BASS STRAIT LIGHTS.

THE following Notice to Mariners, in pursuance of the recommendations by the Commonwealth Government for Improvements to the existing Lighting, &c., of the South-East Coast of Victoria, is published for general information:—

Increase of Power and Alterations in Characteristics of Wilson's Promontory and Gabo Island Lights.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, dated 1st August, 1907, pages 107 and 144, mariners and others are hereby notified that it is intended to increase the power and alter the characteristics of the present lights exhibited at Wilson's Promontory and Gabo Island Stations.

The present fixed white light at Wilson's Promontory will be changed to a quadruple flashing light showing four flashes in quick succession every fifteen seconds.

The present fixed white light at Gabo Island will be changed to an occulting light with periods of nine seconds light and three seconds eclipse.

It is anticipated that the work of conversion will be completed in time to enable the new lights to be exhibited about the 1st March, 1913.

Subsequent notices will be published describing the details of the alterations.

Establishment of Unattended Lights at Cape Liptrap and Citadel Island.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, dated 1st August, 1907, pages 103 and 105, describing the physical features and appearance of Cape Liptrap and Citadel Island, mariners are hereby notified that, on or after the 1st March, 1913, unattended flashing lights showing, all around the horizon will be established at Cape Liptrap and Citadel Island.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE EXPENDITURE OF COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS OF INQUIRY.

THE following Regulations are to be read conjointly with those to be observed in preparing accounts for expenditure in connexion with Commissions and Boards of Inquiry, approved by the Governor in Council on the 11th January, 1899, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th January, 1899, page 148.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

In addition to the actual cost of travelling the following shall be the rates payable to Members or Secretaries of Commissions and Boards of Inquiry who are required to travel more than ten (10) miles from their usual place of residence to attend the sittings of the Commission or Board of Inquiry (as the case may be):—

When the Commission or Board of Inquiry is sitting in the State, £1 per day.
When the Commission or Board is sitting in other States, £1 10s. per day.

Provided that Members of Parliament, serving on Commissions or Boards of Inquiry, shall not be entitled to the expenses herein specified when the Commission or Board of Inquiry is sitting in Melbourne during the Session of Parliament.

The rates set forth herein are to defray the cost of hotel and all other incidental expenses, and are fixed for a whole day of twenty-four (24) hours; but when the period of absence from the usual place of residence is not a complete day or days, a proportion of the daily rate, equivalent to the time occupied, shall be paid.

SHORTHAND AND TYPEWRITING ASSISTANCE.

When it is necessary that the proceedings of the Commission or Board of Inquiry shall be reported, application shall be made to the Government Shorthand Writer for the services of a Shorthand Writer. In the event of that officer being unable to provide the required assistance, a Shorthand Writer may be engaged at rates of payment not exceeding the following:—

Fee for attendance, £1 1s. per day.
Transcription of evidence, including any number of copies up to nine, 9d. per folio of 72 words.
For each additional copy of evidence, 1d. per folio of 72 words.

The rate of payment for Typists engaged occasionally upon copying work shall not exceed Two shillings and sixpence per hour, or Twopence per folio of 72 words and One penny per folio for each extra copy.

GENERAL.

Secretaries of Commissions and Boards of Inquiry shall see that the accounts of expenditure are prepared in accordance with the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, and shall carefully scrutinize each item of expenditure to insure that it is a proper charge against the funds of the Commission or Board of Inquiry.

Where it is necessary to incur expenditure on refreshments, &c., care shall be taken to keep the cost within the lowest limits, and in all other expenditure Secretaries are held responsible for the exercise of due economy.

Secretaries shall submit a statement of the accounts of the Commission or Board of Inquiry to the Under-Secretary, at least once in each month.

TRAMWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF UPPER YARRA.

At State Government House, Melbourne, the twentieth day of June, 1912.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890*, it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Shire of Upper Yarra.

And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said Municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Council of the Shire of Upper Yarra shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Yarra, and the said Council is also empowered to acquire certain lands required for the purposes of the said tramway, the particulars of such lands being referred to in Schedule "A" hereinafter referred to and more particularly described and shown on plans numbered 1 to 10 deposited in the Public Works Department also hereinafter referred to.

ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing at a point in the Yarra Junction station yard; thence running in a south-easterly direction through allotments 53C, 63, 63B, and 64A, parish of Woori Yallock, and allotments 76A, 76, 77, 79C, 80A, 80, 64A, 62B, 62D, 63B, 63A, 62A, 61C, 61D, 61, 38, 39, 60, and 58A, parish of Beenak, and terminating in the last-mentioned allotment, the route of such tramway being more particularly shown on plan numbered 21 lodged in the Public Works Department.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be three feet (3 feet) and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specification numbered 1 to 20 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specification are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specification so deposited as the plans and specification referred to in this Order, and which plans and specification are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used shall be steam or electricity.

BRAKES.

That the brakes to be used upon the said tramway shall be as follows:—

On Locomotives.—Steam brake on engine and hand brake on both engine and tender. Hand brake operated by wheel. Both brakes operated on all six wheels of locomotive and on all wheels of tender.

On Low Side Waggons.—Hand brake operated by lever. Brake operates on two wheels of waggons.

