

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WOORARRA, AT BOOLARONG.

WE, Henry John York, Joseph Rumble, senior, Athol Herbert Buckley, Charles Albert Schmidt, and William August Schmidt, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 19th April, 1910, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Woorarra, at Boolarong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for entertainments, cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the consent of the Committee of Management.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.

(7) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

CONDITIONS, ETC.

Allotments in this Estate will be disposed of under Conditional Purchase Lease extending over a term of 31½ years. The amount to be paid for each allotment is shown in the schedule herewith.

Any person 18 years of age who is engaged in any form of manual, clerical, or other work for hire or reward, and is not possessed of real or personal property to a value exceeding £350, or whose salary does not exceed £220 per annum, may apply for one or more allotments, but no one can be granted more than one allotment.

No conditional purchase lease of an allotment can be granted to any person who is directly or indirectly the owner of any other land in the State, which, if Town or Suburban land, exceeds ½ of an acre, or if Rural land, exceeds 50 acres in area.

Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment when receipts, showing the due delivery of the goods, have been received from the teacher, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim. Receipt and invoice forms may be obtained free of charge from the Education Department, and must be forwarded to the officer authorized to take delivery when the goods are supplied.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any school he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 15 of these conditions.

12. An invoice of each parcel shall be, by the contractor, forwarded by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, together with a form of receipt for him to sign and return. The production of the receipt given by the teacher shall be considered sufficient proof of the delivery of the goods, but should the teacher fail to return the receipt within a reasonable time the payment to the contractor shall not be delayed on that account, provided he can produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Education Department for the time being of the delivery of such parcel.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expenses deducted as in Condition 7.

14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

17. Should an increase or reduction take place in the prices at present charged for books and school requisites contained in the said schedule hereto by the publishers or manufacturers, a corresponding increase or reduction shall be made to or by the contractors in the prices of the articles supplied by them. In case of any disagreement as to the amount of increase or reduction the same shall be decided and settled by the Secretary of the Education Department.

18. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving six full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

19. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Hawthorn.

SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

By-law Number 21, for the Regulation and Government of the Mornington Municipal Market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The municipal market at Mornington (hereinafter called the said market) shall be open for the receipt or sale of the marketable commodities set forth in the order of the Council fixing the tolls and dues to be levied in the said market made or from time to time to be made on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day, as the Council may from time to time determine, from sunrise to sunset, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, and Good Friday, on which last-mentioned days no business shall be transacted therein.

2. That the said market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on the first Monday in each month until further order, and on special sale days duly advertised from Eight o'clock in the forenoon to Seven o'clock of the same day.

3. All live stock yarded in the said market yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into the following classes, that is to say:—

- (1) Sheep.
- (2) Fat neat cattle.
- (3) Dairy cattle, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, springers, and calves.
- (4) Store or other neat cattle.
- (5) Pigs.
- (6) Horses.
- (7) Other commodities not above specified.

4. That all cattle and other commodities shall be sold in the classes above mentioned, and in the order above enumerated.

5. That all live stock shall be sold in the pens or selling yard at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

6. That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class in the presence of the Market Inspector or some other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle or other commodities in the market yard.

8. That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this By-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

9. There shall be appointed by the Council, if the Council shall think fit, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- 1st. To see that the Market Regulations are duly observed.
- 2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.
- 3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

Until an Inspector shall be appointed as aforesaid, the Secretary of the said Council shall be Acting Inspector for the said market, and shall have all the powers of an Inspector under this By-law.

10. All such tolls and dues as may be chargeable under any order of the Council in that behalf shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their being sold and leaving the market, in the discretion of the said Inspector.

11. Any person who shall place anything or any matter so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the said Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart or carriage or wheelbarrow in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

12. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or peg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall without the consent of the said Council in writing.

13. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

14. No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle, &c., before the hour of opening and after the hours of closing the said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the market will be open without the sanction of the Council in writing.

15. All live stock must be removed out of the market before Eight o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.

16. Any person who shall wilfully offend against or commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence or breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

SHIRE OF MILDURA.

BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the Shire of Mildura, made under sections 196 and 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Twenty, for extending certain provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1895* to certain parts of the said Shire, and for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

- (I.) Throwing any glass, thorns, filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any road, footway, or public place.
- (II.) Riding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath.
- (III.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage-road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
- (IV.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage-road, or open or public place.
- (V.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority.
- (VI.) Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage-road to the injury of such footway or carriage-road.

- (vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter in that part of the Town Riding known as Block D and Williamstown without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority.
- (viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (ix.) Allowing any drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (x.) Placing any placard or other document on, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp post, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (xi.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage-road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
- (xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
- (xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, kicking a football, or playing any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage-road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage-road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (xiv.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
- (xv.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (xvi.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.
- (xvii.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public street.
- (xviii.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show, hire, or sale.
- (xix.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority.
- (xx.) Sweeping or otherwise removing or causing to be swept or removed from any shop, house, or vehicle over or into any street in that part of the Town Riding known as Block D and Williamstown any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or throwing down or leaving or causing to be thrown down or left in any such street any dead animal, offal, skins, fish, fruit, vegetable matter, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

2. If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if any article so exposed be not removed within six hours after notice, any local authority or any officer of police or any constable, without warrant, may seize any such article, and every such article shall be forfeited and sold, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions mentioned in the *Police Offences Act 1890* respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

3. By-law No. 3, being a By-law for the preservation of good order in the Shire, is hereby repealed.

4. Sub-sections 1, 3, 6, 8, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, and 19 of section 1 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District save as aforesaid, this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the Municipal District only, that is to say, that part of the Shire known as Block D and Williamstown.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. It shall not be lawful to keep any swine within that portion of the Shire known as Block D or Williamstown without written permission of the Shire Council.

2. No person shall keep pigs or any other animals or fowls or birds of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. No person shall keep any animal or fowls or birds of any kind in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or using milk or other produce of such dairy.

4. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, fowl-house, or other place for the keeping of animals or fowls or birds of any kind, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every fourth day, and in case of the default of such occupier the Shire Council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier, provided always that nothing contained in this clause shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, used, or kept as to contravene any By-law of the Shire Council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, soil, offal, or other offensive matters and all waste products of such trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture from which offensive effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom, and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the Shire Council at the expense of such occupier or person.

6. Any person committing any wilful breach of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. By-law No. 4, relating to keeping of places and animals, is hereby repealed.

8. Section 1 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district, that is to say, that portion of the Shire known as Block D and Williamstown, save as aforesaid this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

1. It shall not be lawful to take or drive any traction engine over any of the roads of this Shire without the owner first entering into an undertaking with the Council to repair at his own expense all damage that may be done

or caused by such engine to roads, culverts, and bridges within the said Shire, or any of them, and to be responsible for any accidents arising through such damage.

2. Any person who shall commit any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. By-law No. 11, for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over streets and roads within the Shire, is hereby repealed.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Provided always that this By-law shall not apply to any vehicle which is by any statutory enactment or by any rule, regulation, or order made under any statutory enactment and for the time being in force required to carry a lamp or lamps in any other manner.

2. By-law No. 8, for lights on vehicles at night, is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride, drive, or propel a bicycle or tricycle on any aligned footpath within the following boundaries of the Shire of Mildura, namely:—Eleventh-street on the south-west, Walnut-avenue on the north-west, Seventh-street on the north-east, and San Mateo-avenue on the south-east, nor shall any person ride, drive, or propel any bicycle or tricycle on any street within the said boundaries at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles per hour; and any person offending against any of these provisions shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

2. Any person who shall other than during the four nights immediately preceding the night of full moon, the night of full moon, and two nights immediately following the night of full moon, in any manner ride, drive, or propel any bicycle or tricycle in the Shire of Mildura

during the period between sunset and sunrise, without having a lighted lamp attached to the front thereof showing a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

3. Any person who shall at any time ride any bicycle or tricycle on any road or street of the Shire of Mildura without carrying a bell or alarm attached to the said bicycle or tricycle, or without sounding a bell or alarm whilst approaching any pedestrian, equestrian, or vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

4. Any person riding, driving, or propelling any bicycle or tricycle, causing or being concerned in any injury or accident to or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle who shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injuries caused, and giving his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. By-law No. 9, for regulating bicycle and tricycle traffic, is hereby repealed.

