TOWAGE OF BARGES.—LIGHTS.

RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING, ETC., IN CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT.

IT is hereby notified that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation dated the tenth day of June, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th June, 1908, page 3020, and the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd February, 1910, pages 1523 and 1524, *re* Restrictions on Netting, &c., in Corner Inlet and Port Albert, and in lieu thereof to impose and prescribe the following conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing in the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters within or inside a line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shallow Inlet:—

Q (1) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" with mesh measuring less than four and three-quarter inches. (The measurement of the mesh shall be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh, in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith, while the mesh remains extended. If the net to be measured is dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or saltwater for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured.)

(2) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" or lines of such nets exceeding six hundred fathoms in length for any boat with attendant boat or flatty. (The length of a net shall be ascertained by taking the measurement along the cork line on which such net is hung.)

(3) Prohibiting the leaving of mesh nets in the water for more than sixteen hours at a time after being set.

(4) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for thirty hours in each week, viz., from Noon on each Saturday until Six o'clock in the evening of each Sunday following throughout the year; and also prohibiting the removal of any boat having trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines or netting gear on board from any wharf or jetty or anchorage during such period unless it be proved that such removal was not for the purpose of engaging in fishing within the port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters above described.

COLAC WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW No. 1.
STANDING ORDERS.

For regulating and appointing the place and hour of meetings of the "Colac Waterworks Trust," and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat.

WHEREAS by the Water Acts power is given to any Authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) from time to time to make, amend, and repeal By-laws relating (*inter alia*) to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat: Be it therefore ordered and directed (subject as aforesaid) by the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, such Trust being an Authority under the said Acts as follows, viz.:—

1. In all cases not provided for by Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to Authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Place, hour, and adjournment of Meetings.*—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically at the offices of the Trust on the fourth Wednesday in the month, to date from 23rd November, 1910, at the hour of Eight o'clock p.m., and the Commissioners thereof may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

3. *Meetings, Special.*—A special meeting of the Commissioners may at any time be called by the Chairman or by the Minister, and shall be called by the Chairman if so requested in writing under the hands of any two Commissioners. No special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each Commissioner. Such notice shall be in writing, and shall specify the time of the meeting and the object thereof, and shall be delivered or sent through the post office or otherwise to the place of abode or the usual place of business (if any) within the Waterworks District of each Commissioner. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting except what is stated in the notice thereof.

4. *Powers vested in Commissioners.*—All powers vested in a Waterworks Trust may be exercised by the Waterworks Trust at any meeting held in pursuance of the Water Acts at which there is a quorum of the Commissioners present, but not otherwise.

5. *Quorum.*—A quorum of the Commissioners shall consist of one-half of the whole number of the Commissioners. If there is not a quorum of the Commissioners present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for any meeting, the Commissioners present, or the major part of them, or any one Commissioner, if there is only one present, may adjourn the meeting until another hour or another day; if no Commissioner is present the Secretary may so adjourn the meeting. Except where a meeting is adjourned to a subsequent hour of the same day the Secretary shall forthwith deliver or send through the post office to each Commissioner notice in writing of the time to which the meeting has been adjourned.

6. *Who is to preside at Meetings.*—At any meeting of the Commissioners the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and if the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding any meeting, the Commissioners present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

7. *Majority to decide.*—All questions at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

8. *Meetings, notice of.*—A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.

9. *Meetings, Resolutions at not to be Revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting: if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

10. *Business, &c., order of.*—*Minutes.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall

be the reading; and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman of such meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

11. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
- (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- (6) Payments.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
- (8) Other motions of which previous notice had been given.
- (9) Notices of motion, and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. *Titles, Official.*—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman, or Commissioner, as the case may require.

13. *Who to speak.*—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

14. *Chairman to rise while addressing Meeting.*—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

15. *Commissioners not to speak twice on same question.*—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

16. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

17. *Commissioners not to digress or impute improper motives.*—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly; and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

18. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

19. *Persons not Commissioners to leave when requested.*—No person not being a Commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman so to do.

20. *Call of the Commissioners.*—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

21. *Documents to be produced.*—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Commissioners applying to the question under discussion.

22. *Motions, amendments, and notice thereof.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of the meeting of Commissioners, or if not given at a meeting, then four clear days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Commissioners is to take place; and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

23. *No motion without notice.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

24. *Motions on petitions, &c.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.

