

SPECIFICATION FOR CASTINGS.

1. Castings of a special character other than those provided for under this Schedule may be obtained locally without infringing this Contract.
2. All castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell cold shuts, blow holes, honey-comb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect, and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered, the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be ordered, such heads and runners to be cut off by the Contractor before delivery is made, and the charge for the casting must be at the net weight only, trimmed and clean.
3. Whenever specially ordered, the iron castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron" of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the officer of the Department ordering, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal, at the option and to the satisfaction of the officer ordering.
4. Whenever castings are required, and, in the opinion of the officer ordering, they can be moulded from the broken originals, the Contractor will be bound to mould from such broken originals without requiring the Government to supply a wooden or other pattern for same, and without being allowed any extra rate.
5. All patterns lent by the Government will be delivered to the Contractor at his works, and all such patterns must be returned by and at the expense of the Contractor in good order and condition, and must be delivered together with the castings. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the Locks, &c., tendered for in this sub-schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 10s. per day, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

The Contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for services rendered, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under this contract have been employed in accordance with clause 12 of these conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workman as is provided for under that clause.

The White Lead must be finely ground in the best quality of pure linseed oil, the proportion of which must not exceed seven and one half per cent. of the weight.

The surface of the lead when exposed to the air without water on the top of the lead shall not become brittle or crumbly after seven days' exposure.

The White Lead is to be of the best quality. The process by which it is made shall be branded on the packages in which the White Lead is delivered.

White Lead made by the Stack Process shall consist of Lead carbonate, and not less than twenty-five per cent. (25%) of Lead hydrate, as determined by analysis on the pigment freed from oil. The proportion of lead in dry white lead after the removal of the oil, when calculated to metallic lead shall not be less than seventy-eight (78) per cent. equal to oxide of lead eighty-four (84) per cent.

Quantities of White Lead for testing may be taken out of any of the drums or kegs supplied, and then mixed together and analyzed.

Where the raw material used in the manufacture of the articles tendered for in this schedule is not of Commonwealth production it must, where practicable, be of British origin, and the Contractor, if called on during the currency of the contract to do so, shall furnish evidence of the origin of the raw material used.

In all cases articles of Commonwealth manufacture and production will have preference over imported goods.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the Varnishes tendered for in this Schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 45s. per week; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. SPECIFICATION FOR VENETIAN BLINDS.

OUTSIDE VENETIAN BLINDS.

Frames.—The frames to be constructed of clear pine, wrought throughout, with 1-in. jambs and soffits dove-tailed at joints, and $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. front and back linings, securely put together. The outside linings to be finished all round with small clear pine moulding mitred at angles, and the frames to be accurately fitted to openings with any cutting to shape required, and to be securely screwed to plugs in reveals. The head linings to be made to form casings of sufficient depth to entirely cover the blinds when drawn up, and the fronts of same to be divided into ornamental panels of approved patterns by means of selected mouldings planted on; the lower edges of outside head linings to be escalated to approved pattern.

Blinds.—The laths, pulley bearers, and top and bottom laths of clean clear pine wrought throughout, and all laths to be $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide and spaced not more than 2 inches apart; pulley bearers to be $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick, to be properly mortised to receive pulleys, and to be neatly grooved for cords; top and bottom laths to be $\frac{3}{8}$ inch thick and intermediate laths $\frac{5}{8}$ inch thick, and all edges to be neatly rounded.

Blinds to be hung with all necessary brass pulleys, lignum vitæ or other approved drums, approved linen web ladder tapes, and 4-lb. best patent white cords, and to be provided with Young's patent cord-holders, or, when ordered, 6-in. double brass plate hooks. Blinds to be provided with brass pulleys, so that they may be raised and regulated from inside the rooms. Blinds up to 3 ft. 6 in. in width to have two lines of tapes and cords, and over that width three lines.

Painting.—The whole of the woodwork of blinds and frames to be primed with red lead and raw linseed oil, and to be then painted three coats of the best oil colour, composed of white lead, raw linseed oil, colour, turpentine, and dryers; the painting to be rubbed down with glass paper between the coats, and to be finished in selected tints. The last coat but one to be slightly darker than the tint selected for the finishing coat, and the last coat to be a coat of flatting. The whole to be once varnished with the best English pale copal varnish.

Repairing, &c., old blinds.—Repairing old blinds is to include taking down, washing, painting two coats of oil colour as before described and once varnishing both blinds and frames, providing and fixing approved new linen web ladder tapes and 4-lb. best patent white cords, and securely refixing, and putting in working order.

INSIDE VENETIAN BLINDS.

Inside Venetian Blinds to be as above described for Outside Blinds, except that they are to be made of California red pine without frames.

Repairing, &c., old blinds.—Repairing old blinds is to include taking down, washing, painting two coats of oil colour as before described and once varnishing, providing and fixing approved new linen web ladder tapes and 4-lb. best patent cords, and securely refixing and putting in working order. Any old galvanized iron brackets to be made thoroughly secure, and new galvanized iron brackets to be supplied and fixed where required.

MATERIALS FOR ABOVE.

Materials.—The clear pine and red California pine for all blinds are to be sound, dry, and well seasoned; and the whole of the materials are to be of the best of their respective kinds, free from all defects equal to samples to be seen at the Department of Public Works, and to be subject to the approval of the Superintending Officer. Blinds to be made generally to correspond with samples to be seen at the Public Offices.

Fitting and fixing.—Where the building for which the blinds are required is within a radius of 8 miles from the General Post Office the contractor will be required, when ordered to fix the blinds, to take his own dimensions, to properly fix the blinds either under soffits of windows or on approved galvanized-iron brackets, securely screwed, and to make good any damage done to the buildings.

Packing for transit to country.—Where the building for which the blinds are required is beyond a radius of 8 miles from the General Post Office the contractor will be required, when ordered to pack the blinds for transit to the country, to provide proper packing cases and to securely pack the blinds, and to deliver them complete and perfect and ready for fixing at such railway station or other forwarding agency in Melbourne as may be directed.

Generally.—All blinds must be examined and passed by an officer of the Public Works Department before they are paid for.

All blinds to be made and painted on the contractor's premises, which must be within a reasonable distance of the city of Melbourne; and every facility must be afforded the officers of the Public Works Department for examining the work at any time previous to its delivery.

The contract for repairing, &c., only applies to buildings within the radius above mentioned.

The Government reserves the right, when erecting new buildings or when making additions or repairs to buildings outside the radius above mentioned, of including any Venetian Blinds required in the general contract for such building, additions, or repairs.
