COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS AND FOR THE ADMISSION OF SUCH CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE.

The Fourth day of September, 1913.

IN pursuance of the authority conferred by the *Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act 1903* the Council of Legal Education hereby makes the following Rules relating to the qualification of candidates to practise as Barristers and Solicitors and for the admission of such candidates to practise in Victoria, that is to say:—

1. In Rule 3 of Part I. of the Rules of the said Council dated the 16th day of February, 1905, after the word "herein" the words "or by any subsequent Rules of such Council" shall be inserted.

2. "Managing Clerk" means any person who for a term of not less than:—

(a) 10 years (if he has passed in the subject of English at any public examination of the University of Melbourne or any substantially equivalent examination of that or any other University or teaching or examining authority or body or has satisfied the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria that his educational acquirements in English are equal to the standard of such public examination); or

(b) 5 years (if before the commencement of such term he has completed in the office of any barrister and solicitor practising in Victoria a term of clerkship of not less than 10 years and if he has passed in the subject or satisfied the said Council of the Law Institute as last aforesaid); or

(c) 5 years (if before the commencement of such term he has completed as aforesaid a term of clerkship of not less than 5 years and if he has passed the Junior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne or any substantially equivalent examination of that or any other University or teaching or examining authority or body); or

(d) 3 years (if before the commencement of such term he has completed as aforesaid a term of clerkship of not less than 5 years and if he has passed the Senior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne or any other substantially equivalent examination of that or any other University or teaching or examining authority or body);

has as clerk to and under the immediate direction and supervision of a barrister and solicitor practising in Victoria directed not less than one other clerk (not being a typist or office boy or messenger) in the employ of such barrister and solicitor and managed:—

- (e) The practice of such barrister and solicitor; or
- (f) The Common Law or Conveyancing Department and in either case any other Department of such practice; or
- (g) The Common Law or Conveyancing Department of such practice in case the transactions of either of such Departments have been of so extensive and varied a character as to have required the whole of his time and attention thereto;

and has obtained the certificate hereinafter referred to:—

Provided:—

- (1) That each such person has not during the term of his management been engaged in any other employment or occupation except with the sanction of a Judge of the Supreme Court which may be granted before, during or after the term of such other employment or occupation; and
- (2) That a Common Law Department must include practice in the Supreme Court or the High Court; and
- (3) That the said respective terms of clerkship and management must be continuous or substantially continuous and may be completed in the office of more than one such barrister and solicitor and either before or after or partly before and partly after the coming into operation of these rules; and
- (4) That for the purposes of the foregoing sub-clause (g) management shall include joint management provided each joint manager claiming the benefit of that sub-clause has (subject to the exception in the foregoing proviso (1)) devoted the whole of his time and attention to the business of the department jointly managed; and
- (5) That any examination hereinbefore required to be passed may be passed either before during or subsequent to any term of clerkship or management.

3. At any time after the expiration of such respective terms of management (but not being more than one year after he has ceased to so manage as aforesaid) any such person may apply to the Council of the said Institute for a certificate that the applicant is a managing clerk: Such application shall be in writing and shall be supported and supplemented by such evidence and information as the Council of the said Institute shall from time to time reasonably require.

4. If the Council of the said Institute shall refuse or within three calendar months shall fail to grant such certificate any such person may within one month after such refusal or failure on notice in writing to the Council of the said Institute apply to the Full Court for a certificate that the applicant is a managing clerk. Such application shall be in the nature of a re-hearing and the Council of the said Institute shall be entitled to be represented thereat.

5. An application to the said Institute or Court for such certificate may be renewed from time to time (at intervals of not less than six months) upon further material.

6. A managing clerk may be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor provided that he has:—

- (a) Filed such certificate with an affidavit of verification in the office of the Prothonotary; and thereafter
- (b) Passed at the annual examinations of the University of Melbourne in manner prescribed herein in the same subjects as are by Rule 5 (b) of Part I. Division I. of the said Rules of the Council of Legal Education required to be passed by persons desirous of being admitted to practise as barristers and solicitors, namely:—

- 1. Law of Property in Land and Conveyancing.
- 2. Law of Contract and Personal Property.
- 3. Constitutional History and Law Part II.
- 4. Private International Law.
- 5. Administrative Law.
- 6. Equity.
- 7. Law of Wrongs (Civil and Criminal).
- 8. Law of Procedure and Evidence.
- 9. Constitutional History and Law, Part III. (Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia).