25. *Motions to be moved in order.*—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

26. *Motions not to be proceeded with in absence of mover.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

27. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

28. *Mover of motion or amendment not to be interrupted.*—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

29. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

30. *Leave to be obtained before motion withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

31. *Motions to be seconded prior to discussion.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

32. *Mover and not the Seconded held to have spoken.*—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

33. *Motions to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

34. *Amendments re motion in writing.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. *Amendment to become the question.*—If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

36. *Second amendment may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatively, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

37. *Right of mover to reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

38. *Adjournment, motion for.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

39. *Protest, Commissioners may.*—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

40. *Legal Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

41. *Order of the day to be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be

restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Voting.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote and a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

43. *Questions to be put.*—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

44. *Contents of Petitions.*—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

45. *Name at beginning of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

46. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

47. *How signed.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

48. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

49. *Presentation of Petitions.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

50. *Deputations.*—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition or otherwise must send in an application in writing to the Trust Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

51. *Correspondence Committee.*—There shall be two permanent Committees of the Commissioners, one to be called the Works Committee, and the other the Finance and Correspondence Committee. Each Committee shall consist of four Commissioners, three to form a quorum. The Chairman shall be a member of all Committees.

52. *Minutes of Committee.*—Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the Committees' minute book, and, being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Commissioners; and the Trust Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the Committees.

53. *Committees to be convened.*—The Trust Secretary shall convene every Committee at any time by order of the Commissioners, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a Committee.

54. *Cheques to be signed.*—That all cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.

55. *Appointment to Permanent Office.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the town of Colac inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

56. *Salaries to be Fixed.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

57. *Commissioner, &c., not to be surety.*—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

58. *Contracts.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

59. *Plans, &c.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time except in cases of emergency.

60. *Secretary to expend moneys.*—It shall be lawful for the Trust Secretary and a member of the Finance Committee from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between

two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.

61. *Common Seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the Chairman shall keep the key and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman and one other member of the Commissioners, or, in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.

62. *Addresses to the Governor, &c.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

63. *Suspension of Regulations.*—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

64. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF EUROA AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others,

to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Euroa, with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said shire a certain area therein described, being part of the North Riding, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Shire of Shepparton as a separate Riding, to be called the Kialla Riding, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Euroa with its North Riding as reduced, and of the said Shire of Shepparton as enlarged with the Kialla Riding thereof as constituted, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

PART OF SHIRE OF EUROA SEVERED FROM THAT MUNICIPAL DISTRICT AND ANNEXED TO THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

Shepparton Shire (Enlarged).

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Congupna; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Katandra and Yabba Yabba to the western boundary of the tramway from Dookie to Katamatite; thence following said western boundary southerly through part of allotments 212A, 211, 208, 205, 204, and A1, parish of Dookie, to the commencing point of said tramway near the northern boundary of allotment 237, near the terminus of the Shepparton to Dookie railway; thence southerly by a line at right angles to the last line for a distance of one chain to the eastern boundary of said tramway; thence northerly by the said eastern boundary through the allotments before mentioned to its intersection with the south boundary of the parish of Yabba Yabba aforesaid; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Yabba Yabba and Waggarandall to the north-east angle of the parish of Dookie; thence south by the eastern boundary of the parishes of Dookie and Currawa to the Broken River; thence westerly by that river to the north-east boundary of the parish of Kialla; thence south by the east boundary of that parish and the parish of Karramomus to the north-east corner of allotment 35 of the parish last named; thence westerly by a road to the Goulburn River; thence northerly by that river to the southern side of the Benalla and Echuca road; thence westerly by the southern side of the said road twenty-eight chains nine links; thence north 23 deg. 32 min. east by a line six chains ninety links to the centre of the Goulburn River aforesaid; thence north-westerly by that river to the north boundary of the parish of Tallygaroopna; and thence east by that boundary and the north boundary of the parish of Congupna to the commencing point.

Kialla Riding (Constituted).

Commencing at a point on the Broken River at the north-east corner of the parish of Kialla; thence following the shire boundary southerly, westerly, and northerly to the Broken River; thence easterly by that river to the commencing point.

Shepparton Riding.

Commencing on the Goulburn River at a point nearest to the north-west corner of allotment 17, parish of Shepparton; thence in a direct line to the north-west corner of said allotment; thence easterly by a road along the northern boundary of that allotment and allotments 16 and 15 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence southerly by a road, being the eastern boundaries of allotments 15, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 40, 50, and 14 to the Broken River; thence north-westerly by that river to its intersection with the Goulburn River; thence northerly by the river last named to the commencing point.

South Riding.

