Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION. AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF CASTLEMAINE AT CAMPBELL'S CREEK.

CASTLEMAINE AT CAMPBELL'S CREEK.

THE Council of the United Shire of Mount Alexander, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council dated the 1st September, 1873, as a site for Recreation purposes in the parish of Castlemaine at Campbell's Creek, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

### REGULATIONS.

(1) The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
(2) No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may oftend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or

(3) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the reserve.

(5) No person shall, within the reserve, play any unlawful game.

(5) No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or any property or effects in the reserve, or without the permission in writing of the Committee of Managament, light therein any fire.

(7) No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis, or any game whatever in the reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person, at the time of playing, is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play in the reserve, or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club.

(8) No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, or other animals.

(9) No person shall remain within the reserve at any time when lawfully directed by the Committee of Management or any person duly authorized in that behalf to leave the reserve.

(10) No person shall sell or offer for sale in the reserve any article or any commodity, or operate or perform in any amusement for the purpose of making money, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(11) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person over the age of 16 years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 2s.

For the admission of every person not over the age of 16 years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 1s.

Management may determine not exceeding 1s.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 190 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. not exceeding £10.