But for the purposes of this Rule:—

- (a) No managing clerk may present himself for examination in Equity unless he has passed in the Law of Property and Conveyancing at an examination held not less than six months previously; and

(b) No managing clerk (unless he requires one subject only to complete his course) shall be entitled to credit for any subject passed at any examination unless he has passed thereat in two subjects at least; and

(c) A supplementary examination at the University shall be deemed to be not a part of the preceding examination.

7. Part II. of the said Rules of the Council of Legal Education (as amended by the Rules of the 28th day of November, 1905), shall (except so far as such rules relate to service under articles) apply to persons proceeding for admission under these present Rules.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Pilot Regulations 1911" made by the Board on the fifteenth day of September, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1911, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on which date paragraphs 116 and 117 of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraphs, namely:—

116. *Qualifications for Certificates of Competency to Masters of Vessels to Act as Pilots of Ships they Command within the Ports of Victoria.*—The master or chief officer, the latter being the holder of a certificate of competency or service as a master, of any ship employed in coasting only, or actually trading between any port of Victoria, and of New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania, New Zealand, Fiji, Western and South Australia, or the master or chief officer, the latter being the holder of a certificate of competency or service as a master, of any ship registered and owned in Victoria, desirous of obtaining a certificate that he is competent to act as pilot to such ship, must apply to the Board on the form which will be supplied to the applicant by the secretary thereto, and such application must be accompanied by—

(1) The applicant's certificate of competency or service as master, such certificate being a certificate issued by some authority recognised by the Board.

(2) Properly attested testimonials, to the satisfaction of the Board, as to sobriety, experience, ability, and good conduct for (at least) the twelve months immediately preceding the date of application for examination.

(3) Official evidence that he has, whilst on a *bonâ fide* trading voyage from one port in Victoria another port in Victoria or elsewhere (or *vice versa*), either—

(a) Commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues twice in and twice out of Port Phillip Heads, and that whilst in command of any such ship engaged in such voyage he has been once up and once down the entire length of the South and West Channels respectively of Port Phillip; or if desirous of obtaining a certificate restricted to the navigation of one channel only, that he has been once up and once down the entire length of such channel; or

(b) Commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues thrice in and thrice out of Port Phillip Heads, and that whilst in command of any such ship engaged on such voyage he has been three (3) times one way through the South and West Channels respectively of Port Phillip; or if desirous of obtaining a certificate restricted to the navigation of one channel only, that he has been three (3) times one way through such channel; or

(c) Has served as chief officer of such vessel employed in the course of any such

voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, four times in and four times out of Port Phillip Heads, and twice up and twice down the entire length of the South and West Channels respectively of Port Phillip; or if desirous of obtaining a certificate restricted to the navigation of one channel only, that he has been twice up and twice down the entire length of such channel; or

(d) Has served as chief officer of such vessel employed in the course of any such voyage six (6) times in and six (6) times out of Port Phillip Heads, and has been six (6) times one way through the South and West Channels respectively of Port Phillip; or if desirous of obtaining a certificate restricted to the navigation of one channel only, that he has been six (6) times one way through such channel.

Provided that if any applicant be desirous of obtaining an exemption certificate for any port in Victoria other than for the ports of Port Phillip and Melbourne, he shall only be required to produce satisfactory evidence that—

(a) He has commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues, and engaged on a voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, once in and once out of the port for which he desires to obtain an exemption certificate; or that

(b) He has served as chief officer of a like vessel three times in and three times out of such port.

Provided also that should it appear to the Board in any case that the voyage or voyages on which the applicant had served was or were not of a *bonâ fide* trading character, such applicant may be rejected as a candidate.

For the purpose of this Regulation the term "official evidence" shall mean a certificate given by the master of a ship, or by a licensed pilot, or an entry in the ship's log-book.

(4) Any candidate, not being the actual master of a ship, passing the examination for any port, shall not be entitled to receive a pilotage exemption certificate until such time as he shall give satisfactory proof that he is actually the registered master of a ship in respect of which an exemption certificate may be issued.

