Education Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

At State Government House, Melbourne, the second day of July, 1912.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Billson | Mr. Hagelthorn.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations giving effect to the provisions of Division 3 of the *Education Act 1910*, No. 2301, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXVII.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

1. Payments from the Annual Vote for Technical Schools shall be made only to such schools as may receive the approval of the Governor in Council, and the Governor in Council may, at any time, either withdraw approval from, or reduce the grant allotted to, any school.

2. Each school shall, in accordance with the provisions contained in these Regulations, be under the supervision of a Council, to whom grants in aid of maintenance will be paid by the Minister of Public Instruction.

3. Existing Councils may remain in office until the 1st January, 1913, but after that date the Council of each Technical School shall consist of not more than sixteen members.

4. No person shall be appointed a member of the Council for more than three years, but any member of the Council shall, on ceasing to be a member, be eligible for re-appointment.

5. The members of the Council shall be appointed as follows:—

The Governor in Council may appoint ten members. Parents and guardians of fee-paying students may elect two members. The Governor in Council may, on the nomination of any municipality or organized public body which contributes annually to the funds of any Technical School the sum of not less than £50, appoint one member for each municipality or public body.

The members appointed by the Governor in Council shall include three persons appointed on account of their interest in and knowledge of Technical Education generally: the remainder will be appointed, as far as practicable, on account of their expert knowledge of at least one branch of Technical work dealt with at the school to which they are appointed.

Individual subscribers may elect one representative provided the local subscriptions amount to 5 per cent. of the annual Government grant, and two representatives if subscriptions amount to 10 per cent. or more of the annual Government grant.

The Governor in Council may determine the number of representatives for each school, and if a smaller number than sixteen be decided upon, the same proportional representation will, as far as possible, be maintained, provided the parents and guardians of fee-paying students have two representatives in all cases.

6. The members of the Council of each Technical School will be required:—

- (a) to keep themselves in touch with the work carried on in the school by periodically visiting the class rooms, laboratories, and workshops during the progress of instruction;
- (b) to report to the Director of Education as to what steps should be taken in order to keep the school up to the requirements of modern practice;
- (c) to recommend to the Minister of Public Instruction for appointment part-time instructors, clerical assistants, and caretakers, who will be paid by the Councils out of the annual revenue of the school;
- (d) to provide for the maintenance and upkeep of the school out of the annual revenue—such maintenance to include salaries and wages of certain assistant instructors, part-time instructors, clerical assistants, auditors, caretakers, sums required for class material, lighting power, fuel, fittings, furniture, apparatus, stationery, printing, advertising, or such items not provided in the foregoing list but sanctioned by the Director; and to keep their annual expenditure within their annual income;
- (e) to consult with the Inspectors of the Technical Education Branch of the Education Department and lay before them any matter requiring attention;

