Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be said. determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing
- fodder; (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder;

has made the following Determination, namely:-

- That this Determination shall come into force on and from the 1st day of January, 1913.
