Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE IRONMOULDERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than moulders employed in moulding metal bedsteads) employed in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 28th day of March, 1913. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

Note.—Section 163 of the Factories Act 1912, No. 2386, extends the powers of this Board to "Steel moulding."

That the Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1908 that any employer may fix and pay piece work prices or rates to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, provided that any such employer shall base such piecework prices or rates on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices or rates shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