- (f) to determine what fees should be charged to students, and to apportion the duties of officers in the collection of the same;
- (g) to see that the books and accounts are properly kept;
- (h) to undertake any public work of educational interest;
- (i) to draw up a constitution for their school in accordance with these Regulations;
- (j) to recommend for the approval of the Director the introduction of any subject or any course of study not included in the Departmental syllabus.
7. The Principal of each school, the senior permanent teaching staff, such as heads of departments, and such permanent assistant teachers as the Minister may direct, shall be appointed by the Public Service Commissioner under the provisions of the Public Service Act. Such officers may, subject to approval of the Governor in Council, be permitted to engage in such private practice as will not, in the opinion of the Council of the school, interfere with the work carried on in the school.
8. There shall be a committee consisting of three representatives of the University nominated by the University Council and three representatives of the Technical Schools, nominated by the Minister of Public Instruction, with the Chief Inspector of Technical Education as Chairman, whose duties shall be to:—
- (a) enquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction concerning all appointments of Senior Instructors for pure and applied science;
- (b) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction concerning the appointments of Examiners for pure and applied science;
- (c) modify, alter, and approve of courses of instruction for pure and applied science;
- (d) enquire into the curriculum, staffing, equipment, of any Technical School desirous of obtaining recognition by the University, and to make recommendations to the Professorial Board;
- (e) enquire into and report to the Professorial Board on any applications from students desirous of receiving University recognition for subjects passed in at Technical Schools;
- (f) make recommendations to the Professorial Board as to what remission, if any, of subjects may be granted to Technical School students desirous of proceeding to the University;
- (g) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction relative to the salaries to be paid to heads of departments and Senior full-time Science Instructors in Technical Schools;
- (h) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction relative to the Science Departments in Technical Schools.
9. There shall be a committee appointed by the Governor in Council consisting of two representatives of the Art and Trade sections of the Technical Schools, one representative of applied Art, and one of Trade, not in the employ of any State Department, the Art Inspector of the Education Department, and the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as Chairman, whose duties shall be to:—
- (a) enquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction concerning all appointments of Senior Instructors in Art or Trade subjects;
- (b) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction concerning the appointments of examiners for Art and Trade subjects;
- (c) modify, alter, and approve of courses of instruction for Art and Trade subjects;
- (d) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction relative to the salaries to be paid to the heads of departments and Senior full-time Art and Trade Instructors in Technical Schools;
- (e) make recommendations to the Minister of Public Instruction relative to the establishment of departments in Technical Schools;
- (f) consult where necessary with representatives of industrial subjects before fixing any course of work.
10. The whole of the departments in any school shall be under the supervision of a Principal, who shall, where practicable, be head of one department. The Principal will be responsible for the discipline within the school, the efficient organization of departments, classes, time table, and the exercise of general supervision over the staff and employes of the school.
11. Departments shall be created by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of the Advisory Committees appointed to deal with such questions.
12. Each head of a department shall be responsible for the efficient administration of his department, and shall undertake the teaching of such subjects as may be agreed upon by the Principal and the Inspectors of Technical Schools.
13. The Technical Schools Advisory Committees shall consider each case of heads of departments and instructors, and will recommend to the Minister of Public Instruction at what rate each should be paid.
14. Sanction will not be given for the teaching of any approved subject in a Technical School unless the Minister of Public Instruction is satisfied that a teacher is competent to give instruction in that subject.
15. No appointments of teachers are to be made unless the approval of the Minister shall have been first obtained.
16. All Technical Schools shall be open to inspection by any officer appointed for the purpose by the Minister of Public Instruction. Such officers shall include auditors appointed by the Governor in Council, Inspectors and Examiners of Technical Schools. Should an adverse report be received from such officer, the grant-in-aid may be partly or wholly withdrawn.
17. Accounts shall be kept in all schools showing the receipts under the heads of:—
- (a) students' fees—separately for Science, Art, Trade, Commercial, and Household subjects as far as possible for each class held in the school;
- (b) donations and subscriptions;
- (c) Government grants;
- (d) all other receipts;
- and the expenditure under the heads of payment:—
- (a) to instructors, specifying the actual amount paid to each during the year;
- (b) for clerical assistance, with names of recipients and the amounts paid to them;
- (c) for apparatus and repairs, specifying whether for science, art, trade, commercial, or household subjects;
- (d) for students' material in science, art, trade, commercial, or household subjects;
- (e) lighting, cleaning, and fuel;
- (f) printing and advertising;
- (g) other expenses in full detail.
- An annual balance-sheet shall be submitted by each school to the Director of Education not later than the 31st January in each year, showing the receipts and expenditure under the above heads. The Minister may at any time authorize any person to audit the accounts of any of the schools subsidized under these Regulations.
18. Annual grants for maintenance, subject to the conditions specified in these Regulations, will be made to such of the undermentioned Technical Schools as may be brought under the provisions of sections 37 and 38 of Act No. 2301.

19. Technical Schools will be classified in accordance with—
- (1) The average terminal attendances.
- (2) The nature and grade of the work done.
- (3) The reports of inspectors and examiners.
- The syllabus of work done at each school must be approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction, and may include pure and applied science, pure and applied art, or subjects pertaining to engineering, mining, agricultural, industrial, trade, commercial, or household education.
- Schools will be distinguished as science, art, trade, commercial, or household schools. Each school may give instruction in one or more of the foregoing branches of technical work.

After the year 1912, the following individual average terminal attendances will be necessary for a school to be placed in each class:—

22. The course of study in each subject taught in Technical Schools under these Regulations shall be defined by a syllabus approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction.

23. Examinations in the subjects mentioned in Regulation 7, or in any subject added with the approval of the Minister to those therein mentioned, will be held in the months of November and December of each year, or at such other times as may be deemed expedient, by examiners appointed by the Minister of Public Instruction.

