GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1913-14.

IT is hereby notified that Monday, the 1st day of December next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council.

Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions *before* or on that date.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province.

Each applicant for an Elector's Right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the duty stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

THE Commissioners of the State Savings Bank of Victoria, in pursuance and by virtue of the several enactments in that behalf contained in the Savings Banks Acts, do hereby declare, order, and direct that the following shall be the Regulations under which the said Commissioners shall receive for safe custody on behalf of depositors, sealed parcels and locked boxes.

Safe Deposit Department.

1. Subject to the Regulations of the Bank, any depositor in the State Savings Bank of Victoria, on production of his pass-book disclosing a balance at his credit, may lodge at the office in which such account is kept, and between the hours of Eleven and Twelve o'clock in the forenoon on any day (excepting bank holidays and the weekly half-holidays) during which the Bank is open, a sealed parcel or locked box for safe custody. The Bank reserves the option of refusing to receive any parcel or box if considered to be excessive in dimensions or weight, or for any other reason.

2. "Depositor" shall mean in the case of individuals any signatory or signatories of an account with the Bank opened in the name or names or one or more persons; and in the case of any company, society, or other institution having an account with the Bank shall mean such company, society or institution, as the case may be.

3. A certificate shall be issued when a parcel or box is lodged for safe custody.

4. The charge for each sealed packet for the period of one year, or any less period, shall be as follows, payable in advance:—

(a) Each parcel not exceeding twelve inches in length, five inches in width, and half of one inch in thickness, Five shillings.

(b) Each parcel exceeding the dimensions named in 4 (a) but not more than fifteen inches in length, ten inches in width, and two inches in thickness, Seven shillings and sixpence.

(c) Parcels in excess of above dimensions, One pound.

5. The charge for each locked box for the period of one year, or any less period, shall be as follows, payable in advance:—

(a) Each box not exceeding thirteen inches in length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth, Seven shillings and sixpence.

(b) Each box exceeding the dimensions named in 5 (a) but not more than eighteen inches in length, twelve inches in width, and eleven inches in depth, Ten shillings.

(c) Boxes in excess of above dimensions, One pound.

6. The charge payable in respect of the first year, or any less period, must be paid at the time when the parcel or box is lodged, and the charge for subsequent periods shall be debited the depositor's Savings Bank account on each anniversary of the date of lodgment of the parcel or box, unless the parcel or box is removed by the depositor prior to such anniversary day.

7. A depositor desiring to inspect or remove his parcel or box shall produce the certificate mentioned in 3 for indorsement or cancellation, and shall at the same time produce his Savings Bank pass-book.

8. A depositor may inspect his parcel or box free of inspection charge four times during each year, dating from the time of lodgment, and during the hours in which the Safe Deposit Department shall be open to the public. Additional inspections may also be made on payment of a fee of Sixpence each.

9. A depositor desiring to remove or inspect his parcel or box may send an order in favour of another person in such form as the Commissioners may prescribe, authorizing the Bank to deliver such parcel or box for removal or inspection, as the case may be, to such person, whose specimen signature shall appear thereon, and such order shall be accompanied by the depositor's Savings Bank pass-book and his certificate of deposit, and such other evidence as the Commissioners may require.

10. A depositor who closes his Savings Bank account shall forthwith remove any parcel or box lodged under these regulations, subject first to payment of any charge for the safe custody thereof then remaining unpaid, and the Commissioners shall be under no responsibility whatever with regard to such parcel or box from the date of such account being closed, but shall nevertheless have a lien thereon for any unpaid charges as aforesaid.

11. (a) When a deposit of a parcel or box has been made in the name of two or more persons, then on the death of any one of such persons such parcel or box may be delivered to the surviving person or persons or on the death of all such persons to the executors or administrators of the last survivor.

(b) When a deposit of a parcel or box has been made in the name of one person only then upon the death of such person such parcel or box may be delivered to his executors or administrators or to such person or persons who shall appear to the Commissioners to be entitled thereto; the receipt of such person or persons shall be valid and effectual for all purposes whatsoever as regards the Commissioners or any officer of the Bank.

(c) When a deposit of a parcel or box has been made in the name of a company or society or other institution similar directions in writing must be given of change of office-bearers as is required in connexion with its account with the Bank, and such notice must be filed by the depositor in the Safe Deposit Department.

BOROUGH OF SALE.

BY-LAW NO. 20.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and section 35 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 20, for prohibiting spitting and expectorating in certain places and for preventing nuisances and securing the healthfulness of the said Borough and its inhabitants.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE MINIMAY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MINIMAY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Minimay Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. When any person has paid the fee for a private grave and requires a brick grave or vault, such person shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any

of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE WINCHELSEA TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, having drafted the following Regulations for Management of the Winchelsea Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner, and the right to depasture shall not be transferable.

3. The managers shall be at liberty to decline to register stock, if the Common is, in the opinion of the managers, legally stocked to its full grazing capacity.

4. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of April, and on the 1st day of October in each year:—

For every horse, Twenty shillings per annum.
For every head of other large cattle, Ten shillings per annum.
For every head of small cattle over the age of 6 months, Ten shillings per annum.

5. All stock running on the Common shall be branded with the brands of the owners thereof.

6. The herdsman shall be in attendance at the time and place to be appointed, prior to the commencement of each half-year, for the purpose of registering stock intended to be depastured on the Common, and to receive the fees thereon (for which the managers will give receipts in the prescribed form), together with a schedule of particulars of the animals to be depastured, signed by the owners thereof.

7. The herdsman, on delivery to him of any stock, and after payment of the prescribed fees shall, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, mark, brand, or affix a badge (as directed by the managers) to such stock.