Provided that if after passing the examination any such candidate fails to comply with the foregoing condition within a period of three (3) years from the date of such examination, he shall be required to again undergo examination for the port or ports for which he desires a pilotage exemption certificate, and in such circumstances the candidate shall be required to pay to the Secretary to the Board, in addition to the fee hereinafter provided, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for such examination, which fee shall be paid into the general revenue.

117. *Extent of Examinations for Port Phillip.*—A pilotage exemption certificate in relation to the port of Port Phillip shall be issued either unrestricted as to the channel to be resorted to for navigation purposes, in which case such certificate shall authorize the master to whom it is issued to act as pilot to the ship concerned up and down either the South Channel or the West Channel indifferently, or the authority conferred by the certificate shall be expressed to be limited to acknowledging the capacity of the master holding the same to act as pilot of the ship concerned only when navigated up or down the particular channel (South or West) named in it, and shall not be read or construed as certifying or intending so to do as to such master's competency to act as a pilot except in respect of the navigation of the ship concerned by the channel named, but a candidate upon presenting himself for examination for an exemption certificate for the port of Port Phillip must at the same time pass for the port of Melbourne including the River Yarra, and should he not be able to do so to the satisfaction of the examiner he will be deemed to have failed in his examination.

The foregoing amended regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this fifth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE YARRAYNE CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE YARRAYNE CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Yarrayne Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept and gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case or on application to this Department.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No tender will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.
3. Tenders must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1913, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1914, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Forests shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown; and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Forests being made known.

SHIRE OF MINHAMITE.

BY-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Minhamite, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections of their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions under which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Minhamite order as follows:—

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,
- (b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such crossbars not exceeding three inches provided in such last-mentioned case,
- (i) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized on that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
- (ii) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine, or any vehicle drawn by it.
- (iii) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of an officer of the Council duly authorized on that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- (iv) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
- (v) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundred-weight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tyre or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankment, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby, to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine begin to skid, and he shall not start the engine until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

10. The Council of the Shire of Minhamite doth hereby define the township of Hawkesdale as defined in proclamation made the thirteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five and any part thereof, and the township of Macarthur as defined by proclamation made the eighteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and any part thereof as populous parts of the shire of Minhamite, and order that sub-section 2 of section 486 of Part 23 of Act No. 1893 (the *Local Government Act 1903*) shall apply to and be in full force in such parts of the shire of Minhamite.

11. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Minhamite.

SHIRE OF MORWELL.

BY-LAW NO. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Morwell made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered nine, for the adoption of clauses 41, 42, and 43 of Part One of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, relating to obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Morwell order as follows:—

41. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them—

(a) In any street, or

(b) Upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act 1890*, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence, the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and impound them or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.

42. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any Justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appears, then as in other cases, and the Justices may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the Justices of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of such cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the Municipal Fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

43. If such cattle, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over to him accordingly, and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered, and if in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating Justice jurisdiction shall apply.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Morwell.

(1) That section 36, Part X. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903* be adopted, viz.:—The owner of every hackney carriage, municipal stage carriage, or other carriage used in plying for hire or passengers, and of every private vehicle and velocipede travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise, shall cause same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage is so used, and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

(2) This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Bruthen Riding of the Shire of Tambo, within and throughout a radius of 3 miles of the Bruthen Post Office.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on 20th October, 1909, and confirmed on 21st December, 1909.

BY-LAW NO. 12.

By-law of the Shire of Upper Yarra made under the provisions of the *Tramways Act* and the *Second Schedule*, clause XIV., and in conformity with Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 12, for preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any premises, appertaining to the Steam Tramway from Yarra Junction up the Little Yarra-road towards the Latrobe Valley, and for regulating within the limits allowed by the Order authorizing the construction of the Tramway, the tolls and charges for using the same.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and the *Tramways Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Upper Yarra order as follows:—

VICTORIAN POWELL WOOD PROCESS LIMITED TRAMWAY.
BY-LAWS.

1. No passenger shall enter at a booking station or travel from any such station in any carriage or other vehicle of the company unless furnished with a pass or ticket entitling him to enter or travel therein. Each passenger on paying the prescribed fare will be furnished with a ticket, and every passenger shall show his pass or ticket to and allow it to be marked by any authorized employé of the company whenever so required by such employé, and the holder of any return ticket shall, if so required, produce the return half on the forward journey. Every pass or ticket, whether single or return, shall be delivered up on demand of any such employé.