24. Should the examiners' reports show that the teaching during the year has been of an unsatisfactory character, the grant-in-aid is liable to be partially or wholly discontinued.

25. In those subjects of List B which are preceded by an asterisk (*), and in all the subjects of List D, the year's school work of the students must be retained in the school for examination.

In all modelled work executed in connexion with the subjects of List D, one example only of each student's work, in each subject, need be retained. Such representative works, if executed in clay, must always be cast in plaster.

All work retained under this regulation must be legibly and indelibly dated.

26. (a) Successful candidates at examination will be classified as follows:—

List A. (Ordinary examinations in all grades).—
Passed, or passed with credit.

A special examination paper (or additional questions on the ordinary paper) will be set for "Honours" in the final grade of the following subjects:—

Euclid.	Assaying.
Algebra.	Metallurgy.
Trigonometry.	Geology.

Candidates will be allowed to enter either for "Pass" or "Honours" (not both); but if a candidate who works a special "Honour" paper falls below the standard required for "Honours," the Examiner will decide whether the marks gained are sufficient to entitle him to a "Pass."

In Assaying, candidates for "Honours," in addition to the written work and the practical tests set at the ordinary examination, will be required to submit themselves to a special practical examination, either at their own schools or in Melbourne at a laboratory to be named by the examiner.

List B. Passed, or passed with credit.

List D. Passed, or passed with credit; and, in Design, Honours.

(b) A student recorded as "passed" at the examination in any grade of a subject may, at the next succeeding examination, present himself for the higher qualification.

27. (a) In the subjects of the General Syllabus of Examinations, it is expected that students should take up the several grades in the order therein set forth. The Pass, Credit, or Honours in the higher grades of each subject will not, therefore, be awarded to any candidate until he has given evidence of satisfactory proficiency in the preceding grade or grades.

An exception to this rule is made in the subject of Perspective, List D. (See General Syllabus of Examinations—Art Subjects.)

(b) In the subjects of List A, candidates, as a rule, will not be allowed to present themselves for more grades than one of a subject at each annual examination. A student, however, who fails in the elementary or intermediate grade of a subject may be examined in that and also in the next higher grade at a subsequent annual examination. If it is desired that other students may be examined in more grades than one of a subject at the same annual examination, special application must be made to the registrar of the school, giving reasons for the request in the case of each student named, at least three months before the commencement of the annual examinations.

28. Students must have recorded at least fourteen attendances during the year to be eligible for examinations in the subjects in which yearly examinations are held; in the subjects examined half-yearly, students must have recorded seven attendances during the half-year preceding the examination; in the single subjects of List D, such as Geometry, Architecture, or Woodcarving, students must

have recorded at least fourteen attendances in each; and in grouped subjects, such as Drawing, Painting, or Modelling Ornament, candidates must have recorded twenty attendances in the group during the year to be eligible for examination. (See p. 30, General Syllabus of Examinations—Art Subjects.)

29. (a) Certificates will be issued by the Department to candidates for the particular subject in which they may be successful at the Department's examinations held under these Regulations. No certificate will be issued for any subject of List B until the student has passed in the final grade. A small charge will be made for these certificates.

ELEMENTARY TECHNICAL ART CERTIFICATE.

(b) A special group certificate will be issued to candidates who succeed in passing in the following subjects of List D:—

1. Geometrical Drawing (Art). GA.
2. Elementary Perspective. P.
3. Drawing from a Flat Example, Advanced Stage—OL.
4. Drawing with the Brush—OW1 and 4, LNW1 or 3 and 4.
5. Drawing from Models or Objects—OL2A.
6. Drawing Ornament from the Cast—OL2B.
7. Drawing in Light and Shade from a Cast—OS2.
8. Drawing Plant Forms from Nature—LN3.
9. Drawing Plant Forms from Memory—LN3M.

11. Elementary Design.
12. Architecture and Architectural Drawing—Grades I. and II., or Drawing for Builders and Artisans.

NOTE.—This certificate will not be issued in respect to any examinations in the above subjects held prior to the year 1904.

30. Any person not being a student in a Technical School may, upon the payment of a fee of 10s. for each subject, be examined in, and, if successful, receive a certificate for, such subject.