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Pine Lodge; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the Broken River; thence westerly by that river to the south-east angle of allotment 14, parish of Shepparton; thence northerly by a road, being the eastern boundary of that allotment and allotments 50, 40, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, and 15 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence westerly by a road, being the northern boundaries of allotments 15, 16, and 17 to the

north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence by a direct line to the Goulburn River; thence northerly by that river to the intersection thereof by the northern boundary of the parish of Shepparton; and thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Shepparton and Pine Lodge to the commencing point.

Dookie Riding.

Commencing on the Broken River at the south-east angle of the parish of Pine Lodge; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the shire boundary; thence following the shire boundary easterly, southerly, easterly, northerly, easterly, southerly, and westerly to the point of commencement.

North Riding.

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Congupna; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle thereof; thence west by the south boundaries of the parishes of Congupna and Tallygaroopna to the Goulburn River; thence northerly by the Goulburn River to the intersection thereof by the northern boundary of the said parish of Tallygaroopna; and thence east by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Tallygaroopna and Congupna to the commencing point.

Shire of Euroa (Reduced).

No. 1893), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Act, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the rate-payers whose names appear on the municipal roll of the Shire of Braybrook has been presented to the Governor in Council, notice of which petition was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of April, 1911: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four ridings, to be called the Northern Riding, the Southern Riding, the Railway Riding, and the River Riding, the several boundaries of which are hereunder set forth and described, viz.:—

UNDER the provisions of section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* and of sections 30 and 30 of the *Education Act 1910* (1 Geo. V. No. 2301), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION NO. XXXIII.—EVENING CONTINUATION CLASSES.

1. In suitable centres, Evening Continuation Classes shall be established to provide for the further education of pupils who have completed the course of study in the Elementary School, have obtained a Merit Certificate, or approved equivalent, and who have not proceeded to a Higher Elementary School or a District High School. Any person who has not obtained a Merit Certificate or approved equivalent may be admitted to instruction in Evening Continuation Classes if in the opinion of the head teacher of such classes his attainments are such as to enable him to benefit by the instruction, but no child who is required by section 42 of the *Education Act 1910* to be in attendance at a day school shall be admitted to Evening Continuation Classes.

2. These classes will meet for two hours during each of three evenings of each week at such times as may be approved by the Director. Unless otherwise sanctioned by the Director, Evening Continuation Classes will begin not later than 7 p.m., and will end not later than 9 p.m.

3. A record of the attendance of pupils in Evening Continuation Classes must be kept by the head teacher of such class in accordance with instructions issued by the Director, and in estimating the average attendance only such pupils shall be reckoned as comply with the conditions of attendance so issued.

4. All pupils will be expected to be regular and punctual in attendance, and any pupil failing to attend regularly and punctually may be excluded from further attendance. Any pupil may be excluded from further attendance for laziness or misconduct.

5. The School Committee appointed for the school in which the Evening Continuation Classes are held shall perform so far as practicable the same duties in respect of the Evening Continuation Classes as are prescribed for the State school for which they have been appointed to be the School Committee.

6. Unless specially sanctioned by the Director, Evening Continuation Classes for the instruction of girls and boys together shall not be established. Evening Continuation Classes for girls shall not be held in any building at times when classes for boys are being held.

7. The course of study shall be as set out hereunder, and shall in each of the groups (a) (b) and (c) provide instruction for three years. The course of study may be added to or varied in such a manner as the Minister may from time to time determine.

(a) *Artisan Courses*—

1. English.
2. Practical Mathematics.
3. Drawing and Manual Work.
4. Elementary Science.
5. Civics.

(b) *Commercial Course*—

1. English.
2. Business Arithmetic.
3. Business Practice, including Correspondence.
4. Shorthand, Typewriting, Bookkeeping.
5. Civics.

(c) *Domestic Arts*—

1. English.
2. Cookery.
3. Personal and Domestic Hygiene.
4. Housewifery, including household accounts.
5. Needlework, including millinery and dress-making.

8. The subject of English will be compulsory in each course, and pupils will be required to take at least two other subjects of the course.

9. At the conclusion of the course an examination will be held, and a certificate of proficiency will be awarded to those pupils who pass a successful examination in at least three subjects, one of which must be English.

10. Preparatory classes may be formed for backward pupils who have reached the age of fourteen years. The course of study in such preparatory classes shall include further instruction in English, Arithmetic, Science, History, and Civics.

11. The details of the course of study for the various courses of the Evening Continuation Classes shall be as from time to time prescribed by the Director.

12. As a general rule, approval will not be given for the establishment of Evening Continuation Classes unless an assured attendance of at least thirty qualified pupils can be maintained.

13. In the formation of classes not more than thirty pupils may be enrolled in any class.

14. Payments will be made to teachers in accordance with the following scale:—

Head Teacher—Ten shillings for each meeting of Continuation Classes at which such teacher attended and taught for two hours.