Any ticket not used on the day of issue and any return ticket not used within thirty days from the day of issue shall be deemed cancelled.

Any person who shall travel without a proper pass or ticket, or who shall fail or refuse to show or deliver up such pass or ticket upon demand as aforesaid, shall pay the fare from the station whence the tram originally started, and, in addition, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Any person who shall use or attempt to use any pass or ticket in contravention of or be otherwise guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. Tickets are the property of the company and are not transferable.

Any person not duly authorized by the company who shall sell or attempt to sell any pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or who shall use or attempt to use, a transferred pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or a ticket the time for using which has expired, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person who shall travel on such pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket or expired ticket shall, in addition, be liable to pay the fare which he would have been liable to pay for the journey.

3. No ticket whether single or return shall be used by a passenger for a journey other than that between the stations named thereon, and no passenger shall be entitled to re-book or take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. No ticket shall be recognised by any employé of the company unless the number, date, and names of the stations on such ticket are legible. Any person who shall use or attempt to use any ticket defaced, mutilated, altered, or illegible in any of the above particulars will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and, in addition to the amount of the fare, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. No passenger shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any carriage or other vehicle of the company under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

6. No person shall expectorate upon the floor or any other part of any carriage, vehicle, waiting-room, or platform of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7. No person shall smoke in any shed or building or in any carriage or other vehicle of the company not specially provided for that purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

8. No person other than an employé of the company shall, without reasonable excuse, enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any carriage or other vehicle while the tram is in motion, or elsewhere than at the side of the carriage or other vehicle adjoining the platform or other place appointed by the company for persons to enter or leave the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. No person other than an employé of the company shall travel on the roof, steps, or footboard of any carriage or other vehicle, or on an engine or on any portion of any carriage or other vehicle not intended for the conveyance of passengers. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in a carriage or other vehicle or upon any station or premises of the company, and no person shall in or upon any such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises commit any nuisance, or gamble or write or use any insulting, indecent, obscene, blasphemous, abusive, or offensive words, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed from such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises, and shall be liable, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. The company may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious or contagious disease. No person who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the company, resort to or come upon any premises of the company, or travel or attempt to travel on the company's tramway. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from any such premises or from any carriage or other vehicle of the company, and shall forfeit any fare which he may have paid, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any employé of the company in the execution of his duty. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. Any person who finds any lost property upon any station or premises, or in or upon any carriage or vehicle of the company, shall immediately hand over the same to the guard in charge of the train. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining, shelter, or blind, or break or deface any window or remove or injure any number plate, notice, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of or in any

carriage, or otherwise damage any fittings, carriage, or other property of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to pay the amount of the damage done, and, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15. No person shall omit to shut and securely fasten any gate set up at either side of the tramway for the accommodation of the owner or occupier of the adjoining lands as soon as he and any vehicle, cattle, or other animals under his care have passed through the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. No person, unless authorized in writing by the company, shall post, stick, paint, or write, or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, or written, any placard, bill, advertisement, or other matter within or on any post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building, or other property or premises of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. No person shall wilfully trespass upon the tramway, land, or other premises of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. Any person not being an intending passenger in possession of a ticket, who does not leave any premises of the company when required so to do by an authorized employé of the company, may be removed therefrom, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

19. No person shall cross or attempt to cross the company's tram line elsewhere than at an authorized crossing place, or cross or attempt to cross the company's tram line at an authorized crossing place when warned so not to do by an employé of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

20. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown at or from any carriage or other vehicle of the company, or on to the tramway and or other premises vested in, used by, or under the control of the company, any glass, stone, or other missile, or any filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

21. No person, whether with or without a vehicle, shall ride or drive, or attempt to ride or drive any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal across the company's line when a tram is in sight, and in motion coming towards such place, or when warning of its approach has been given by a whistle, or when warned so not to do by an employé of the company. Every person when crossing shall use all possible despatch to cross such line. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

22. No person shall drive or negligently allow any cattle, horse, sheep, swine, or other animal to stray upon the tramway or premises of the company. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

23. No person shall take or have in his charge in any carriage or other vehicle intended for the conveyance of passengers, any dog or other animal. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds; and any such dog or other animal may be forthwith removed from any such carriage or vehicle and from the premises of the company.

