1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than four females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said four females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the third year of the reign of his present Majesty King George the V. and numbered 2424 and intitled "An Act to approve and ratify and provide for carrying out an Agreement for the Construction and Working of certain Border Railways and purposes incidental thereto (including the construction of a

railway from Heywood to Mumbannar) entered into between the Governments of the States of Victoria and South Australia" it is among other things enacted that the said Act shall not come into force until an Act approving and ratifying the Agreement the subject of the Victorian Act hereinafter referred to (hereinafter referred to as the "Victorian Act") and for the carrying out by the State of South Australia of the provisions thereof so far as such provisions are to be carried out by that State has been passed by the Parliament of that State and has been assented to by the Governor thereof and further enacting that when such Act of the Parliament of South Australia has been passed and assented to as aforesaid the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* fix the day when the Victorian Act shall come into force such day not being earlier than the date when the said Act of the Parliament of South Australia is to come into force when the Victorian Act is to come into force accordingly And whereas an Act approving and ratifying the said Agreement and providing for the carrying out by the State of South Australia of the provisions thereof so far as such provisions are to be carried out by that State has been passed by the Parliament of that State and was assented to by the Governor thereof on the 14th day of December now last past and whereas by such Act of the Parliament of South Australia the day fixed when it is to come into force is a day not earlier than the date when the said Victorian Act is to come into force And whereas the respective Governments of the States of South Australia and Victoria have mutually agreed to fix the seventeenth day of February now next as the date when the particular Act of the several States shall be proclaimed as coming into force in the State of which it is an Act: Now therefore I Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller Baronet Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor of the State of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the good faith of the Government of the State of South Australia acting under an Agreement with the Government of Victoria that the Governor of South Australia will by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the State of South Australia fix the seventeenth day of February 1913 as the day when the Act of the Parliament of South Australia hereinafter referred to shall come into force in that State do hereby by this my Proclamation fix and appoint the seventeenth day of February 1913 as the date on which the Victorian Act hereinafter referred to (which under its provisions may be cited as the *South Australian and Victorian Border Railways Act 1912*) shall come into force and conditional on the said Act of the Parliament of South Australia coming into force on that date as agreed as aforesaid I hereby ordain and declare that the said Victorian Act being the *South Australian and Victorian Border Railways Act 1912* number 2424 and assented to by me on the twenty-third day of December last past shall come into force on that date accordingly.

**REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEWHAM, KNOWN AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901* it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown Lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown Lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the section specified: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham (now designated the Shire of Newham and Woodend) in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation and for affording access to water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the

President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham and Woodend do hereby make, in lieu of the Regulation made on the 21st January, 1902, in respect to the said Reserve, the following Regulation for the care, protection, and management thereof:—

**REGULATION.**

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on every New Year's Day and every Easter Monday, or any day substituted for either of them, on any of which occasions a fee of Sixpence (6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every person not under the age of sixteen (16) years to the Reserve.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

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##### SHIRE OF CORIO.

BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law to prevent the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without light in the Shire of Corio.

WHEREAS by section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903* power is given to any municipality to make By-laws for the suppression of nuisances, and whereas the driving of vehicles at night without light is a nuisance, by reason of the danger caused to wayfarers, and it is necessary to prevent and suppress the same: Now therefore we, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Corio order as follows:—

1. Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in or upon or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of Corio, drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons without having a good and serviceable carriage lamp securely fixed and properly lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle, shall for every such offence, upon conviction thereof before one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
2. The driver of any waggon, cart, or dray (whether such waggon, cart, or dray be upon springs or otherwise), who shall drive the same, whether for hire or otherwise, in, upon, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare, or place used as such,

within the limits of the Shire of Corio, between any sunset and before sunrise the following morning, shall carry a lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the off side of such waggon, cart, or dray, in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, thoroughfare, or place in a contrary direction to that in which such waggon, cart, or dray shall be proceeding; and any person who shall be driving such waggon, cart, or dray without having such lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and exhibited as aforesaid shall, for every such offence, upon conviction thereof before one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale make the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Lillydale:—

1. For every licence for a hackney carriage, the sum of Five shillings shall be paid to the Council of the Shire.
2. The name of the town, the number of the hackney carriage, and the number of the persons to be carried, corresponding with the number of the licence issued in respect of such carriage, shall be painted, printed, or marked upon a metal plate, and shall be affixed in a prominent place on the back of every hackney carriage.
3. The rates and fares to be charged for the hire of every hackney carriage shall be legibly painted or engraved on the front panel of and upon the inside of every such hackney carriage.
4. The number of every hackney carriage, corresponding with the number of the licence issued in respect thereof, shall be painted and displayed on some conspicuous part thereof, and on the front glass of each lamp used upon such hackney carriage, in a distinct and legible manner, and in figures one (1) inch in length.
5. No driver of any hackney carriage shall smoke any pipe, cigar, or cigarette whilst he is driving such hackney carriage under engagement to any person or persons.
6. No driver of any hackney carriage under special engagement of contract to or with any person or persons shall ply for hire or take up any passenger or passengers while performing such engagement or contract.

7. No driver shall carry, or knowingly permit to be carried, in any hackney carriage any merchandise, goods, or wares, or articles other than the luggage of passengers, and no driver of a hackney carriage shall be obliged to take any such luggage of greater weight than is prescribed in the rates and fares herein, nor unless any such luggage shall be clean and not calculated to injure or damage any hackney carriage or the clothes of passengers therein.
8. The number of persons to be carried by any hackney carriage shall not exceed the number stated in the licence issued in respect thereof.
9. The driver of every hackney carriage shall wear a badge on which shall be painted, printed, or engraved in legible letters, as follows:—
