Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE NIGHTWATCHMEN'S BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of a nightwatchman, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That this Determination shall come into force on the 11th day of July, 1912.

WAGES.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:—

Nightwatchman employed on a wharf ..	9½d.	per hour, or £2 17s. per week of 72 hours.		
Nightwatchman who does manual work in addition to watching, wheresoever employed ..	9½d.	£2 17s.	.. 72 ..
Nightwatchman (outside) wheresoever employed who patrols otherwise than on foot ..	9½d.	£2 17s.	.. 72 ..
Nightwatchman (outside) who watches buildings and patrols on foot ..	9d.	£2 14s.	.. 72 ..
Nightwatchman not provided for above ..	8d.	£2 8s.	.. 72 ..

APPRENTICES.

NUMBER.

3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer shall be one apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers employed and receiving not less than £2 8s. per week of 72 hours.

IMPROVERS.

NUMBER.

4. That the number of improvers who may be employed by any employer shall be one improver to every three or fraction of three workers employed and receiving not less than £2 8s. per week of 72 hours.

WAGES OF APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

5. That the lowest prices or rates to be paid to apprentices or improvers shall be:—

For the 1st year's experience	30s. per week
.. 2nd	35s. ..
.. 3rd	40s. ..

and thereafter the minimum wage.

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OVERTIME.

6. That any employé wheresoever employed who works in any week for any time in excess of 72 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

CASUAL LABOUR.

7. That any person employed for less than six consecutive nights shall be a casual worker and shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter, but no such payment shall in any case exceed the ordinary weekly wage as fixed by this Determination.
