THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD
OF WORKS.

BY-LAW NO. 12.

By-law relating to the Levels, Dimensions, Construction, Maintenance, Ventilation, and Cleansing of Sewers.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board) in order to secure the efficient maintenance of the main and general sewerage of the metropolis, and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon or vested in such Board, by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, or by any other Acts incorporated therewith and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Board in that behalf doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. By-law No. 9 is hereby revoked and repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, provided however that such repeal shall not affect any licence issued, or act or thing authorized and commenced to be done under the provisions of the said By-law No. 9.

2. No person shall interfere with, break up, remove, or build over with any fence or other structure any sewer or trap, ventilating shaft, manhole, lamp-hole, flush-tank, catch-basin, or any part of the Board's sewerage system, except by the special permission in writing of the Board.

(a) No person shall throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, in any drain or sewer, or opening or receptacle connected with the sewerage system, any garbage, offal, dead animals, vegetable parings, ashes, cinders, rags, refuse from manufactories, trade wastes, or any

- other matter or thing which, in the opinion of the Board, may cause a stoppage in or injuriously affect the sewers or sewerage machinery.
- (b) No person shall cause or permit any waste water or fluid or other trade wastes containing any substance or matter of a solid nature to flow or pass or to be carried from any manufactory or business or other premises of such person into any sewer of the Board or any drain or pipe communicating therewith, without first discharging into a pit so constructed as to intercept all such substance or matter of a solid nature and prevent the same from passing into any such sewer of the Board or drain or pipe communicating therewith.
 - (c) No person shall cause or permit to be discharged into any drain or sewer of the Board any solid or liquid likely to cause the generation of gases injurious to the Board's sewers or sewerage machinery.
 - (d) No person shall cause or permit any waste water or fluid or other trade wastes to flow or pass or be carried from any manufactory or business or other premises of any such person into any sewer of the Board, or any drain or pipe communicating therewith unless and until the temperature of such waste water or fluid or trade wastes shall have been first reduced to or below one hundred and ten degrees Fahrenheit, and unless and until such waste water or fluid or trade wastes shall have been completely neutralized as to acidity, and unless and until such person shall have first made and provided suitable apparatus, means, or appliances for properly sedimenting and filtering such waste water or fluid or trade wastes before the same shall flow or pass or be carried into such sewer or drain as aforesaid.
 - (e) No person shall cause or permit to flow or pass or be carried from any manufactory or business or other premises of any such person into any sewer of the Board or any drain or pipe communicating therewith any benzene, naphtha, ether, carbon di-sulphide, or other inflammable materials which will not readily mix with water.

3. Any contravention of this By-law whether by act, default, or omission, shall be an offence against the same, and every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

- (e) Provide all materials necessary to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.
- (f) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.

And that the said _____ apprentice and _____ parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of _____ miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius, if any there be, or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business
- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer

3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

CITY OF BENDIGO.—REGULATION No. 1.

REGULATION of the City of Bendigo, made under section forty-four (44) of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for—

(a) Prescribing the conditions on which any animals may be received into or supplied from any abattoirs.

(b) Prescribing the duties of Meat Inspectors.

(c) Fixing the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the abattoirs of which it is the owner.

(d) The feeding, watering, and tending, and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and for the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs.

(e) Examining animals by Meat Inspectors before slaughter, and prescribing the mode of dealing with animals at abattoirs when suspected of being affected with communicable disease.

(f) Prescribing the mode of slaughtering animals or flaying, and of dressing carcasses, and for preserving the cleanliness of appliances used therefor.

(g) Examining by Meat Inspectors the different parts of a carcass after slaughter at abattoirs, and for preventing the parts of one carcass being mixed with those of another prior to examination.

(h) Fixing the fees for examination of animals and for examining and branding of carcasses.

(i) Prescribing the mode of removing condemned carcasses or meat and of rendering the same unusable for human consumption, and of disposing of or destroying the same, and prescribing the mode of removing and destroying of blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure from abattoirs.

(j) Prescribing the nature of the particulars to be entered in the register as to animals examined or slaughtered at or supplied or removed from any abattoir and as to carcasses of meat dealt with thereat.

(k) And generally for carrying into effect the objects of the Meat Supervision Acts and for imposing penalties for non-compliance with the regulations made in accordance therewith.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo make the following Regulations, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Bendigo:—

A.—RECEPTION OR REMOVAL OF ANIMALS.

1. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the public abattoirs on any day from the hour of Five o'clock a.m. to the hour of Six o'clock p.m. from the first day of October to the thirtieth day of April, and between the hours of Six o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m. from the first day of May until the thirtieth day of September in each year, provided always that animals shall not be received into the public abattoirs on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

2. All animals received or placed into the public abattoirs if not slaughtered or otherwise dealt with as by law provided must be removed from the public abattoirs by the owner or the person in charge thereof within a period of not more than 66 hours in all from the time such animals were first received into the public abattoirs, otherwise the said animals shall be removed by order of the Inspector, at the expense and risk of the owner thereof.

B.—DUTIES OF CHIEF MEAT INSPECTOR.

3. The following shall be included in the duties of the Chief Meat Inspector:—

To direct the care and management of animals during the time they are at the public abattoirs pending slaughter or removal.

To direct the removal of all animals that have been longer than 66 hours in the public abattoirs.

To keep register of and to visit and inspect all private abattoirs, butchers' shops, small goods factories, meat markets, and such other places as the Council may direct, and to examine all carcasses, meat, offal, small goods, fittings, implements, and appliances at these places, and to take such action in regard to these as the Council may direct or as may be authorized by this or other Regulations or by the provisions of the Act.

To superintend and direct the carrying out of all cleansing methods and sanitary measures and requirements in and about the abattoirs.

To keep a register of all butchers, salesmen, slaughtermen, and others engaged in doing business at the public abattoirs, and to control and direct the operations and enforce propriety of conduct of all such persons.

To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts, and all By-laws and Regulations relating to public abattoirs, and generally to carry out the duties of Meat Inspector in accordance with the provisions of the Meat Supervision Acts.

C.—DUTIES OF MEAT INSPECTORS.

4. The following shall be included in the duties of Meat Inspectors:—

To keep a register of all animals received into or placed in or slaughtered or condemned in or removed from the public abattoirs, and to keep such books, accounts, registers, and records, and furnish such reports as the Council may from time to time direct or require.

To inspect all animals received or placed into the public abattoirs before the same are slaughtered.

To examine all carcasses, organs, viscera, and offal, and other parts of animals immediately upon being slaughtered, and to brand or cause to be branded under his direction, in accordance with the Meat Supervision Acts and Regulations made by the Board of Public Health and the Council under the Meat Supervision Acts, all such carcasses, organs, viscera, offal, and parts that are intended to be exposed for sale for human consumption.

To demand and receive the fees hereinafter appointed to be paid in respect to such examination and branding; also to collect the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoirs, or for the slaughtering of animals.

To prevent summarily any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering or cruelty to any animals in the public abattoirs, and to report to the Council the names of every person guilty of such cruelty.

To compel observance of the Meat Supervision Acts and all By-laws and Regulations relating to public abattoirs, and generally to act under instructions received from the Chief Meat Inspector.

D.—SLAUGHTERING FEES.

5. The sums stated hereunder shall be the rates of slaughtering fees or dues payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoirs, viz.:—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 1s. 6d.

For every sheep, or lamb, or goat, 1½d.

For every head of swine, 1s.

For every calf under 300 lbs., 9d.

And such sums shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the public abattoirs, whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

E.—FEEDING, WATERING, ETC. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, ETC.

6. Every person who shall bring animals to the public abattoirs shall cause them to be provided with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and if the same remain in the public abattoirs for a longer period than twenty-four hours shall also provide such animals with sufficient food, provided always that no animals shall be allowed to remain in the public abattoirs after three hours' notice shall have been given by the Chief Meat Inspector to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove same, and such owner or person in charge shall remove same accordingly.

7. Animals shall be placed in such numbers only as the Chief Meat Inspector may direct in any of the pens, stalls, yards, or standings in the public abattoirs, and every person failing to observe the directions of the Chief Meat Inspector in this respect shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

8. Every person who shall cause any unnecessary suffering in slaughtering any animal, or be guilty of any cruelty to any animal in the public abattoirs, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations. All milch animals in the public abattoirs shall be milked by the owner or person in charge thereof at such time and place as the Chief Meat Inspector may direct, either verbally or in writing.

