## MEREDITH AND CORIO SHIRES.—PROPOSED SEVERANCE.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903* (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Meredith described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Meredith, and annexed to the Shire of Corio.

## AREA DESCRIBED IN PETITION.

Commencing on the south boundary of the parish of Durdidwarrah at the south-west corner of Crown allotment one of the said parish (being there known as the "Five Mile"); thence along the south-west boundary of the said Crown allotment 1; thence northerly through the said allotment and Crown allotment 2 of the said parish; thence northerly and north-westerly through the State Forest to the township of Steiglitz; thence along Regent-street through the said township to the bridge over Sutherland's Creek at the north-east corner of township allotment 7 of section 17; thence northerly in a direct line to the south-east corner of the State School reserve; thence along the eastern boundary of such reserve; thence northerly in a direct line to New Chum township; thence northerly through the said township to the northern boundary of the said parish; thence northerly and north-westerly through the parish of Moreep to the township of Moreep; thence through the said township across the Stony Creek; and thence further northerly and between Crown allotments 28 and 28A of the parish of Moreep to the said parish boundary.

The petitioners state that the area sought to be severed is owing to the configuration of the country naturally a part of Corio Shire, is difficult of access from Meredith Shire, and can be more efficiently and cheaply administered by Corio Shire.

The petitioners further state that all traffic east of the Brisbane Ranges passes through and from the said area into and along the Corio Shire roads, and they consider that the revenue from the area should go to Corio Shire to enable the Council to defray the cost of keeping the roads in repair, &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Meredith, and annex same as a separate Riding to the Shire of Corio.

## Health Act 1890.

## SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.—BY-LAW No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Braybrook, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the pan charges made, or that may hereafter be made, by the Council as hereinafter provided for, and to no other portion of the said Shire.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall once at least in every week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside, or, by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 9th day of October, 1911; and confirmed the 11th day of December, 1911.

## Fisheries Act 1890.

## RESTRICTIONS RE FISHING (INCLUDING THE TAKING OF OYSTERS) IN WESTERN PORT.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the nineteenth day of May, 1909, re "Taking Oysters in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1908, re "Restriction on Netting, &c., in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the first day of February, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of February,

1909, re "Restrictions for the Regulation of Fishing, Western Port"; and to in lieu of the said Proclamations make a Proclamation for the following purposes, namely:—

1. Prohibiting the use, during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) within half-a-mile from the north-eastern and eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and the Queens-ferry Jetty.

2. Prohibiting the use, in Western Port during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) which contain any meshes measuring between knots more than one inch and a quarter and less than one inch and a half, and all set or mesh nets which contain any meshes measuring between knots less than one inch and three-quarters; the measurement of the meshes to be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt, a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net is dry the part to be measured shall be soaked in either fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured; provided that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these conditions, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for one year.

3. Prohibiting the use in Western Port of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, from noon on every Saturday until midnight on the following Sunday.

4. Prohibiting the taking of oysters from or in Western Port from midnight on every Friday until midnight on the following Sunday, and limiting the quantity of oysters to be taken by each person to seven bags, of three bushels capacity each, between midnight on any Sunday and midnight on the following Friday.

5. Prohibiting the removal of any boat having on board or attached or in tow, any trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, including any oyster dredge or oystering gear, from any wharf, pier, jetty, or anchorage within Western Port between noon on every Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

**SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.**

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by “Balfour Stewart’s Elementary Physics,” Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by “Geikie’s Class-book of Geology,” Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

**CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.**

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

**REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.**

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition or surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not

passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

#### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the

Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

(6) Meat and rabbits, frozen, in "T" trucks, shall be charged at the rate of 9d. per truck of 8 tons per mile, subject to a minimum charge per truck of 33s.; any weight in excess of 8 tons shall be charged for *pro rata*.

(9) *Rebate on Flour for Export.*—In respect of flour consigned by rail from country flour-mills direct for Export, a rebate shall be granted, subject to the production of satisfactory proof of export, of 15 per cent. below the rate applicable to the journey between the flour-mill and the port of export.

(10) *Rebate on Agricultural Produce consigned for Export at Ports outside of Melbourne.*—In respect of any goods in the Agricultural Produce Class carried for export at any Port outside of Melbourne which is situated nearer to the forwarding station than Williamstown Pier, a rebate shall, in such cases as it may be necessary, and subject to the production of satisfactory proof of export, be granted of sufficient extent to cause the net rate from the forwarding station to such Port to be 1s. 3d. per ton less than the rate under the mileage scale from the forwarding station to Williamstown Pier.

