IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1903 (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, vir.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepavers in the portion of the Shire of Meredith described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Meredith, and annexed to the Shire of Corio.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.-BY-LAW No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Braybrook, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government

- on its command by the Board of Figure Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gasette.

 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the pan charges made, or that may hereafter be made, by the Council as hereinafter provided for, and to no other portion of the said Shire.

 4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the sent of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

 5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

 6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quanity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

 7. The Council shall once at least in every week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

- S. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient
- g. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
- to. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petry Sessions.
- 11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 9th day of October, 1911; and confirmed the 11th day of December, 1911.

RESTRICTIONS RE FISHING (INCLUDING THE TAKING OF OYSTERS) IN WESTERN PORT.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governo in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, 1909, and published in the Government Gazette of the nineteenth day of May, 1909, re "Taking Oysters in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1908, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1908, re "Restriction on Netting, &c., in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the first day of February, 1900, and published in the Government Gazette of the tenth day of February,

1909, re "Restrictions for the Regulation of Fishing, Western Port"; and to in lieu of the said Proclamations make a Proclamation for the following purposes, namely:

r. Prohibiting the use, during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) within half-a-mile from the north-eastern and eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and the Queensferry Jetty.

- 2. Prohibiting the use, in Western Port during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) which contain any meshes measuring between knots more than one inch and a quarter and less than one inch and a half, and all set or mesh nets which contain any meshes measuring between knots less than one inch and three-quarters; the measurement of the meshes to be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt, a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net is dry the part to be measured shall be soaked in either fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured; provided that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these conditions, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for one year.
- 3. Prohibiting the use in Western Port of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, from noon on every Saturday until midnight on the following Sunday.
- 4. Prohibiting the taking of oysters from or in Western Port from midnight on every Fridav until midnight on the following Sunday, and limiting the quantity of oysters to be taken by each person to seven bags, of three bushels capacity each, between midnight on any Sunday and midnight on the following Friday.
- 5. Prohibiting the removal of any boat having on board or attached or in tow, any trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, including any oyster dredge or oystering gear, from any wharf, pier, jetty, or anchorage within Western Port between noon on every Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

 - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.
- o. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

(c) Detail of field practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, planetable, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel pand.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuta; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.
- 13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 214.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith :-

(1) The rates for the carriage of goods as specified hereunder, in consignments of not less than six (6) tons, shall be as prescribed under the heading of the Agricultural Produce Class in the Schedule in Clause 4 hereof :-

Molasses and treacle for cattle food, on declaration.

Oats.

Oil cake, for cattle food.

RATE, AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

By-law No. 257.—Wonthaggi Urban District within the Wonthaggi Waterworks District.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Wonthaggi Urban District within the Wonthaggi Waterworks District:—

- t. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the said Urban District:—
 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Iwenty-one pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Iwenty shillings per year.
 - (a) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-one pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
 - (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1911, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1912, and shall be payable on the seventeenth day of February, 1912, at the office of the said Commission at Wonthaggi.
- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

BY-LAW No. 256.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBU-TION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION—TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

- 1. All previous by-laws and regulations relating to the subject-matter herein in respect of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked by-laws or regulations for payment of which charges such persons may have become liable prior to or at the date of this by-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the by-laws or regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this by-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.
- 2. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff, or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.
- 3. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this by-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.
- 4. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of the lands shall be-
 - During the period from the 15th day of February, 1912, to the 31st day of May, 1912, Six shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.
 - During the period from the 1st day of June, 1912, to the 30th day of September, 1912, Two shillings and sixpence for each and every acre foot of water supplied.
- 5. An acre foot of water shall be, and is for the purpose of this by-law deemed to be, such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.
- 6. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.
- 7. Charges for water supplied for irrigation shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.
- · 8. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby, authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.
- 9. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.
- ro. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF LYNDHURST, KNOWN AS THE "FORESHORE RESERVE."

THE Council of the Shire of Dandenong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the portion of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the Parish of Lyndhurst, known as the "Foreshore Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Reserve, nor light any fires therein.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein.
- 4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
- 5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or grass.
- 7. No person shall moor any boats in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. Application shall be made to the Committee of Management for permission to erect bathing boxes or boat sheds in the Reserve. No such buildings shall be nearer to the next one than 20 feet, and such sheds shall conform to a type approved by the Committee of Management. An annual fee of 10s. shall be paid for the right to a bathing-box site, and one pound (£1) for the right to a boat-house site. The tenure of such sites shall be during the pleasure of the said Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1991, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence: and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Tenders for suprly of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and for the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. 6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. 1. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, into any part of the Shire of Dandenong or from any one part of the shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. Before any building or erection is removed into the shire or from any one part of the shire to another the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give

to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, not less than five clear days' notice, in writing, of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particular

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is pro-
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.

 (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, any alterations or additions thereto.

 And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the Building Surveyor shall inspect such building or erection before removal. If such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law then the Surveyor shall give his certificate for its removal and re-erection in the shire, but not otherwise.

 No building or erection that has been condemned
- 3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-crected within the shire.
- 4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the shire, unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner or of the Health Inspector of any municipal Council.
- 5. No dwelling or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be removed or re-erected within the shire unless the same when re-erected shall cover an area 200 square feet at the least. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers are

 - (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. red gum or jarrah, spaced to 4-ft. centres.

 (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not more than 4 in. x 1½ in., or its equal, spaced not less than 18 in. apart, centre to centre, and properly braced.
 - (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 12 in., spaced 3 ft.,

 - (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 12 in., or centre to centre.

 Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in., spaced 18 in. apart, centre to centre, on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers, spaced 6 ft. apart.

 (d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.

 (e) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part less than 6 in. above the surface of the ground.
 - (f) All window sashes to be made to open and suffi-cient ventilation to be provided in each room.
 - (g) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 10 feet between the floors and ceilings.
 - (h) No canvas and paper walls to be allowed.
 (i) All roof coverings to be of incombustible material.
 - All timber and material which in the opinion of I timber and material which in the opinion of the Building Surveyor is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material. Such building when completed shall also comply with the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council. (The conditions of this section shall not apply to buildings to be used as stables or sheds, provided the same comply in all other respects with this By-law.)
- 6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.
- of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

 7. If the Building Surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving notice from the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure, within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may on the expiration of the time therein limited pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—
