## CHURCH OF ENGLAND.—LAND, KINGSTOWN.—POWER TO DISPOSE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twelfth day of November, 1912, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of Land.*—One acre two roods, county of Evelyn, parish of Greensborough, township of Kingstown, being part of allotment 42: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 41; bounded thence by that allotment and allotment 40 bearing S. 17 deg. 41 min. E. four chains fifty-two links; thence by a line bearing N. 72 deg. 10 min. E. three chains; thence by allotment 41 bearing N. 17 deg. 41 min. W. five chains forty-nine links; and thence by the road from Queenstown to Eltham bearing S. 54 deg. 24 min. W. three chains fifteen links to the point of commencement. Reserving and excepting to His Most Gracious Majesty the King, his heirs, successors, and assigns, and his and their agents, lessees, and licensees the right to mine at and below four hundred (400) feet from the surface of the land described.

*Names of Trustees.*—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

*Power of Disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the approval of the Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, acting with the advice of the Council of the Diocese, or during the absence of the Archbishop from the Diocese, or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time administering the affairs of the Diocese. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted by the Crown.

*Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.*—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by (1) the Archbishop acting under advice as aforesaid, or during his absence from the See, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese, and (2) the Trustees.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF COLLINS BROS. (WOOLLEN MANUFACTURING), LATROBE-TERRACE, CHILWELL, for a period of eight weeks from the 20th October, 1912, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females or more than four boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females and four boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE PAKENHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PAKENHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Pakenham Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF CONEWARRE, KNOWN AS THE "BREAM CREEK RECREATION RESERVE."**

WE, William Scott, John Green, Harry Challis, Leslie Edward Vagg, and Robert Ewing Blyth, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for Recreation purposes in the parish of Conewarre, known as the "Bream Creek Recreation Reserve," and hereinafter designated the Reserves, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserves on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, on holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person over the age of fifteen years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

For the admission of every person over the age of three years, but not over the age of fifteen years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence.

For the admission of every horse or carriage, cart, or other vehicle, exclusive of rider or passengers, as the case may be, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

3. No person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with any timber (dead or alive), trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, rockeries, or any vegetation of any kind in the Reserves, nor shall kindle or maintain any fire therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such place or places as the Committee of Management may indicate in the Reserves.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserves, or cut names on the trees, fences, gates, pavilions, bowers, or seats therein, or damage in any way any of the buildings, bowers, seats, or other erections or improvements in the Reserves, or stick bills thereon.

5. No person shall discharge any firearms in the Reserves, or roll or throw stones or any other missiles therein, or leave any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, or cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish of any kind in the Reserves.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserves, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, any article of any description in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

9. No person shall behave in a disorderly or noisy manner in the Reserves, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct therein.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BY-LAW NO. 11.

A By-law to prevent the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without light in the Shire of South Barwon.

**W**HEREAS by section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903* power is given to any municipality to make By-laws for the suppression of nuisances, and whereas the driving of vehicles at night without light is a nuisance, by reason of the danger thereby caused to wayfarers, and it is necessary to prevent and suppress the same. Now therefore we, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Barwon order as follows:—

1. Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall, in or upon or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of South Barwon, drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons without having a good and serviceable carriage lamp securely fixed and properly lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle shall for every such offence, upon conviction thereof, before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. The driver of any waggon, cart, or dray (whether such waggon, cart, or dray be upon springs or otherwise) who shall drive the same, whether for hire or otherwise, in, upon, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare, or place used as such, within the limits of the Shire of South Barwon, between any sunset and before sunrise the following morning, shall carry a lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the off-side of such waggon, cart, or dray in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, thoroughfare, or place in a contrary direction to that in which such waggon, cart, or dray shall be proceeding; and any person who shall be driving such waggon, cart, or dray without having such lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and exhibited as aforesaid shall for every such offence, upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
