## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet; Governor of the State of Victoria  
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the thirtieth day of May,  
1911: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the fifth  
day of July, 1911, and I do hereby fix Wednesday, the fifth day of July, 1911, aforesaid, as the time for  
the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch  
of business, at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the State Parliament Houses, situate in the Carlton  
Gardens, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the  
Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place  
accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth  
day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in the second year  
of His Majesty's reign.
