 1911.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1911 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the Municipality of the Borough of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1911 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound.
3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.
4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
5. Government offices supplied with water by a special arrangement with the Trust, the following charges shall be made:—

Post office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 30,000 gallons per annum.

State school, Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half-acre, and 200,000 gallons per acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from the open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, cyanide works, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for, 120,000 gallons per week.

The above-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1911, and 1st day of July, 1911; and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Buildings covered with canvas, hessian, or other similar material will not be allowed, and no secondhand buildings will be permitted to be erected on the ground unless they have first been approved of by the officer in charge.

4. The site and all improvements thereon shall absolutely revert to the Crown at the expiry of the term of lease, or on any previous determination of the same, on account of breach of conditions, without any compensation therefor being paid by the Crown to the lessee, his assigns, or legal representatives.

5. The buildings when erected must be maintained throughout the whole term of the lease in good order and repair to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works.

6. The lessee shall be bound to keep all buildings insured to their full value, as fixed from time to time by the Surveyor-General for the time being, the insurance to be in the name of the Treasurer of the State of Victoria, and the policy in respect thereof to be deposited at the Treasury.

7. The lessee shall not assign or sub-lease the allotment, or any portion thereof, without the consent of the Governor in Council, but buildings may be let to tenants without such consent.

8. The lease will be voidable for non-payment of rent, for breach of any condition thereof, or if the lessee fail at any time to use the land *bona-fide* for the purpose for which it has been demised.

9. The site shall not be used, nor be allowed to be used, for the purpose of storing dynamite, gunpowder, kerosene, or other combustible or inflammable manufactured materials, excepting in accordance with the law relating to such storage on business premises.

10. The site shall not be used as a place in connexion with which the occupier or any other person carrying on business there, is or becomes registered or holds a licence limited to sell spirits, wine, or fermented liquor in quantities of two gallons or upwards, or upon which spirits, wine, or fermented liquor is limited to be sold in quantities of two gallons or upwards.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. Williamstown includes supplies for s.s. Lady Loch and Albert; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College, Wynna, the Irrigation Farm, and Wahgunyah the Vine Nursery. The lock-ups at City Watch-house, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy cases, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the

Tender Board, to such inlet, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Office the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, if or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, if or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at not less than the minimum wage fixed by the Factories and Shop Act and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

#### BY-LAW No. 37.

A By-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 37 for the regulation of bathing and preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things herein-after provided for, including By-law No. 24 of the said Shire, are hereby repealed except as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. No person shall bathe in the River Goulburn nor in any creek, lagoon, swamp, or waterhole at or from any place within the boundaries of the township of Shepparton except such place or places as is, or are or may be from time to time set apart for that purpose by the said corporation, and there only at the times and subject to the regulations hereinafter prescribed.

3. No person shall at any place within the said boundaries of the said township of Shepparton, in the vicinity of the banks of the said river or of any creek, lagoon, swamp, or waterhole, wholly or so far as to be indecent, divest himself or herself or be or remain divested of his or her clothing, whether for the purpose of bathing or otherwise, except at such place or places to be so set apart for bathing as aforesaid, and there only at the times to be so prescribed for bathing as aforesaid, and subject to the regulations hereinafter prescribed.

4. The pieces of land hereinafter described are hereby set apart for bathing purposes:—

1. Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River bearing about 27 chains 15 links from the north-west angle of allotment one of section L; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively east one chain 75 links, south 21 degrees east 5 chains, and west 2 chains 5 links to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River where the northern building line of High-street, Shepparton, intersects the top of said bank; thence by a line bearing south 9 degrees 23 minutes west a distance of two chains; thence by a line bearing north 80 degrees 37 minutes west a distance of seven chains and 60 links; thence along the top of the right bank of the said river to a point on such bank where the southern building line of Vaughan-street, Shepparton, intersects such bank; and thence by said river downwards to the point of commencement.