8. No stock duly registered shall be removed from the Common without and unless notice, in writing, be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the Common, or being removed therefrom without the owners' consent, notify the same, in writing, to the owner thereof within ten days, and in default of notice within that time the herdsman shall, if the stock be lost, be held responsible, and the loss shall be computed at a rate not to exceed Ten pounds sterling for each animal.

10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Common.

11. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers, the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the Common, and shall give notice thereof, in writing, to the owner of such stock.

12. All stock not registered for grazing on the Common and found wandering thereon shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

13. The owners of all registered stock found wandering on the Common without the recognised badge and chain of the managers shall be notified thereof by the herdsman, and the owner of any such stock shall within twenty-four hours after such notice obtain another badge and chain at his own expense from the managers, and, in default, such stock shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

14. Wherever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

15. Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

THE Council of the Shire of Eltham, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves specified hereunder having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of twenty-eighth May, 1913, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Tarrawarra.

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of twenty-eighth May, 1913, as a site for Public Recreation in the town of Eltham.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding thirty in any one year), as the Reserves or either of them may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserves or either of them.

2. No person shall enter or remain in either of the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in either of the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around either of the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in either of the Reserves, or leave therein any bottles or broken glass.
5. No person shall put in either of the Reserves any cattle, sheep, horses, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into either of the Reserves any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in either of the Reserves, nor erect therein any dwelling or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale or exhibition any article or animal, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in either of the Reserves, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall carry any firearms in or through either of the Reserves nor discharge any firearms therein, nor shoot, snare, or destroy any wild or other bird, or take, injure, or destroy any bird's nest or bird's egg in either of the Reserves.
10. No person shall play, or practice cricket or football, or any other game, or engage in any sport in either of the Reserves on Sunday.
11. No person shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale within either of the Reserves, any article or commodity, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
12. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any description in either of the Reserves, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
13. No person shall bet in any part of the Reserves, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

14. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in either of the Reserves.

15. No person shall undress within either of the Reserves for the purpose of bathing in any river or creek within or abutting on either of the Reserves, or dress therein except at such places as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and on such days and hours as the Committee of Management may determine.

16. No person shall bathe or attempt to bathe in any river or creek in either of the Reserves without wearing becoming bathing costume, which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knee.

Every person offending against these Regulations, shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 9, for regulating the lighting of vehicles and velocipedes being driven at night.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Upper Yarra make the following Regulation, which will apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

1. For every licence for a hackney carriage, the sum of Five shillings shall be paid to the Council of the Shire.

2. The name of the town and the number of the hackney carriage, and the number of the persons to be carried, corresponding with the number of the licence issued, in respect of such carriage, shall be painted, printed, or marked upon a metal plate, and shall be affixed in a prominent place on the back of every hackney carriage.

3. The rate and fares to be charged for the hire of every hackney carriage shall be legibly painted, or engraved on the front panel of and upon the inside of every such hackney carriage.

4. The number of every hackney carriage, corresponding with the number of the licence issued in respect thereof, shall be painted and displayed on some conspicuous part thereof, and on the front glass of each lamp used upon such hackney carriage, in a distinct and legible manner, and in figures one (1) inch in length.

5. No driver of any hackney carriage shall smoke any pipe, cigar, or cigarette whilst he is driving such hackney carriage under engagement to any person or persons.

6. No driver of any hackney carriage under special engagement of contract to or with any person or persons shall ply for hire to take up any passenger or passengers while performing such engagement or contract.

7. No driver shall carry or knowingly permit to be carried in any hackney carriage any merchandise, goods, or wares or articles other than the luggage of passengers, and no driver of a hackney carriage shall be obliged to take any such luggage of greater weight than is prescribed in the rates and fares herein, nor unless any such luggage shall be clean and not calculated to injure or damage any hackney carriage or the clothes of any passengers therein.

8. The number of persons to be carried by any hackney carriage shall not exceed the number stated in the licence issued in respect thereof.

9. The driver of every hackney carriage shall wear a badge on which shall be painted, printed, or engraved in legible letters as follows:—

S. of U.Y.,
Licensed Driver,

and also the number corresponding with his licence.

If any goods, produce, timber, or other merchandise shall be brought into any station either by the owner or the consignee, or in the waggons or vehicles of the company, and which goods or merchandise in accordance with the conditions of the published tariffs, it shall be the business of the owner, consignor, or consignee to load into or discharge from the tramway, waggons, or vehicles; and in case of owner, consignor, or consignee refuses or neglects to load into or discharge from the tramway, waggons, or vehicles such goods within the periods hereinafter specified, a demurrage charge of 5s. per ordinary truck, and 10s. for each bogie truck, shall be imposed and levied in respect of each day or part of a day of 24 consecutive hours.

Eight working hours will be allowed for the loading of each truck, and if such loading is not completed and the truck consigned within that time, demurrage at the rate specified shall be imposed and levied. Eight working hours after arrival will be allowed for the unloading of each truck, and if the unloading of goods from such trucks be not completed within the time, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in preceding clause, the company, by its officers and servants, may at their option, load or unload goods into or from trucks (as the case may be) at the risk of the owner, consignor, or consignee, and the goods so loaded or unloaded shall be subject to the cost of such loading or unloading, as the case may be, in addition to the freight, and such other costs or charges as may be or may become due. Such cost of loading or unloading to be on the basis of what would be charged by the Victorian Railways for similar services in operation in like conditions.

2. The minimum load which will be carried between any stations under the published tariff schedule at tonnage rates is 5 cwt.