24. No person shall be entitled to require any article to be conveyed by the tramway which, from its excessive bulk or length, would be inconvenient to transport, or any aqua fortis, oil of vitriol, gunpowder, or other goods which, in the judgment of the company's officers, may be of a dangerous nature; and any employé may refuse to take any parcel suspected to contain goods of a dangerous nature, or require the same to be opened to ascertain the fact; but nothing herein shall prevent the company or its officers from carrying any such goods if they think fit.

25. The authorized charges on all goods must be paid on demand, and in default the company reserves the right to detain and sell the goods on which such charges are payable, or to detain and sell any other property which they may then or at any future time have in their possession belonging to the person by whom such charges are payable, in order to realize the amount due. If the amount realized be insufficient to cover all charges, the company may take legal proceedings to recover the deficiency.

The company may require the charges in respect of any goods to be paid at the forwarding station, or they may permit the charges to be collected at the destination station. Credit for payment of freight and other charges will not be allowed except by special arrangement with the company.

26. The company will not be liable for any damage to goods not delivered or misdelivered, in consequence of the same not being properly directed, described, or packed, nor for damage or loss sustained through improper packing, leaking, fermentation, or fire. Nor for packages

containing a variety of articles liable by breakage to damage each other or other articles. Nor for the quantity or condition of goods loaded or unloaded by the consignor or consignee at private sidings. Nor for any loss arising from delay in the delivery of goods which may have been occasioned by flood, storm, tempest, or other unforeseen cause.

27. Fresh meat, fish, poultry, dairy produce, eggs, fruit, vegetables, and other perishable articles will be conveyed when practicable, by the next train, but in all cases at the owner's risk, and, if not promptly removed from the tramway premises (should they become offensive) will be disposed of or destroyed by the tramway servants.

28. *Passengers' Luggage.*—Passengers will be allowed to carry with them by the same train 56 lbs. of *bona fide* luggage free of charge. Free luggage consists of wearing apparel and other similar personal belongings contained in a bag, carpet-bag, trunk, box, portmanteau, valise, or any other receptacle commonly used for the purpose. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged at parcel rates. Luggage will not be accepted for free carriage when contained in merchandise boxes or cases, or in bundles not properly covered and roped.

No luggage will be allowed to be placed in the carriage unless it is of such a size as to admit of its being put under the seat or in the rack without inconvenience to the other passengers.

Passengers must have their names and the stations to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and should see that it is properly labelled.

The company will not be responsible for any luggage unless it be specially booked and paid for, and the name of the owner and its destination distinctly marked thereon.

29. The company will not guarantee the arrival or despatch of trams from the various stations at the exact times stated in the published time-tables, nor will they be responsible for delay or any consequence arising therefrom.

In the event of circumstances occurring during or prior to the journey which may render it inexpedient for the trams to proceed, the company will return the fare paid, but will not undertake to forward the passengers.

30. *Lost Tickets.*—The company will not undertake to refund money or make any allowance in respect to tickets lost or mislaid.

31. All goods and merchandise, and all luggage arriving by tram at any station, shall be removed by the consignee or owner (from the platform, shed, or premises) within twenty-four hours of arrival, or such less time as may be fixed, and any goods, merchandise, or luggage not removed by that time may be stored or allowed to remain at the station or premises of the company if there is convenience for receiving same, at the risk and expense of the consignees or owners, and shall then become subject to the payment of the sum of 1s. per ton or portion of a ton per day.

32. The company do not guarantee under any circumstances the arrival (or delivery) of any goods (perishable or otherwise) at any particular time or by any particular tram.

33. The company will not be liable for the loss of or injury to any article or articles or property of the description following, *i.e.*, gold or silver coin of the realm, or of any foreign State, or any gold or silver in a manufactured or unmanufactured state; or any precious stones, jewellery, watches, clocks, or time-pieces of any description, trinkets, gold or silver ores, bills, notes of any bank, order notes or securities for the payment of money, stamps, maps, writings, title deeds, paintings, engravings, pictures, gold or silver plate or plated articles, glass, china, silks in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether wrought up or not wrought up with other materials, furs or lace, or any of them, contained in any package or parcel which shall have been delivered for carriage by or to accompany the person of any passenger, when the value of such article or articles aforesaid shall exceed the sum of Ten pounds, unless at the time of consigning or being brought to the station to accompany a passenger, the value and nature of such article or articles or property shall have been declared, and the increased charges as set forth hereunder (which are in addition to the parcels or excess luggage rate), shall have been paid to and accepted by an employé duly authorized to receive same; any distance not exceeding 10 miles percentage on declared value above £10, 10s., minimum additional charge, 2s.

