In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, doubte columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the G-mmonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rules charged are considered

Security will be required either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of the tender.

(1) Sheep.

(3) Dairy cattle, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, springers, and calves.
(4) Store or other neat cattle.

(5) Pigs. (6) Horses.

(7) Other commodities not above specified.

a. That all cattle and other commodities shall be sold in the classes above mentioned, and in the order above enumerated.

5. That all live stock shall be sold in the pens or selling yard at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

6. That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class in the presence of the Market Inspector or some other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle or other commodities in the market yard.

8. That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this By-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

9. There shall be appointed by the Council, if the Council shall think fit, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

.1st. To see that the Market Regulations are duly ob-

1st. Jo see that the Market Regulations are duly observed.

2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.

3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

Until an Inspector shall be appointed as aforesaid, the Secretary of the said Council shall be Acting Inspector for the said market, and shall have all the powers of an Inspector under this By-law.

10. All such tolks and dues as may be chargeable under any order of the Council in that behalf shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their being sold and teaving the market, in the discretion of the said Inspector.

12. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or pieg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall without the consent of the said Council in writing.

13. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have sommitted a breach of this By-law.

(vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter in that part of the Town Riding known as Block D and Williamstown without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority.

(viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.

(ix.) Allowing any drippings of the caves of any house to fall upon any public footway.

(x.) Placing any placard or other document on, writing,

- painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp post, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner
- (XI.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage-road without the permission of the local authority having been first

  (XV.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.

  (XVI.) B'asting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard

(XVII.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public street.

Provided always that this By-law shall not apply to any vehicle which is by any statutory enactment or by any rule, regulation, or order made under any statutory enactment and for the time being in force required to carry a lamp or lamps in any other manner.

2. Any person who shall other than during the four nights immediately preceding the night of full moon, the night of full moon, in any manner ride, drive, or propel any bicycle or tricycle in the Shire of Mildura

during the period between sunset and sunrise, without having a lighted lamp attached to the front thereof showing a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sun not exceeding Two pounds.

3. Any person who shall at any time ride any bicycle or tricycle on any road or street of the Shire of Mildura without carrying a bell or alarm attached to the said bicycle or tricycle, or without sounding a bell or alarm whilst approaching any pedestrian, equestrian, or vehicle, shall forfeit and pay on conviction, a sum not exceeding shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

Any person riding, driving, or propelling any bicycle or tricycle, causing or being concerned in any injury or accident to or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle who shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injuries caused, and giving his or her name and address to the person injuried or to some one on his or her behalf

any injuries caused, and giving his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

  14. No person shall at any time while being upon the premises, use any indecent or improper language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

No bath attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths, other than a duly authorized money-taker, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the carctaker of the baths, and then only for and on behalf of the Council.

  16. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than two hours.
- 17. No person using the baths, nor any officer or servant, or other person employed thereat, shall at any time introduce into the building any spirituous or intoxicating

18. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in any bath, bath room, dressing room, closet, box, or compartment, or in any passage leading to or from any bath or bath-room.

Any person finding anything which may have been left in the bath-room or dressing-room, or in any other part of the establishment shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the caretaker, or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of the same, and all particulars relating thereto, in a book kept for that purpose, and any person losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the caretaker (or other person authorized to receive such article) upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.