The regulation for the payment of the above fee will be waived in the case of State-school teachers who desire to be examined in any of the subjects of Lists A or D, required for teachers' certificates under Regulation XI.—Examination and Classification of Teachers.

31. The expenditure of grants-in-aid of buildings is subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) That the plans and specifications are approved by the Department before the commencement of the work, and that 25 per cent. of the grant be retained until the work has been passed by the Public Works Department.
- (b) Grants for the purchase of books, furniture, and apparatus may be made by the Department at a rate of not more than two-thirds of the amount to be expended. Grants for the purchase of museum specimens at the rate of not more than half the amount to be expended may be made by the Department. No grant, however, for such purposes will be made unless plans and specifications of furniture and details and estimated cost of apparatus or specimens be first submitted to the Department for the approval of the Minister.

32. The Minister of Public Instruction may sanction the establishment of Junior Technical Schools or Preparatory Trade Schools for technical students, either in conjunction with or apart from Technical Schools now in existence.

33. The courses of study in each Junior Technical School, the qualifications for entrance and conditions with regard to fees and scholarships shall appear in a prospectus of each school. The prospectus must be approved by the Director of Education, and must be issued annually before the fifteenth day of December.

34. Each Technical School shall provide scholarships, the number and character of which must be approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction.

35. Each school shall admit, without fee, any scholarship holder from a Junior Technical School or State-aided institution, or any student nominated by the Minister of Public Instruction.

36. Where any High School or any Higher Elementary School has been established in the same district as a Technical School, the members of the staff of the Technical School, provided, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Technical Education, their time is not fully occupied, may be called upon to devote not more than one-third of their time to the teaching of such subjects in the High School or Higher Elementary School as may be determined by the Chief Inspector of Technical Education.

The principal of a Technical School may utilize the services of the staff of a High School or Higher Elementary School for the teaching of such subjects as may be agreed upon by the head master of the High School and the Chief Inspector of Technical Education.

DIPLOMAS.—CERTIFIED SCIENCE SCHOOLS.

37. The Department will grant diplomas to students who have completed full courses, and passed the required examinations in Metallurgy, Mining Engineering, &c., at a Certified Science School. These diplomas will be indorsed with the name of the school at which the student has been educated. Students to whom State-school exhibitions are awarded will be allowed to attend courses for diplomas at Certified Science Schools.

The following conditions must be fulfilled in order that a school may be recognised by the Department as a Certified Science School:—

- (a) That the school is regarded by the Department as suitable for the training of students in specified science courses.
- (b) That the regulations framed by the Council of the school for the instruction and general management of these course classes are approved of by the Department.

NOTE.—Under (b) are included the standard of education required for admission to the courses, the subjects and grades of subjects prescribed for the several years of a course, time-tables, &c.

REGISTERS.

38. (a) A General Register must be kept in each school, in which must be entered the register number, name, age, and occupation (if any) of each student, class or classes in which enrolled, and date of passing any examination of the Education Department held under these Regulations. The instructions issued by the Department for keeping this Register must be strictly adhered to.

(b) A register of the students' attendances must be kept, and must be correctly posted up daily, in accordance with the instructions issued by the Department.

(c) A fee-book, in which all fees paid by students are to be inserted, must also be kept.

(d) All Attendance Registers in use during the year must be forwarded to the Department within seven days after the closing of the fourth term. These Registers will be retained by the Department.

39. An abstract, showing the number of the term attendances of all students enrolled in the several classes and grades of classes, or, in the case of List D, the attendances of students in subjects and groups of subjects, must be forwarded to the Secretary, Education Department, not later than seven days after the close of each term.

40. An annual return must be submitted by each school to the Secretary, Education Department, not later than the 31st January in each year, giving—

- (1) The number of individual students (male and female separately) on the roll for the year.
- (2) The number of students who have attended seven times or more during the fourth term of the year.
- (3) The maximum and minimum fee paid by students.
- (4) The number of (a) artisans, (b) apprentices, (c) those attending State or private schools on the rolls for the year.
- (5) Number of teachers.

41. There shall be four terms in each year, each of not less than ten weeks' duration.

GENERAL.

42. A copy of the time-table for each term shall be forwarded to the Department not later than three weeks after the commencement of each term.