For Assistant Teachers—Seven shillings and sixpence for each meeting at which such teacher attended and taught for two hours.

15. Payments will not be made in respect of any classes the establishment of which has not received the sanction of the Minister, and to any teachers who have not been formally appointed by him.

16. All appointments of teachers of Evening Continuation Classes shall be temporary, and shall be terminable at one month's notice. In making appointments of teachers of such classes the most highly-qualified applicants will be selected irrespective of other conditions, such as seniority in the teaching service or employment in the school in which the Evening Continuation Classes are held.

17. Where other qualified applicants are available a teacher will not, as a rule, be permitted to teach for more than two evenings per week in Evening Continuation Classes.

18. Where under the provisions of section 30 of the *Education Act 1910*, the Governor in Council has declared that boys under the age of seventeen years who are not otherwise receiving efficient and regular instruction shall be required to attend at Evening Continuation Classes, any boy may be exempted from such attendance provided that an inspector of schools certifies that such boy is otherwise receiving efficient and regular instruction.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNDER the provisions of section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* and of section 28 of the *Education Act 1910* (1 Geo. V. No. 2310), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION NO. XXXIV.—HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.

1. Any State school having an average attendance of not fewer than 100 pupils may be proclaimed a Higher Elementary School provided that not fewer than 25 pupils are qualified for admission to the higher course.

2. A Higher Elementary School may be established as an independent school restricted to the education of pupils qualified for admission to higher elementary courses, provided that no such school shall be established unless there be not fewer than 100 pupils qualified for admission.

3. The qualification for admission of pupils to the higher elementary courses shall be the Qualifying Certificate or approved equivalent.

4. The Qualifying Certificate shall be awarded to pupils of elementary schools who pass a satisfactory examination in the subjects of the course of study as set out for the sixth year of the elementary school course.

5. Instruction in Higher Elementary Schools shall be free, and shall cover a period of four years. The course of study is intended for pupils of from twelve to sixteen years of age. No pupil shall be enrolled after the expiration of the first quarter of the school year unless with the special sanction of the Director. Pupils may, however, be transferred from one higher elementary school to another or from a High School to a Higher Elementary School

under the same conditions as regards transfer notes, as are provided in the case of pupils attending elementary schools.

6. During the first and second years the course of study in Higher Elementary Schools shall be the same for all pupils, and shall include instruction in the subjects set out in Clause 9 below. During the third and fourth years of the Higher Elementary School course the course of study shall consist of special courses in the subjects set out in Clause 9 below, or in such other subjects as the Minister may from time to time determine.

7. Students who complete the course of study in the Higher Elementary School and pass a satisfactory examination in such subjects as the Director may from time to time prescribe shall be awarded the Intermediate Certificate. In determining whether a student shall be awarded the Intermediate Certificate the examiners shall take into account the marks obtained by such student at the terminal examinations held by the head master of the school which the pupil attended during the year immediately preceding the examination for the Intermediate Certificate and the report of the head teacher upon such student's capacity and attainments.

8. The details of subjects in the course of study for Higher Elementary Schools shall be as from time to time prescribed by the Director, and published in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

9. The following shall be the subjects of the course of study in Higher Elementary Schools:—

(A.)—First and Second Years.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) Mathematics—Practical Mathematics.
- (3) (Optional) A second language—(a) Latin; (b) French; or (c) German.
- (4) History and Civics.
- (5) Geography (including simple field work).
- (6) Elementary Physical Science.
- (7) Drawing.
- (8) Manual work. Approved courses, e.g., Wood work, Metal work, Practical Agriculture; or (for girls) Needlework, Cookery, and Laundry work.
- (9) Physical Training and Hygiene (including Elementary Physiology), Swimming (where practicable), organized games.
- (10) Class Singing.

(B.)—Third and Fourth Years.

At the beginning of the third year the course of study in the subjects for the first and second years as set out in (A) above shall be developed into special courses in—

- (a) Preparatory Professional Training, e.g., leading to the profession of teaching, or to University courses, or to the appointments in the Public Service.
- (b) Commercial Training.
- (c) Training in Domestic Arts.
- (d) Training for technical and trade pursuits.
- (e) Training in Agriculture.

(A.)—Preparatory Professional Training (Secondary Course).

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) A second language (French, German, or Latin).
- (3) Mathematics—(a) Arithmetic (3rd year only); (b) Algebra; (c) Geometry; (d) Trigonometry (4th year only).
- (4) Elementary Science—Two of the following subjects to be taken:—(a) Physics; (b) Chemistry; (c) Physiology; (d) Botany; (e) Geography (3rd year only), and Geology (4th year only).
- (5) History and Civics.
- (6) Drawing and Manual work.
- (7) Physical Training.