F.—EXAMINATION, ETC., OF ANIMALS BEFORE SLAUGHTERING, AND COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.

9. Every animal received into or placed in the public abattoirs shall be examined by the Inspector before any such animal shall be slaughtered, and every owner or person in charge of any animal who shall permit the same to be slaughtered before being so examined shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

10. No animal shall be removed from the public abattoirs if affected with or if, in the opinion of the Inspector, there are reasonable grounds for believing it to be affected with any of the following diseases, viz.:—Tuberculosis, anthrax, quarterill, pleuro-pneumonia, swine-fever (hog cholera), swine erysipelas, lymphatic abscess, actinomycosis (lumpy jaw), or any communicable, contagious, or infectious disease, and no animal so affected shall be received into the public abattoirs except by the direct permission of the Chief Meat Inspector, and when so ordered by the said Inspector, either verbally or in writing, the owner or person in charge of any diseased animal shall forthwith destroy such animal in the manner directed by the said Inspector, whereupon the carcass of such animal shall be forthwith dealt with by the said Inspector so as to render it unfit for human consumption, and the carcass shall be disposed of (at the expense and risk of the owner thereof) in such manner as the Inspector may direct.

G.—MODE OF SLAUGHTERING, ETC. CLEANLINESS OF APPLIANCES.

11. The owner or person in charge of any animal brought into the public abattoirs may slaughter such animal and flay and dress the carcass thereof in such manner, at such time, and in such place or portion of the public abattoirs as the Inspector may direct.

12. Every person, engaged in slaughtering, dressing, or tending or caring for any animal or carcass in the public abattoirs shall take all means and precautions so as to secure perfect cleanliness of his person, dress, and of all appliances of every kind used or to be used by him in the public abattoirs, and the Chief Meat Inspector shall decide whether all such means and precautions have been taken; and the Chief Meat Inspector shall have the authority to forthwith order, either verbally or in writing, any person to at once leave the public abattoirs, who shall not have so complied in regard to the cleanliness of his

person or the appliances used or to be used by him, and every person who has not so complied shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

H.—EXAMINATION OF CARCASS AFTER SLAUGHTER, ETC.

13. The carcass, organs, viscera, and offal of any animal shall, immediately upon being slaughtered in the public abattoirs, be examined by the Meat Inspector, and no person shall cut away or remove from any portion of the carcass or the organs, viscera, or offal thereof, except in such manner as the Meat Inspector may direct.

I.—FEES FOR EXAMINING AND BRANDING CARCASSES.

14. The fees hereunder mentioned shall be paid to the Inspector for examining and branding of carcasses of meat slaughtered at the public abattoirs, viz. :—

- For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 3d.
- For every calf, sheep, lamb, or goat, 1d.
- For every head of swine, 1d.

J.—Fee for examining and branding any carcass of meat of animals fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, the said premises being without the Meat Area, and brought to a place appointed as provided by section 27 of the Meat Supervision Act :—

- For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, 2s.
- For every calf under 300 lbs., 6d.
- For every sheep, lamb, or goat, 3d.
- For every head of swine, 1s.

K.—REMOVAL OF CONDEMNED CARCASSES, OFFAL, ETC.

16. Upon the carcass of any animal being condemned by the Meat Inspector as unfit for human consumption, it shall be destroyed or dealt with as the Inspector may direct, provided always that such carcass shall not be removed or retained by the owner thereof, or by any person acting for such owner; but the proceeds of any portion thereof of the disposal of the carcass may, if the Inspector so determines, be given to the owner of such carcass, and the expenses of removing and disposing of such carcass, if any, shall be paid by the owner of such carcass.

17. Upon any animal being slaughtered in the public abattoirs the owner of such animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith cleanse thoroughly of all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure as the Inspector shall direct the stall or place in which such animal was slaughtered.

18. Immediately after the cleansing of any stall or place as set forth in the last preceding clause, the owner of any animal, or the person acting for him, shall forthwith remove from the public abattoirs in such a manner as shall be approved by the Meat Inspector all offal, blood, garbage, refuse matters, or manure that may have arisen from such slaughtering of any animal, and shall dispose of the same at such place and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council and the Inspector.

L.—REGISTER, ETC., OF ANIMALS.