6. Section 1 of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts therein referred to of the Municipal District, save as aforesaid this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

The fees to be paid to the Inspector of Weights and Measures for the Shire of Mildura, under the provisions of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1890, shall be as follows:—For examining and comparing weights, including stamping, when necessary—For each half cwt., if in brass, 6d.; if in iron, 6d.; for each quarter cwt., if in brass, 6d.; if in iron, 4d.; for each stone, if in brass, 4d.; if in iron, 3d.; each weight under one stone, if in brass, 2d.; if in iron, 1d.

Monday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m., and 4 to 8 p.m.
Tuesday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m., and 4 to 7 p.m.; females, 7 to 9 p.m.

Wednesday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m., and 4 to 7 p.m.

Thursday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m.; females, 3 to 7 p.m.; Swimming Club, 7 to 9 p.m.

Friday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m., and 7 to 9 p.m.; females, 4 to 7 p.m.

Saturday.—Males, 6 to 8 a.m., and 4 to 7 p.m.; boys under 16 free from 9 to 11 a.m.; girls under 16 free from 11 a.m. to 12 noon.

2. No person in an uncleanly condition shall use the swimming bath, nor while suffering from any skin, infectious or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the baths immediately on being requested so to do by the caretaker or other person in charge.

3. All persons using the swimming bath must wear proper bathing trunks or drawers or bathing gowns.

4. No person shall smoke while in any part of the baths.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the baths except upon payment of the prescribed charge and within the hours hereinbefore prescribed in the preceding clause 1 hereof.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

7. No person shall at any time, whilst being in the swimming bath, use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of bathers.

8. No person shall wilfully or improperly commit any nuisance, or foul or pollute the water in the swimming bath, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing dress, or any bath room, closet, box, or compartment, or any furniture or article therein.

9. No person shall spit in the swimming bath or on the floor or walls of any portion of the building.

10. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the walls of any portion of the baths.

11. All towels, bathing trunks, or drawers, or bathing gowns supplied to persons using the baths shall be returned by such person before leaving the building.

12. No person shall by forcible or improper means seek admission to any bath room or compartment which shall be occupied by any other person.

13. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, bathing gown, or other article supplied for use in the baths.

14. No person shall at any time while being upon the premises, use any indecent or improper language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

15. No bath attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths, other than a duly authorized money-taker, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the caretaker of the baths, and then only for and on behalf of the Council.

16. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than two hours.

17. No person using the baths, nor any officer or servant, or other person employed thereat, shall at any time introduce into the building any spirituous or intoxicating liquors.

18. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in any bath, bath room, dressing room, closet, box, or compartment, or in any passage leading to or from any bath or bath-room.

19. Any person finding anything which may have been left in the bath-room or dressing-room, or in any other part of the establishment shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the caretaker, or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of the same, and all particulars relating thereto, in a book kept for that purpose, and any person losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the caretaker (or other person authorized to receive such article) upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

20. The charges for admission to and for the use of the baths shall be as follows:—

Adults: Single admission, 3d.; towel, 1d.; costume, 3d.

Adults: Single admission without towel and swimming drawers, 3d.

Juniors (under 16 years), 3d.

Juniors (under 16 years), additional charge for towel, 1d.; swimming drawers, 3d.

Ladies: The baths will be reserved for use by ladies at the above rates on Tuesdays, from 7 till 9 p.m.; Thursdays, from 3 till 7 p.m.; Fridays, from 4 till 7 p.m., or such other times as the Council shall from time to time decide.

Junior members of swimming clubs, half-price on Thursdays, from 7 till 9 p.m.

Free admission for juniors (under 16 years):—Boys—
Saturdays, from 9 till 11 o'clock a.m. Girls—
Saturdays, from 11 a.m. till 12 noon.
Season tickets: Men, 20s.; ladies, 10s.
Monthly tickets: Men, 5s.; ladies, 2s. 6d.
Weekly tickets, 1s. 6d.

When the swimming baths are in use for galas or other entertainments the above charges will be suspended.

21. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any clause of this By-law shall, upon conviction thereof for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the Shire of Mildura in the vicinity of the said Swimming Baths, and to all buildings used in connexion therewith situate, at Mildura aforesaid.