43. No portion of the annual grants for maintenance, nor any portion of the fees paid by students for tuition in subjects subsidized under these Regulations, is to be paid by Councils of schools for the maintenance of classes in subjects other than those mentioned under Regulation 7, or subjects otherwise approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction. Any infringement of this regulation will render a school liable to the withdrawal of the whole or a part of the grant-in-aid.

44. The expenditure necessary for examinations in connexion with these schools shall be a charge on the vote for Technical Schools.

45. Each Technical Art School, subsidized by this Department, and giving instruction in subjects included in Lists B and D, shall be open for instructional purposes for not less than 20 hours per week. Classes shall be held at least three evenings each week for two hours each evening, and for at least four hours on each Saturday during each school term.

Reasonable facilities should be afforded both day and evening students for practice in the school outside of class hours.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

LIFT REGULATIONS.

At State Government House, Melbourne, the
second day of July, 1912.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Mr. Billson | Mr. Hagelthorn.

WHEREAS by the *Lifts Regulation Act 1906* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this order repeal the Regulations made on the 10th June, 1911, and doth make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

(1) Parts II., III., IV., and V. of these Regulations shall apply to—

- (a) All lifts erected after the 1st day of July, 1912.
(b) All lifts which after the 1st day of July, 1912, are re-constructed or materially altered.

(c) Every part of any lift which requires renewal after the 1st day of July, 1912.

(2) Parts I. and VI. of these Regulations shall apply to all lifts in use on and after the first day of July, 1912.

PART I.

(3) All work done and all machines, apparatus, and material used in connexion with any lift shall be subject to the final approval of the Inspector, who shall, as often as appears to him necessary, inspect and test every lift and part.

(4) In these Regulations the word "Inspector" wherever used shall be taken to mean the Chief Inspector of Factories.

(5) No lift which comprises a platform or car shall be erected in such a position as will leave a road for persons to pass under the platform or car.

(6) No lift shall be erected, re-erected, or materially altered unless a permit, in the form A annexed, has first been obtained from the Inspector.

(7) Every applicant for such permit shall file at the Factories Office complete plans, drawings, and specifications, showing correct measurements and describing fully the whole machine and its position in the building, unless only alterations are intended, in which case it will be sufficient if the alterations are described.

(8) Before granting such permit the Inspector may require any alterations in design to be made which appear to him to be necessary for the safe working of the lift, and may, upon being satisfied, grant such permit.

PART II.

GENERAL RULES APPLYING TO ALL LIFTS.

Lubrication.

(9) Every lift shall be provided with efficient means for lubricating all working parts.

(10) Every lift shall be provided with a proper platform hand-rail and ladder to enable the attendant to oil and attend to all parts of the machinery without risk of accident.

Overhead Construction.

(11) All overhead construction shall be of sufficient strength and stability to bear at least four times the load to be put upon it.

(12) All overhead gear shall be supported on steel joists.

(13) In the well, immediately under the overhead sheaves, of any suspended lift there shall be built a substantial platform or grating with means of access from outside the well.

Guides.

(14) All guides, whether for cars or for counter weights, shall be of steel.

Enclosures, Doors, and Gates.

(15) All enclosures, doors, and gates shall be made, where possible, at least 5 feet 6 inches in height.

(16) The Inspector may, wherever he considers it necessary, order the whole or any part of the machinery and lift well to be enclosed.

(17) The lift well of any passenger or goods lift shall, on any side in which there is a car entrance, be without projection and (doorways excepted) be enclosed throughout the travel of the car.

Roof to Car.

(18) All lifts (other than goods lifts carrying less than 3 cwt.) shall have a substantial roof fitted to the car.

Lifting Ropes.

(19) Every suspended lift (other than a whip or crane or goods lift to carry less than 3 cwt.), shall be provided with at least four metallic lifting ropes. Provided that all lifts registered and running on 1st July, 1912, with only two lifting ropes shall be allowed to continue without extra ropes.

(20) When the number is four, each such rope, when new, shall have a breaking strain of at least five times the maximum load and weight of the car.

(21) When the number is more than four, such ropes, when new, shall have a breaking strain of at least twenty times the maximum load and weight of the car.

(22) In the case of whips or cranes, or goods lifts carrying less than 3 cwt., where one rope only is provided, such rope, when new, shall have a breaking strain of at least ten times the maximum load to be carried.

(23) All balance-weight ropes shall have a proportion of strength to load similar to that of the lift in each case.