(11) The rate for the carriage of ale, beer, and porter, in bulk, in truck loads of 6 tons, viz., Class "B," is hereby abolished.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 1st day of January, 1912.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

## RATE, AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

BY-LAW No. 257.—WONTHAGGI URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE WONTHAGGI WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Wonthaggi Urban District within the Wonthaggi Waterworks District:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said Urban District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-one pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-one pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1911, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1912, and shall be payable on the seventeenth day of February, 1912, at the office of the said Commission at Wonthaggi.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time-being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

## BY-LAW No. 256.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION—TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

1. All previous by-laws and regulations relating to the subject-matter herein in respect of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked by-laws or regulations for payment of which charges such persons may have become liable prior to or at the date of this by-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the by-laws or regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this by-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff, or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this by-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of the lands shall be—

During the period from the 15th day of February, 1912, to the 31st day of May, 1912, Six shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the period from the 1st day of June, 1912, to the 30th day of September, 1912, Two shillings and sixpence for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

5. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purpose of this by-law deemed to be, such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

6. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

7. Charges for water supplied for irrigation shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

8. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby, authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

9. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

## BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

**R**ATING By-law for 1912, No. 1, made by the Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL DECLARING THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS THE AUTHORITY TO DUPLICATE THE VIADUCT AND COMPLETE THE FLINDERS STREET RAILWAY (RAILWAYS ACT 1891, SECTION 10).

WHEREAS by section 3 of *The Railway Construction Act 1884* (Act No. 821) power was conferred among other things on The Victorian Railways Commissioners (incorporated under *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883* Act No. 767) to construct and make a line of railway commencing at the Spencer-street Railway Station and terminating at the Flinders Street Railway Station in the line and upon the lands described in the sixty-third Schedule to the said first cited Act to be called the Flinders Street Viaduct Railway. And whereas pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act a railway on a Viaduct with a total width of sixty feet was projected and provided for but by reason of the money at the time available for the purpose being insufficient to complete more than one-half the width of the work the said Commissioners confined their operations to constructing one-half the width of the Viaduct and of the railway thereon the other half of such width being left uncompleted up to the present time. And

whereas section 6 of the *Railways Act 1891* (Act No. 1250) provides with regard to a line of railway which at the date of its commencement was in course of construction by or for the said The Victorian Railways Commissioners by or under the control of the then Engineer-in-Chief's Branch that such construction should be continued and carried on by The Board of Land and Works instead of by the said Commissioners and that any Act of Parliament authorizing the construction of any such line should be read and construed accordingly. And whereas Parliament has by the *Railway Loan Application Act 1911* (Act No. 2346) authorized the issue and application of the sum of £70,000 for the work of duplicating the Viaduct aforesaid and completing the Flinders Street Viaduct Railway as originally projected. And whereas unless section 6 of the *Railways Act 1891* hereinbefore referred to divested the then Corporation with the same name of all power in connection with or incidental to the completion of the same the now The Victorian Railways Commissioners incorporated under the provisions of the *Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1903* (Act No. 1825) would be the proper authority in whom is vested the obligation and duty of duplicating the said Viaduct and completing the said line. And whereas doubts exist whether under the terms of section 6 of the *Railways Act 1891* aforesaid The Board of Land and Works or the now The Victorian Railways Commissioners as the successors of the original Corporation with the same name is the proper authority to carry out the work of duplicating the said Viaduct and completing the said Flinders Street Viaduct Railway. And whereas by section 10 of the said last cited Act it is among other things provided that if any question arises or is about to arise as to whether any power duty authority or liability is or is not by the said Act transferred from The Victorian Railways Commissioners to The Board of Land and Works such question may be finally and conclusively determined by the Governor in Council in such manner as he shall think fit. And whereas I the undersigned the Governor of the State of Victoria and its dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof have considered and determined that the now The Victorian Railways Commissioners is the proper authority to carry out the work of duplicating or arranging for the duplicating of the Viaduct aforesaid and for completing the Flinders Street Railway as authorized by *The Railway Construction Act 1884* and to control the expenditure of the moneys available for the work under the terms of the *Railway Loan Application Act 1911*. Now therefore I as such Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby ordain and declare that the power duty authority and liability so far as concerns the completion of the Flinders Street Viaduct Railway and the duplication of the Viaduct commencing at the Spencer Street Railway Station and terminating at the Flinders Street Station in the line and upon the lands described in the sixty-third Schedule to *The Railway Construction Act 1884* and authorized to be made and maintained by the said cited Act is not and was not transferred from the then The Victorian Railways Commissioners to The Board of Land and Works but that the power duty authority and liability to continue and complete the making and maintenance of the said Flinders Street Viaduct Railway and duplication of the Viaduct remained in the said The Victorian Railways Commissioners and are now vested in The Victorian Railways Commissioners incorporated under the *Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1903* as the successors of and the body to whom has passed the powers authorities immunities rights privileges functions obligations and duties in that behalf which at the time of the passing of the *Railways Act 1891* vested in attached to or were exercisable by the Corporation in the said Act referred to as the Commissioners and being The Victorian Railways Commissioners the body incorporated under *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883* and that the now body The Victorian Railways Commissioners and not The Board of Land and Works is and is to be deemed to be the authority to control the expenditure of the money whether under the *Railway Loan Application Act 1911* or from any other source for the time being available and appropriated for making and completing the said Flinders Street Viaduct Railway or the duplication of the said Viaduct.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF LYNDBURST, KNOWN AS THE "FORESHORE RESERVE."**

