IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

In the MATTER of the FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS

And

In the MATTER of the DETERMINATION dated the 1st day of July, 1912, of the SPECIAL BOARD appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons whatsoever employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Boiler-making ;
- (b) Plating or rivetting or caulking, or angle-iron smithing, in connexion with—
 - (1) Iron and steel ship building ;
 - (2) Bridge building ;
 - (3) Girder, tank, waggon, or truck making ;
 - (4) Wrought-iron or steel pipe making.

And

In the MATTER of an APPLICATION to review or alter the ORDER made on appeal from the said DETERMINATION on the 2nd day of September 1912.

UPON reading the affidavit of RICHARD O'HALLORAN sworn herein on the 23rd day of September, 1913, and the exhibits therein referred to, and upon hearing Mr. ROBINSON, of Counsel for the employés, and Mr. McCAY, of Counsel for the employers, this Court is satisfied that a *prima facie* case exists for review of the Determination of this Court made herein on the 2nd day of September, 1912, and doth hereby grant leave to the Special Board appointed for the purpose to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whatsoever employed in the process trade or business of plating or rivetting or caulking or angle-iron smithing in connexion with structural iron or steel work.