(24) The method of binding all lifting ropes and balance-weight ropes around eyes shall be by splicing only.

Diameter of Pulleys, Drums, and Sheaves.

(25) The minimum ratio of the diameter of any pulley, drum, or sheave to the diameter of the rope wound on it, shall be as under:—

- For power driven lifts carrying 3 cwt. or over, 45 to 1.
For power driven lifts carrying less than 3 cwt., and for whips or cranes, 14 to 1.
For hand-power lifts, 8 to 1.

Factor of Safety of Suspended Lifts.

(26) Every part (other than a lifting or balance-weight rope) of a suspended lift shall, when new, have a breaking strain of at least the following proportions:—

Where material used is cast-iron, at least ten times the maximum strain to be put upon it.

Where material used is wood, at least eight times the maximum strain to be put upon it.

Where material used is wrought-iron, brass, or steel, at least five times the maximum strain to be put upon it.

Speed.

(27) No lift shall be so constructed as to be capable of being driven at a speed exceeding 200 feet in a minute.

Lighting of Lift Wells.

(28) Every lift well shall be so lighted as not to endanger the safety of persons using or operating the lift. The Inspector may, if he considers the lighting insufficient, order suitable lighting to be provided.

Whip Hatches.

(29) All whip hatches on floors to or from which goods are delivered or discharged shall be provided with flaps or rolling platforms, or other suitable contrivance.

Safety Gear.

(30) All lifts, excepting direct acting ram lifts, parcels lifts, and dinner lifts, shall be provided with efficient safety gear. Such gear must be automatic and positive in action.

(31) The Inspector may in any case where, on inquiry, he is satisfied such should be done, exempt from the operation of this section any carriage lift.

(32) The Inspector may at any time test any safety gear, and may, if he choose, do so in the following manner:—
The car shall be fully loaded, raised to any height he directs, and suspended by hempen rope. The lifting ropes shall be either detached or slackened sufficiently. The hempen rope shall then be cut.

Notice as to Load, &c.

(33) Every passenger lift shall have a prominent notice stating the maximum number of passengers allowed, and such number of passengers shall not at any time be exceeded.

(34) Every goods lift shall have a prominent notice stating—

- (a) The maximum load of such lift.
(b) That no person, other than the lift attendant and the person attending to the goods, shall be permitted in the lift car at any time.

(35) Such load shall not at any time be exceeded, nor shall any person, other than the lift attendant and the person attending to the goods, be permitted in the lift car.

Doors.

(36) Doors of such construction that it will be impossible to open them from the outside without a key (which must not at any time be left in the door) shall be fitted to all entrances to every passenger lift, with the exception

of automatic lifts. On passenger lifts where the car has one entrance only the door may be omitted if, in the opinion of the Inspector, the lift well is so constructed that the omission of the door would not endanger life and limb.

Signal Bells.

(37) Signal bells, or similar apparatus, which may be operated from any floor, and which work in conjunction with an indicator in the car, shall be provided on all passenger lifts.

Automatic Gate-closing Gear.

(38) Every goods lift shall be provided with gear which, on the car leaving any floor, automatically closes the door or gate at that floor.

Maintenance of Lifts.

(39) All lifts shall be maintained in conformity with the Regulations, and in proper working condition.

(40) All damaged or broken enclosures, gates, or fastenings shall be at once repaired.

(41) All safety gears shall be kept in full working order.

(42) All parts of lift and safety gear shall be kept clean and free from accumulations of rubbish, dust, and dirt, to the approval of the Inspector.

(43) All hydraulic lifts shall have the ram kept in such condition that the gland does not allow water to pass. This is to be effected without unduly pinching the ram.

(44) All controlling mechanism must be kept in such condition that creeping is impossible.

(45) All controlling, lifting, or balance-weight ropes that show indications of excessive wear, splintering, stranding, or bunching must be at once discarded and replaced by new ropes.

Inspection of Lifts.

(46) Every lift shall be inspected at least once in each year, and the owners of, or persons using, such lift shall take all necessary measures to facilitate any inspection.

(47) If the Inspector considers that everything is satisfactory, he shall issue a certificate to that effect.

PART III.

Hydraulic Lifts.

