PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN,
SURVEY BRANCH.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the Department as to probation.

PROBATION.

Accepted candidates approved by the Minister shall enter the office as probationers for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, may be appointed as pupils, and will be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service as far as they are applicable.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the Department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction or traverse surveys, also plotting from field book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time be not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with; but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 15.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound fifteen shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied from stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) On buildings in course of erection, when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourpence per 100 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1912.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Shire of Kara Kara Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation of all such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Kara Kara, that is to say:—

On rateable property in the whole of the above-named District, a rate of Threepence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is made for the year 1912, commencing on the first day of January, 1912, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1912, and shall be payable on the fourteenth day of January, 1912.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates, or such portion thereof, as they may be appointed to demand and receive.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 25.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1912:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, to such land, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1912, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1912, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof; and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
- (1) For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.
- For domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter (¾) of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.
- (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law, shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or the owner or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1912, and on the first day of July, 1912.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such a time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bainsdale Waterworks Trust.

An annual charge of Five shillings per head shall be made for each head of stock more than two (whether horses or cattle) kept on any premises along the line of mains, unless meters are placed on the service pipes to such premises, in which case the provision of clause 3 of the General Regulations shall apply.

4. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1912.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1912.

(I.) The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say :—

1. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the Shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

4. Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

(II.) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be :—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

(III.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1912, commencing on 1st January, 1912, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable by half-yearly instalments on 1st January, 1912, and 1st July, 1912.

(IV.) All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1912, and 1st July, 1912.

(V.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 1st of January, 1912.

Such person, or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

Cordeau Bickford, consisting of a tube or tape of lead, linen, cotton, or other suitable material, containing tri-nitro-toluol.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of *The Land Act* 1869, a certain portion of Crown land was proclaimed as a town: And whereas it is expedient to partly rescind the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in Part I. of the *Land Act* 1901, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

The Proclamation bearing date the 30th October, 1871, by which a certain portion of Crown lands therein described was notified and proclaimed as the Town of Purdeet, is hereby rescinded so far only as it relates to the portion of land hereinafter described, viz.:—

County of Villiers, parish of Purdeet East: Commencing at a point on the right bank of Muston's Creek where the south boundary of the town abuts thereon; bounded thence west by the said boundary to the road from Woolsthorpe; thence northerly by that road to the south side of the road forming the south boundary of section 5; thence easterly by that road to Muston's Creek aforesaid; and thence south-easterly by that creek to the point of commencement.—(P.116c(2) (11.C.54522).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION, POUND, AND MUSTERING PADDOCK IN THE PARISH OF SCARSDALE, EXCEPTING THE AREA OCCUPIED BY MUSTERING YARDS, KNOWN AS THE NEWTOWN RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Isaac Crosthwaite, William Sharp, Samuel Statton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 26th February, 1872, as a site for Recreation, Pound, and Mustering Paddock in the parish of Scarsdale, excepting the area occupied by Mustering Yards, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the

said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick-bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
