REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C. D. was engaged.]

Date.)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that

State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

Municipal Grounds Act 1905.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW NO. 22.

A By-law of the Shire of Nunawading made under section 197, sub-section (7), and section 222 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, and numbered 22, for preserving good order and decency in that part of Surrey Park at Box Hill known as the "Dive," including any building used in connexion with the said "Dive," and preventing damage to such building, or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein, and for the management and use of the said "Dive" baths, buildings, furniture, fittings, or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, and for imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

(a) The word "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Nunawading. The word "baths" shall mean and include the swimming bath at the "Dive," and all plunge, shower, and other baths in or on the premises. The words "Officer-in-Charge" shall mean and include the Council's employé or employés in charge of the premises, or any person or persons authorized by resolution of the Council to be in charge. The words "Local Club" shall mean any swimming club for the time being renting the "Dive" or having a lease thereof, or authorized by a resolution of the Council to occupy the same.

2. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the baths, dressing rooms, closets, showers, compartments, or appurtenances, and shall not damage, deface, write upon, or cut any parts of the baths, fittings, or buildings whatever.

3. No person shall—

- (a) Climb or attempt to climb on any roof, fence or other portion of the premises, except such portion as shall be lawfully set aside for entering or leaving the water.
- (b) Enter or remain on the premises whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, or offensive manner.
- (d) Use indecent or offensive language.
- (e) Use any portion of the baths whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease.
- (f) Willfully or improperly foul or pollute the water of the baths or soil or denle any towel, bathing dress, dressing-room, stage landing, or any portion of the baths.
- (g) Carelessly or negligently break or injure, or improperly interfere with, any portion of the bath's furniture, fittings, showers, or conveniences thereof or therein.
- (h) Offer any article for sale on the premises, or bring any intoxicating liquor on the premises, without, in either case, the consent of the Council.
- (i) Bring, cause, or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain on the premises.
- (j) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the premises.

4. Any person finding any article which may have been left or lost in any part of the premises shall immediately deliver the same to any officer in charge.

5. The Council reserves to itself the right of closing the premises for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

6. For the purpose of maintaining good order any officer in charge may refuse admission to the premises to any person.

7. Any person using the swimming bath must wear proper bathing dress, covering the body from neck to knee.

8. No person shall at any time whilst in the swimming bath use any soap or any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

9. No person shall bathe in the swimming bath other than—

- (a) Members of the Local Club for the time being entitled to occupy the "Dive"; or
- (b) Members of a swimming club officially recognised by such local club as an associated club when such members are authorized to so bathe by rule or resolution of the said local club, or are duly invited so to do by or on behalf thereof; or
- (c) Persons who are duly invited so to do by or on behalf of such local club; or
- (d) Persons who are authorized to so bathe or to enter in or on the premises by resolution or invitation of the Council.

10. No carnival or aquatic display shall be held at the "Dive" without the consent of the Council, nor shall fees for admission to the "Dive" on days on which carnivals or aquatic displays are held be charged without the consent of the Council.

11. No person shall swim or dive in the swimming bath after nightfall unless the same is lighted to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer.

12. No person, other than members of the Council, its officers, servant, or workmen, or other than persons mentioned in sub-clauses (a) to (d), both inclusive, of clause 9 hereof, shall be allowed on the premises except on days on which carnivals or aquatic displays are held, and then only after having paid the fee, if any, fixed for admission.

13. Every club authorized by the Council to occupy the premises, or any part thereof, shall pay to the Council, or its authorized officer, such charges as the Council shall from time to time appoint.

14. Any police constable, councillor, officer, employe of the Council, or officer in charge, shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under this By-law) to remove any person from the "Dive" who commits a breach of this By-law, or who willfully damages any of the appliances or any property thereat.

15. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the municipal district within the Surrey Park at Box Hill known as the "Dive."

BY-LAW NO. 356.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.—MERBEIN IRRIGATION AREA.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by Part II. of the *Murray Settlements Act 1907*, No. 2123, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in Merbein Irrigation Area.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be, and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 15th day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1913) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 15th day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1913) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, and the charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during any period other than the period herein specified, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

7. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an Irrigation Charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the Area in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission at Merbein fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner, as the Commission may direct.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the Area, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law or any By-law making an Irrigation Charge, a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 15th day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1913) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the Irrigation Charge for such period, and if a

supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 15th day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1913) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, and the charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during any period other than the period herein specified, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

7. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an Irrigation Charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the Area in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a Water Right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission at Swan Hill fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the Area, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 7.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street where in a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid, or where houses or tenements, if not fronting such a street, are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10), the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the £1 on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1914, and shall be payable on 1st January, 1914.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust district, shall be by measurement or by special agreement.

9. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust may make a special agreement, and may make a reduction to not less than 9d. per 1,000 gallons.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in previous clauses the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement, or under special agreement, must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also refers to the Freezing Works.

11. Excess water shall be charged at the rate of 9d. per 1,000 gallons.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2.