34. All goods, merchandise, and luggage unclaimed by the owner for the space of four weeks after arrival, may be sold by the company, and the company, after deducting what may be due to it for tramway carriage, storage, and charges (including expenses of sale), shall pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner on demand.

35. All goods must be fully and distinctly addressed.

36. If any goods, produce, timber, or other merchandise shall be brought into any station either by the owner or consignee, or in the waggons or vehicles of the company, and which goods or merchandise in accordance with the

conditions of the published tariffs, it shall be the business of the owner, consignor, or consignee to load into or discharge from the tramway, waggons or vehicles; and in case the owner, consignor, or consignee refuses, or neglects to load into or discharge from the tramway waggons or vehicles such goods within the periods herein-after specified, a demurrage charge of 5s. per ordinary truck, and 10s. for each bogie truck shall be imposed and levied in respect of each day or part of a day of twenty-four consecutive hours.

Four working hours will be allowed for the loading of each truck, and if such loading be not completed and the truck consigned within that time, demurrage at the rate specified shall be imposed and levied. Eight working hours after arrival will be allowed for the unloading of each truck, and if the unloading of goods from such trucks be not completed within that time, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in preceding clause, the company, by its officers and servants, may, at their option, load or unload goods into or from trucks (as the case may be) at the risk of the owner, consignor, or consignee, and the goods so loaded or unloaded shall be subject to the cost of such loading or unloading, as the case may be, in addition to the freight and such other costs or charges as may be or as may become due. Such cost of loading or unloading to be on the basis of what would be charged by the Victorian Railways for similar services in operation in like conditions.

For the purposes of the foregoing provisions the working hours of each day shall mean the hours from 8 a.m. until 12 noon, and from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m.

37. The company are carriers only from and to the various stations on the said tramway, and goods addressed to other destinations are received only to be carried to the nearest or most convenient station on the tramway.

38. With all goods, produce, timber, merchandise, or luggage for consignment to unattended sidings, the responsibility of the company shall cease when such goods are put on siding.

39. Every consignment of goods delivered to the company for carriage shall be accompanied by a consignment note signed by the sender or some person on his behalf, and such consignment note must contain a full and accurate description of the goods so delivered.

40. All goods are charged at actual gross weight of 2,240 lbs. to the ton, except where otherwise provided for. In dealing with fractions of a quarter, anything under 14 lbs. will not be charged for, 14 lbs. and over will be charged for as one quarter cwt.

In all rates calculated under the tariff any fractional part of a day will be charged as one day, and any fractional part of a mile as 1 mile. Fractions of 1d. less than ½d. will not be charged for, ½d. and over will be charged for as 1d.

The company may correct any under charges in any railway receipt or invoice.

41. Senders of any dangerous articles will be held accountable for any damage arising therefrom or thereto unless the contents are described as such in the consignment note, that due care may be observed in the loading; and in no case will the company be liable for the loss of or damage to any such articles.

42. All goods shown on the authorized classification table of the company are conveyed at owner's risk only, unless it be declared on the consignment note that the goods are required to be carried at the risk of the company and an additional charge (minimum 1s.), be paid of 5 per cent. of the freight charge.

43. The loading and unloading of heavy articles (at stations or sidings unprovided with proper facilities therefore) must be undertaken by the owners at their own risk and expense, and such articles will not be received for carriage from or to stations or sidings unless satisfactory arrangements are made by the owners for loading or unloading, as the case may be.

44. Explosives or goods of an inflammable, corrosive or dangerous nature, if carried, will be only at owner's risk.

45. All goods for which the company requires the weight in order to determine the freight charges will be weighed by the company without charge.

46. All goods classified on the authorized tariff schedule of the company are to be loaded and unloaded by the consignor or consignee. If handled by the company the charges for such transfer as set out in schedule are to be paid in addition to the ordinary freight charges.

47. The minimum load which will be carried between any stations under the published tariff schedule at tonnage rates is 1 ton.