19. The Meat Inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoirs a description of all animals brought into the public abattoirs, including the particulars of the class of each animal, the colours, brands, and sex of every head of the same. The date on which such animals were received, examined, slaughtered, or condemned in or removed from the public abattoirs, and the amount of fees paid for examining, slaughtering, and branding of all such animals, together with the names of the persons who are owners of such animals.

20. The Inspector shall enter in a book to be kept in the public abattoirs a complete description of all diseases of animals which he inspects, either before or after slaughter, and in such description there shall be included the names of the owners of the animals, the sex and age, and kind of animals, also the particulars of the manner in which all such animals have been disposed of.

M.—CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

21. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoirs or any butcher's shop or premises in or along any of the roads or streets of the city of Bendigo any meat unless such meat in any such vehicle is properly covered and surrounded by a thoroughly clean canvas or wooden covering.

22. No person shall carry or convey, or cause to be carried or conveyed, any meat in any kind of vehicle to or from the public abattoirs or butcher's shop or premises in or along any road or street in the city of Bendigo unless any such vehicle is in a proper, clean, and sanitary condition.

23. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of these Regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Resolution for passing these Regulations was agreed to by the Council the first day of December, 1911, and confirmed the twenty-ninth day of December, 1911.

PORTLAND PUBLIC CEMETERIES.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees for the Portland Public Cemeteries rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st day of January, 1896, page 517, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say :—

1. Before any interment shall take place, application for permission shall be made to the sexton, a reasonable time previously, when an order in the form or to the effect set out in the annexed Schedule B, will be given to the applicant upon payment of the charges set out in the Scale of Fees.

2. That all fees and charges payable shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

3. Persons who may be desirous of purchasing land for private burials may do so at the office of the sexton, upon payment of the fees prescribed.

4. That all applications for interment shall be made at the sexton's office, at least eight (8) working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless application therefor be made at least eight (8) working hours prior to the time fixed for the same.

5. The usual hours for interment for week days shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the year, unless by special permission of the Trustees.

6. That no interment shall be allowed on Sunday except where it is certified in writing by an Officer of Health, Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace, that for hygienic reasons it is necessary that the burial must take place on that day. An extra charge of One pound shall be made for any Sunday burial.

7. That the Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented, and be air and water tight.

8. That every grave shall be at least six (6) feet deep for one interment, and at least seven (7) feet for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve (12) years of age, when it shall be not less than three (3) feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin.

9. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said Cemeteries without a certificate from the Deputy Registrar of Deaths or Coroner, such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the Cemetery. No interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence, and if required a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

10. That no re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf be received.

11. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

12. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or to

stand opposite the entrance-gates except by authority of the Trustees having first been obtained. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery.

13. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner (as per Rule 21 of the Cemeteries Act). Should the owner's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

14. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

15. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the side entrances, and no vehicle conveying any such materials or soil shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather.

16. That no wooden erection shall be allowed in either Cemetery.

17. That every person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the Cemetery shall apply in writing to the Trustees, and submit a copy thereof to the Trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

18. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once at the expense of the person causing the same.

19. That no dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery.

20. That no person employed under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, except with the special consent of the Trustees.

21. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the Cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

22. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Trustees or person authorized by them, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the Cemetery upon any cause of offence.

23. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

24. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

25. That the Secretary shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

26. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other rules and regulations or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustee's Secretary or sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

27. The Trustees reserve to themselves the power to decorate graves from time to time when desired by the owners so to do, and when the owners do not desire the Trustees to do such work they may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees to do such necessary work; but no trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave without the permission of the Trustees.

28. That no person except relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, and those licensed by the Trustees, as set out in Schedule D, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

29. A plan of the grounds and a register, also a register of all certificates of right of burial which are issued, will be kept by the Secretary, which may be examined upon payment of the charges according to the Scale of Fees.

30. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of determining the extent of land to be purchased by any one applicant over and above four allotments.

31. That licences to grave dressers or grave decorators may be issued to persons approved of by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule D.

32. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Charges and Regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

Third, That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the Trustees, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path for the said purpose while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Fourth, That no business card or announcement shall be put on any place within the said Cemetery or its precincts. Fifth, That upon any breach of the above conditions, this licence shall be liable to be forfeited, and the licensee liable to the penalties provided for in the Act 54 Victoria No. 1072.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

(7) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5.
