PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

I SIR JOHN MADDEN, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, do hereby proclaim that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by an Instrument under his Hand and the Seal of the said State, dated the 11th July, 1912, has appointed me to be, during his temporary absence from the said State, his Deputy for the purposes herein specified, that is to say, for him and on his behalf to exercise the powers now vested in him as Governor of the State of Victoria, of signing warrants authorizing the issue from the Trensury of the State of sums of money, of signing Messages to either House of Parliament, of signing Crown Grants, Leases, and Licences under the provisions of the Land Acts, of giving assent to Bills passed by Parliament, and of presiding at such meetings of the Executive Council as it may be necessary to summon during his absence.

Given under my Hand and the Scal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in the third year of His Majesty's reign.
