Factories and Shops Acts.

REGULATION OF CHEMISTS' SHOPS IN THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of June, 1911.*

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlers) of the particular class or kind to be affected, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say :—

- (1) All regulations heretofore made relating to the hours of closing of Chemists' Shops within any municipal district or group of municipal districts in the Metropolitan District shall from and after the date hereof be and the same are hereby revoked.
- (2) All Chemists' Shops (being shops of a class or kind mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, No. 1975) within the Metropolitan District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Acts* shall be closed during the whole of each year on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday from the hour of Eight o'clock, and on the evening of Friday from the hour of Ten o'clock in each and every week.

And the Honorable William Alexander Watt, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