(48) All cylinders, rams, pipes, valves, or other apparatus subject to hydraulic pressure, shall be tested to three times the proposed working pressure per square inch, and a certificate, under the maker's hand, that they have been successfully tested, to stand that pressure, shall be furnished to the Inspector before they are put into use.

(49) The whole of the above machinery shall be tested to twice the working pressure in the presence of the Inspector after erection and before being used.

(50) When any material alteration, addition to, or reinstatement of existing machinery or pipes, is made, a similar test shall be made in the presence of the Inspector before use.

(51) To prevent overrunning, all hydraulic machinery having rams working in cylinders shall, in addition to valves or tappet gear, be provided with permanent stops (or other approved means) by which the rams will be prevented from being forced out of the cylinders.

(52) An independent screw-down pressure stop valve and exhaust cock shall be fitted to every machine.

(53) A back-pressure valve, non-return valve, or other similar apparatus of approved kind, shall be fitted to every service-pipe. This valve shall be placed as close to the controlling valve as possible.

(54) In low pressure lifts a relief valve, loaded to lift when the pressure in the service-pipe exceeds 10 per cent. increase of pressure over the ordinary working pressure, shall be fitted, in all cases, where the service-pipe exceeds one inch in diameter.

(55) All hydraulic cylinders shall be fitted with air and drain pipes.

(56) Ample provision shall be made so that cylinders can be efficiently drained and washed out. Means shall also be provided for preventing water syphoning out of cylinders.

(57) Only piping made specially for hydraulic pressures shall be used; ordinary steam or water piping will not be allowed for pressure work. Standard flanges shall be screwed on and seated for jointing material. A tee piece shall be provided for testing purposes if required by the Inspector.

(58) No direct acting lift shall be fitted with flying balance-weights unless the ram of such lift is fitted with one or more tie-bolts carried from the bottom of the ram to the girders of the car platform. All hydraulic and other types of balance to be approved by the Inspector.

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(59) The controlling valve must be of an efficient type, and tested, and shall cut off automatically at either limit of travel. The valve must also be made to shut off the water in the case of breakage of the hand-line. Provision must be made to prevent any material passing to the plunger and jamming in the holes thereof. Provision shall also be made that will preclude any possibility of the plunger blowing out, should it become parted.

PART IV.

Electric Lifts.

(60) The location of the electric apparatus shall be such that it shall not be subject to moisture or dampness of any description.

(61) The whole of the electrical attachments and apparatus shall be entirely and thoroughly insulated from body or earth in an efficient manner.

(62) Electrical tests effected and approved by the Electrical Inspectors of the Melbourne City Council, or of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, shall be deemed sufficient and satisfactory.

(63) The supply main shall be suitably insulated and fixed, and shall be of sufficient sectional area to carry the maximum current permissible under the rules of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria.

(64) The whole of the machinery and apparatus intended for use shall be seen and tested by the Inspector before it is put into use.

(65) At the nearest point of entrance to the building the supply mains shall be connected to suitable and efficient double pole fuses or circuit breakers, and also a double pole quick break switch.

(66) The said double pole fuses or circuit breakers shall be accurate, and shall be such that the circuit shall be broken should the current exceed the normal carrying capacity of the main cables by 50 per cent.

(67) Sufficient space for the over-running of the cage shall be provided at the top and bottom of the lift well at the approval of the Inspector, and such space at the top shall be not less than 3 feet, measuring from the top of the car beam to the underside of the overhead girders or ceiling joists.

(68) An automatic stop, which will instantly break the circuit should the over-run of the car exceed 12 inches, shall be fitted to every goods or passenger lift. This stop must be operated by the car.

(69) All electric lifting apparatus shall be provided with limit stops, or other approved means, to prevent over-winding. These stops must be attached to the lift machine in drum-winding gears, and must operate by the car in friction-driven gears.

(70) The electrical controlling gear must be of an efficient type, and shall automatically slow down and cut off at either limit of travel. It must operate in a satisfactory manner without causing excessive strain in any part of the apparatus. The electric controls must so operate as to obviate any excessive and deleterious sparking, and must be provided with locks or other means that will hold the controls in the "stop" position.

(71) All drums of electric lifts shall either be grooved so as to conveniently embrace the lifting ropes, or be arranged so as to prevent any over-riding or jamming of such ropes.

(72) In positively-driven gear, with the ropes permanently attached to the drum, the anchoring of the ropes shall be performed in an efficient manner, and shall be such that not less than one and a half turns of each rope shall be round the drum when the lift cage is at the top or bottom limit.

