Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 31st day of August, 1912. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be-

Bamboo or wicker workers ... 57s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Persons employed on basket work not mentioned in piece-work schedules or on repair work
