RULE OF THE ROAD.—MOTOR BOATS.

PERSONS in charge of pleasure motor boats navigating in Port Phillip are notified that complaint has been made that serious danger is incurred from time to time by failure of those in charge to strictly observe the prescribed rules for preventing collisions.

Such persons are informed that the rules apply with equal force to all classes of boats (whether steam, motor, or sail propelled) without exception, and in case of wilful default infringement of the regulations is deemed a misdemeanour punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both (Marine Act 1890, section 134), and that there is, therefore, an obligation resting upon every person in charge of such craft to be acquainted with the prescribed rules, and to carefully observe them on all occasions, otherwise very serious personal responsibility may be incurred.

Caution.—Those in charge of pleasure boats of all kinds

Caution.—Those in charge of pleasure boats of all kinds are advised to give larger craft a wide berth, and when in doubt as to the rule of the road, to indicate by early action the intention to make for a position of safety.

### SHIRE OF MIRBOO.

### BY-LAW NO. 4.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mirboo, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and the Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law, that is to say:—

No. 1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

No. 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

No. 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Mirboo North.

No. 4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

No. 5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit same, and shall cause one or the other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

No. 6. The occupier aforesaid, or the other person having control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorize the contents of such pan.

No. 7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

No. 8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally

No. 9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

No. 10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making No. 10. The Council shall have power in field of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, and the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

No. 11. Every closet or privy shall be furnished, to the satisfaction of the Council; with a brick or cement floor of such dimensions as shall be approved of by the Council for the purpose of receiving the pan.

No. 12. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

# PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

A SUM of Three thousand five hundred pounds shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows the summer of t

- I. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1911, and 31st December, 1911, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of April, 1912. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B."
- 2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden; or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between 1st January, 1911, and 31st December, 1911; but it, shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January; 1911.
- 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1010 (vidé Form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining if made of local contributions, as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced pro raid.
- 4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), of to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens; Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens; Geelong.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Weights and Measures Act 1909 (9 Edw. VII. No. 2182), it is enacted that notwithstanding the provisions of section Thirty-one of the Principal Act where a Union under the Principal Act has been in existence for a period of not less than ten years and any one of the Councils forming such Union desires to withdraw therefrom the Governor in Council may if he think fit upon application in writing under the common seal of such Council by proclamation in the Government Gazette dissolve such Union: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of December, 1890, the Councils of the Boroughs of Hamilton and Portland and of the Shires of Glenelg and Portland were proclaimed a "Union" for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Act 1890: And whereas the council of the Borough of Portland, being one of the units of the Weights and Measures Union proclaimed as aforesaid, and being desirous of withdrawing from such Union, has applied to lave the said Union dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation dissolve the "Union" of the Councils of the Boroughs of Hamilton and Portland and of the Shires of Glenelg and Portland proclaimed as aforesaid.

3. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the beach or sea shore, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing place; and no person clothed in bathing costume shall be on any part of the foreshore reserves other than the beach.

4. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.
5. No person shall dress or undress or remove

No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place save the following, viz.:—A bathing box on which the current year's fee has been paid, and to which he has lawfully obtained access, a dressing shed set apart by the Council, or any other dressing place duly authorized by the Council.

6. No male over the age of 10 years shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, baths, or latrines reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, baths, or latrines reserved for males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

7. No person shall play games in, loiter, misconduct himself, commit a nuisance, bring any rubbish, fith, or other offensive matter into, or damage, disfigure, or write upon any of the bathing boxes, dressing sheds, or enclosures set apart or authorized by the Council for bathing purposes. ing purposes.

#### BEHAVIOUR.

8. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner, in or on any part of the beach, foreshore, or water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purposes.

9. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal upon or along any part of the sea shore at any other than a walking pace.

# BATHING HORSES, ETC.

BATHING HORSES, ETC.

10. Bathing horses or other animals is prohibited within the limits of the West Riding of the Municipality in the water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, and within the limits of the South Riding of the Municipality in the water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, except on those parts of the fore-shore indicated by posts.

This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Moorabbin which is on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, and from the building line on the east side of Beach-road to within 300 yards seawards of the boundary of the Shire, as set forth in Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1903.