On Timber Float Waggons.—Hand brake operated by lever. Brake operates on two wheels of waggon.

On Passenger Carriage.—Hand brake operating by wheel inside compartment and braking the four wheels of carriage.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be fifteen (15) miles in the hour, excepting on curves where the speed must be reduced sufficiently to insure the safety of the public.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of seven (7) months from the date of the approval of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of goods and passengers.

NECESSARY PRECAUTION FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway and to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets and along the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following:—

Passenger Fares—

Single journey (10 miles), 1s. 8d.

Return journey, 3s.

Intermediate stations (4 miles), single fare, 8d.; return fare, 1s. 2d.

Intermediate stations (6 miles), single fare, 1s.; return fare, 1s. 6d.

Intermediate stations (8 miles), single fare, 1s. 4d.; return fare, 2s. 4d.

Children under twelve (12) years of age half fare, and children in arms free of charge.

CHARGES FOR CARRIAGE OF TIMBER, FRUIT, AND ALL OTHER GOODS.

Timber—

Up to 9 inches by 9 inches—

For distance of 1 to 6 miles, 2s. 6d. per ton of 30 cubic feet; over 6 and up to 10 miles, 3s. 2d. per ton of 30 cubic feet.

Over 9 inches by 9 inches—

For distance of 1 to 10 miles, 3s. 8d. per ton of 30 cubic feet.

Firewood—

For distance of 1 to 6 miles, 2s. 3d. per ton.

For distance over 6 and up to 10 miles, 2s. 9d. per ton.

Fruit.—For distance of 1 to 10 miles, 4s. per ton, with 1s. as a minimum of 3d. per case, if cheaper.

Agricultural Produce—

For distance of 1 to 6 miles, 2s. 6d. per ton.

For distance over 6 and up to 10 miles, 3s. 2d. per ton.

Machinery.—For distance of 1 to 10 miles, 6s. per ton.

All other Goods—

For distance of 1 to 6 miles, 4s. per ton.

Parcels.—Up to 14 lbs., 3d.; over 14 and up to 28 lbs., 6d.; over 28 and up to 42 lbs., 9d.; over 42 and up to 56 lbs., 1s.; over 56 and up to 84 lbs., 1s. 3d.; over 84 and up to 112 lbs., 1s. 6d.; every additional 28 lbs., or part thereof, 3d.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the reference made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of, or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said Municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the Council of the said Municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. (b) Forty scholarships, or any less number, to pupils selected from State or other schools as suitable to receive higher education, and to proceed to a diploma or a degree in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science at the Melbourne University.

(d) Ten scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of schools other than State Schools for the purpose of giving facilities to deserving students for obtaining higher education and proceeding to any diploma or degree at the Melbourne University, or to any science course in a technical school.

3. The subjects of examination will be:—

5. Scholarships under section 1 (b) will not be awarded to candidates unless they produce satisfactory evidence that they are likely to profit by a course of study in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science, and are likely to succeed in the practical work involved in those occupations.

8. (d) That the scholar under sections 1 (a) and 1 (d) shall complete the "pass" at the Junior Public examination at the end of the third year of the currency of the scholarship.

No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind sections 1 (a) and (b), 3, and 9 (a) and (b) of Regulation XXII, of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXII.—EXHIBITIONS.

1. The Minister of Public Instruction may annually award exhibitions in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

(a) Twenty-five exhibitions, or any less number, for the purpose of enabling students to proceed to any diploma or degree at the Melbourne University, or to any science course in an approved technical school.

- (b) Twenty exhibitions, or any less number, for the purpose of enabling students to proceed to a degree or a diploma in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science at the Melbourne University.

3. Candidates for exhibitions under section 1 (a) above must, previous to the competitive examination, have passed the Junior Public examination of the University of Melbourne, and must have been holders of scholarships under section 1 (a) or 1 (d) of Regulation XXI., or be recorded as "meritorious" at a competitive examination held in accordance with the provisions of that Regulation.

They must have attended regularly at a State continuation school or an approved secondary school as students for not less than three years immediately prior to the date of the examination, and must have annually obtained a good report from the authorities of the school or college which they have been attending.

9. Exhibitions under section 1 (b) above will entitle exhibitors to free tuition at the Melbourne University in the subjects of degrees or diplomas in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science. Each such exhibition will be tenable for four years under the following conditions:—

- (a) That the exhibitor shall, at the commencement of the term following the award of the exhibition, enter as student at the Melbourne University and that, during the whole term of his tenure, he shall, when so required, be enrolled as attending lectures, and comply with other University requirements for degrees or diplomas in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science, and that he shall, in each year, fulfil all University requirements in as many subjects as he must pass in to complete his year.
- (b) That, at the end of the second year of his tenure, he shall have passed the first ordinary examination for a degree or a diploma in mining or in agriculture or in veterinary science at the Melbourne University, and that, at the end of the third year of his tenure, he shall have passed the second ordinary examination for such degree or diploma.

No conditional purchase lease of an agricultural labourer's allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £200, or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

A substantial dwelling house of a value of at least Thirty pounds must be erected on the allotment within one year from the date of his lease.

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired on payment of the balance of purchase money.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.