THE Council of the Shire of Dandenong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the portion of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the Parish of Lyndhurst, known as the "Foreshore Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Reserve, nor light any fires therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or grass.
7. No person shall moor any boats in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. Application shall be made to the Committee of Management for permission to erect bathing boxes or boat sheds in the Reserve. No such buildings shall be nearer to the next one than 20 feet, and such sheds shall conform to a type approved by the Committee of Management. An annual fee of 10s. shall be paid for the right to a bathing-box site, and one pound (£1) for the right to a boat-house site. The tenure of such sites shall be during the pleasure of the said Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## Conditional Purchase Lease.

The leases issued to successful applicants will be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31 $\frac{1}{2}$ , as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board, and will contain the following conditions:—

- (a) That a substantial dwelling-house, to the value of at least £50, must be erected within one year from the date of the lease, and substantial improvements, to the value of a further £25, before the end of the second year.
- (b) That the lessee shall reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by the wife or any child not less than eighteen years of age of the lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)
- (c) That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the whole or any part of the allotment within the first six years of the lease.
- (d) That the lessee shall not erect more than one residence or place of business on any one allotment.
- (e) Such other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with the Act as the Governor in Council may by regulation prescribe.

The deposit, after deducting the sum of £1 5s. for fees, will be credited as part payment of the capital value of the allotment, and the balance of the purchase money, with interest at 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent., must be paid by 63 or a less number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*. An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for.

Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a Farm Allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. 4. 6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. #### SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the provisions of sec. 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered No. 29, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the Shire of Dandenong.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong, order as follows:—

1. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, into any part of the Shire of Dandenong or from any one part of the shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. Before any building or erection is removed into the shire or from any one part of the shire to another the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give

to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, not less than five clear days' notice, in writing, of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall accompany such notice supply the following particulars:—

(a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, any alterations or additions thereto.

And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the Building Surveyor shall inspect such building or erection before removal. If such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law then the Surveyor shall give his certificate for its removal and re-erection in the shire, but not otherwise.

3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-erected within the shire.

4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the shire, unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner or of the Health Inspector of any municipal Council.

5. No dwelling or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be removed or re-erected within the shire unless the same when re-erected shall cover an area 200 square feet at the least. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c.:—

(a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. red gum or jarrah, spaced to 4-ft. centres.

(b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not more than 4 in. x 1½ in., or its equal, spaced not less than 18 in. apart, centre to centre, and properly braced.

(c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in., spaced 3 ft., centre to centre.

Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in., spaced 18 in. apart, centre to centre, on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers, spaced 6 ft. apart.

(d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.

(e) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part less than 6 in. above the surface of the ground.

(f) All window sashes to be made to open and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.

(g) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 10 feet between the floors and ceilings.

(h) No canvas and paper walls to be allowed.

(i) All roof coverings to be of incombustible material.

All timber and material which in the opinion of the Building Surveyor is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material. Such building when completed shall also comply with the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council. (The conditions of this section shall not apply to buildings to be used as stables or sheds, provided the same comply in all other respects with this By-law.)

6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

7. If the Building Surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving notice from the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure, shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may on the expiration of the time therein limited pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—

(a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the Shire of Dandenong, whether the same is approved of or not—10s.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Dandenong, but shall not apply to any Government, railway, or municipal building.

10. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than Ten shillings per day and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the 30th day of October, 1911, and confirmed the 11th day of December, 1911.