(73) All drum-driven lifts shall be fitted with an automatic device so arranged that should the lifting ropes from any cause whatsoever become slack the current shall be immediately and automatically cut off.

(74) All counter-balance weights must be landed as the Inspector may direct.

(75) All lift machines shall be provided with an efficient brake gear, operated in a manner approved by the Inspector.

(76) Suitable buffer springs must be provided, to come into operation if the lift over-runs more than three inches. These springs must be capable of stopping the lift from full speed at full load without exceeding their safe working deflection.

PART V.

Belt-driven or other Power Lifts.

(77) Every belt-driven or other power lift shall be fitted with efficient brake gear, to operate on the worm shaft automatically, when the machine is stopped. Where the angle of any worm is more than the angle of reversibility, efficient provision shall be made to prevent rotation, so

that any tendency of the car to descend, except under power, is obviated. Two limit stops shall be provided, one controlled by the hand rope, and one an integral part of the lift gear.

(78) The use of direct spur-gearing or direct friction drive shall not be allowed where it is intended that an attendant or passengers are to travel in the car.

(79) The striking or reversing gear shall operate by means of one hand rope or rod, and shall be such as to preclude any possibility of two belts being on the fast pulley simultaneously. Provision shall be made for maintaining the belts in their several proper positions.

(80) Every drum-winding lift in which any person travels shall be provided with gear, so that, should the lifting ropes by any means become slack, the machine shall automatically stop.

PART VI.

Fees.

(81) The owner, lessee, or occupier of any building in or in connexion with which there is a lift in use shall, on the 1st day of July in each year, or on the day such lift first comes into use, pay to the Inspector for inspection and certificate of inspection—

For each lift (mechanical power), 12s. 6d.
For each lift (hand power), 7s. 6d.

(82) In the case of a lift which comes into use after the first day of January in any year, the fee shall be half the above rates.

(83) No person shall be called upon to pay more than £5 in respect of any number of lifts within one enclosure for any period of twelve months.

SHIRE OF MINHAMITE.

BY-LAW NO. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Minhamite, made under sections 197 and 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 9, for regulating the conditions under which “Cattle” may be driven on to any street or road for the purpose of grazing thereon with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Minhamite order as follows:—

1. That any ratepayer shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number not exceeding two head of horned cattle and two head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause No. 7 hereof.

2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the Schedule hereunder supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the *bona fides* of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such form shall specify (*inter alia*) the particulars, descriptions, and brands, or apparent brands and marks, age and sex, of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads and reserves on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve of the application it shall issue a permit or licence in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges or fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be:—

- (A) For each horse above the age of six months—Three shillings per quarter.
- (B) For each head of cattle above the age of six months—Two shillings per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the Secretary of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

8. Fees payable under permits to register granted during the currency of a quarter shall be apportioned according to the unexpired term of that quarter.

9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

10. The Council shall have a discretion as to the number of cattle and horses which each applicant will be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, and to graze upon such roads, streets, or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the number to be grazed in any quarter.

11. No person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any street, road, or reserve in the Shire of Minhamite, and any such animal found upon any road, street, or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, and the owner of any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road, street, or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law will be prosecuted.

12. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss or theft or death or for any injury or damage to or straying of any cattle or horse grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly upon the conditions herein contained.

13. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration to that effect.

14. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

15. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of *Police Offences Act 1890*, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of any animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any street or road, or by any other person, nor for any damages, costs, or expenses whatsoever to be incurred or recovered by any person by reason of such cattle being upon such roads or reserves.

16. The Council may issue a tag for each animal registered hereunder, but such tag shall at all times remain the absolute property of the Council.

17. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the Secretary of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal of any registered animal, and in case of sale of the name and address of the purchaser.

18. The Council shall have the power to terminate the permission to graze any animal of the applicant at the end of the current quarter if reported by the herdsman to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if feed or water becomes scarce or insufficient, or for any other reason which may appear sufficient to the Council in its absolute discretion.

19. Every animal registered hereunder shall, by the owner thereof, be removed from the said roads before sunset, and shall be kept removed therefrom until sunrise on the following day.

20. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the North-Eastern and South-Eastern Ridings of the Shire of Minhamite.
