The Constitution Act Amendment Acts.

APPOINTMENT BY THE MINISTER OF PLACES AT WHICH ELECTORAL LISTS FOR THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY SHALL BE REVISED FOR DIVISIONS IN WHICH THERE IS NO COURT OF PETTY SESSIONS OR IN WHICH THERE ARE TWO OR MORE OF SUCH COURTS.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Electoral Act 1910* (1 Geo. V. No. 238), it is amongst other things enacted that every general list for each division of an electoral district shall be revised at a revision court to be held for that purpose at some place appointed for the holding of courts of petty sessions and situate within the division, and that if there is no such place within the division, or if there are two or more such places appointed as aforesaid within any division, then the Minister may determine at which place the revision court for the division is to be held: Now therefore I, the Acting Chief Secretary for Victoria, being the Minister for the time being administering the said Act, hereby notify that I have determined that the places named in the third column of the schedule hereunder shall be the places at which the revision courts for the Divisions named in conjunction therewith in the second column of the said Schedule shall be held, that is to say:—

RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING, ETC., IN CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT.

It is hereby notified that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation dated the tenth day of June, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th June, 1908, page 3020, and the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd February, 1910, pages 1523 and 1524, *re* Restrictions on Netting, &c., in Corner Inlet and Port Albert, and in lieu thereof to impose and prescribe the following conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing in the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters within or inside a line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shallow Inlet:—

(1) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" with mesh measuring less than four and three-quarter inches. (The measurement of the mesh shall be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh, in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith, while the mesh remains extended. If the net to be measured is dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or saltwater for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured.)

(2) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" or lines of such nets exceeding six hundred fathoms in length for any boat with attendant boat or flatty. (The length of a net shall be ascertained by taking the measurement along the cork line on which such net is hung.)

(3) Prohibiting the leaving of mesh nets in the water for more than sixteen hours at a time after being set.

(4) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for thirty hours in each week, viz., from Noon on each Saturday until Six o'clock in the evening of each Sunday following throughout the year; and also prohibiting the removal of any boat having trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines or netting gear on board from any wharf or jetty or anchorage during such period unless it be proved that such removal was not for the purpose of engaging in fishing within the port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters above described.

That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such further rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Tin-smiths Board.
- (e) Provide all tools and materials necessary to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.
- (f) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.

(g) If at any time during the said term he shall through causes other than death cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of _____ miles from his present place of business he or his administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.

And that the said _____ apprentice and parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of _____ miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

- (a) well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid
- (b) willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business
- (c) not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer
- (d) not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours

It is hereby further agreed—

- (1) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all days named as Public Holidays in the Determination of the Tinsmiths Board and all working days the employer may close his factory or work-room or shop or place.
- (2) That the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default or neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence.
- (3) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of twelve months at the next preceding rate.
- (4) That in computing the period of twelve months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set off against any absence during the said period.
- (5) That should the business cease owing to the death of the said employer this indenture shall become void.
- (6) That in the event of the death of the employer the apprentice may if he so elect claim to be released from this agreement.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

REFORMATORY PRISON PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 14 (1) (a) of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907* (7 Edward VII. No. 2106) it is provided that the Governor in Council, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, may set apart any prison or other suitable place to be a reformatory prison under the said Act; and whereas by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the State of Victoria, made on the 25th day of September, 1909, certain buildings and premises within the Pentridge Penal Establishment were declared, proclaimed, and notified to be a Reformatory Prison within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907*:

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR
PUBLIC PARK AT HEPBURN, IN THE PARISH
OF WOMBAT, KNOWN AS "THE DAYLESFORD-
HEPBURN SPRING PARK."

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of section 200, *Land Act* 1901. And whereas Crown grants have issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Franklin, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford, in respect of the reserves for a Public Park at Hepburn, in the parish of Wombat, known as, and hereinafter designated "The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park." Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Franklin, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of "The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park" :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park (except the portion thereof demised to George Allan) shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park.

4. No person shall climb or jump over fences, or gates, or post bills thereon, or cut names, or in any way damage or deface any of the buildings, gates, bridges, seats, or fences, or trees, or rocks in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, or leave or deposit therein any glass, paper, or rubbish, except in receptacles provided for same, nor roll or throw stones in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, or light any fire therein.

5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

6. No person shall interfere with the spring taps within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or prevent the flow of mineral water, and any person procuring mineral water for sale or barter within a radius of 15 miles from such portion of the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park, as is not demised to George Allan, shall fill all cans or vessels before Ten o'clock in the forenoon and after Eleven o'clock in the evening, and while doing so shall use the small taps only; and no carrier shall be allowed to have more than two cans, either full or empty, on the floor of the spring, or within the pavilion, at one and the same time.

7. No person shall dance, or hold any form of concert or other entertainment within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park without the consent, in writing, of the trustees.

8. No person shall stand on the seats in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park or cause any interference with or annoyance to visitors by playing games or musical instruments therein, or by obstructing free entrance to and exit from the pavilion and spring, unless such obstruction be sanctioned by trustees.

9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall put or allow to wander into the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or poultry, and all goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinafter provided found trespassing within the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall bring into the Daylesford-Hepburn Spring Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees.

TOWN OF MALVERN.

A By-law of the Town of Malvern (hereinafter called the said Municipality), made under section 2 of the *Local Government Act 1910*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 52, for prohibiting quarrying and blasting operations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Municipality order as follows:—

- 1. No quarrying or blasting operations shall be carried on or conducted within the boundaries of the said Municipality, provided that this By-law shall not apply to any quarrying or blasting operations in connexion with works commenced before the fourth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, or with works carried on by any Government Department of the State of Victoria, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, or by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, or by the Malvern Town Council.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Five pounds, and a further penalty not exceeding One pound nor less than Ten shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

4. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903*.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and confirmed the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.

(d) The names of the roads or streets in or along which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down or erected are the whole of roads or streets within the borough of Ararat.

(e) The applicant at present contemplates the laying down or erecting of electric lines in the following streets or roads, viz. :—