(B.)—Commercial Course.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) French or German.
- (3) Business Arithmetic and Bookkeeping.
- (4) History (with special reference to the development of industry and commerce).
- (5) Commercial Geography.
- (6) Commercial Correspondence; Business Practice; Trade and Commerce.
- (7) Shorthand and Typewriting.
- (8) Physical Training and Hygiene.

(C.)—Domestic Arts Course.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) History and Civics.
- (3) Household Management and Household Accounts.
- (4) Elementary Experimental Science applied to household work.
- (5) Physiology.
- (6) Sanitation and Domestic Hygiene (including First Aid and Ambulance Work).

(D.)—*Course of Training for Technical and Trade Pursuits.*

 (5) Mechanical, Freehand and Model Drawing.
 (6) Wood and Metal work.
 (7) History—Industry, Economics, Government Citizenship.
 (8) Physical Training.

(E.)—*Course of Training in Agriculture.*

- (1) English Language and Literature.
 (2) Practical Mathematics for Farm Students.
 (3) History and Civics.
 (4) Geography and Physiography.
 (5) Drawing.
 (6) Manual Work—(a) Farm Carpentry; (b) Forge work.
 (7) Agricultural Science, including a treatment of Elementary Physics, Elementary Chemistry, Nature-study (Plants and Animals), in their relation to Agricultural pursuits.
 (8) Agriculture—(a) Principles; (b) Practical work on the School Farm.

10. Teachers appointed to Higher Elementary Schools and actually engaged in teaching or directing the teaching of the subjects of the courses of study outlined in section 9 above shall, in addition to the salary provided for teachers of their classification in the Second Schedule of the *Teachers Act 1909* be paid a sum at the rate of 10 per centum per annum upon such salary, or in the case of teachers not fully employed in teaching such subjects such additional sum not exceeding 10 per centum per annum on their annual salary as the Director may determine with the approval of the Minister.

11. When appointments and transfers of teachers to positions in which they will be required to take part in teaching the subjects of Higher Elementary School courses are being made, preference will in all cases be given to teachers possessing special qualifications to teach such subjects.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1093), and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of August, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th September, 1905, page 3502, *re* "Netting in Gippsland Lakes," and do also by this Proclamation prohibit the use during the whole year of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters specified hereunder, that is to say:—

Reeves Lake.—Westward of an imaginary line running north-west and south-east through a point on the extreme south-west of Rotomah Island. (All bearings magnetic.)

McLennan's Strait and Adjacent Waters.—The whole of McLennan's Strait between an imaginary line at the Eastern Entrance to such Strait, running from the extreme outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme outward point where such Strait joins Lake Victoria, and an imaginary line running north-east from the northernmost point of the western bank at the Western Entrance of such Strait to another point on the opposite bank. (All bearings magnetic.)

Also the waters of Lake Victoria and Lake Wellington within a distance of a quarter of a mile from any portion or point of either of such imaginary lines. Also the lagoons and backwaters (including Victoria Lagoon) and straits connected with McLennan's Strait and Joe's or Jones' Bay.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown includes supplies for s.s.s. Lady Loch and Albert; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College, Wyuna, the Irrigation Farm, and Wahgunyah the Vine Nursery. The lock-ups at City, Watch House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the

Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulet as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at not less than the minimum wage fixed by the Factories and Shop Act and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

That a licence-fee of One pound per annum be charged for every hackney carriage, and that every licensed hackney carriage shall display its licensed number in figures one and a half inches high near the back step and near the driver's seat on the off side, and in a prominent position inside the carriage.
3. That the number of passengers for which any hackney carriage shall be licensed shall be at the rate of one passenger for every fourteen inches clear length of seat, the driver being counted a passenger for this purpose; and that the number of passengers for which the carriage is licensed shall be displayed with the licence number in every place where the licensed number is to be displayed.
4. That the scale of fares hereinafter prescribed shall be affixed in a prominent place inside the carriage, and well illuminated.

Permits for the temporary occupation of sites within the gardens, and for any other special privilege therein, shall, if issued, be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Council; and no person shall occupy any site or enjoy any special privilege therein without the consent of the Council.

8. No person shall enter the Gardens on any day set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, or the like purposes within the gardens, nor bring therein any carriage or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council duly authorizing the admission of such person, carriage, or vehicle, and the issue, collection, and price of such tickets shall be subject to such Regulations as the Council may from time to time frame.
