REGULATIONS FOR THE INSPECTION AND TEST OF BOILERS.

H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order reseind the Order of the 23rd day of April, 1007, making certain Regulations supplementary to the Boilers Inspection Act 1006 for the Inspection and Test of Boilers, and doth Order that the attached Regulations be adopted in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS (SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE ACTS) FOR THE INSPECTION AND TEST OF BOILERS.

- t. The pressure which boilers are calculated to sustain is to be ascertained by applying the British Board of Trade Rules relating to Steam Boilers.
- 2. On the first inspection, section 14 of Act No. 2071, boilers to be subjected to an hydraulic test. In the case of new boilers the test pressure to be double the working pressure allowed, and in the case of boilers in work and second-hand the test pressure to be one and a half times the working pressure allowed.
- 3. Under the conditions referred to in section 15, sub-section (2), and in section 20 of Act No. 2071, or otherwise, the Chief Inspector may deem it necessary to have the hydraulic test pressure applied before issuing a renewed certificate.
- 4. Water gauges to be provided with strong metal guards around the glasses.
- 5. Steam gauges to be tested and adjusted once in twelve months, and no gauge to be passed which varies more than five pounds from the standard gauge.
- 6. The design of safety valves to be submitted to the Chief Inspector, and to be subject to his approval. In lever safety valves, the weight to be at end of lever to give working pressure.
- 7. No boiler to be placed in position, or built in, before an Inspector has inspected it internally and externally, and a certificate has been granted.
- 8. The method of reckoning the horse-power of boilers is:—Allow to square feet of heating surface per horse-
- 9. Identification stamps shall consist of the registered number, test, and working pressures, and date of test, and are to be stamped with steel letter punches by an Inspector in a conspicuous place on front of boiler, or alongside manhole, as in the illustration at foot hereof.
- ro. The alteration or removal partly or wholly of identification stamps shall be an offence under these Regula-
- 11. Any person who contravenes any of these Regulations for which no penalty is provided by the Boilers Inspection Acts shall for such offence be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (section 42, Act No. 2071, as amended by section 3, Act No. 2436).

- 3. Valuations of tracts of timber standing in forests or plantations by trial acres, strips, and in bulk, such valuations to show estimated or approximate age, condition soundness, and freedom from disease or faultiness, and general quality of standing timber on areas valued.
- 4. Measurement of timber in the standing tree, in the log, and in the square (baulks, beams, girders, &c.).
- 5. Computation of values and royalties in connexion with sales, and conversion of timber.
- Knowledge of the authorized systems of working and management of indigenous hardwood forests of Victoria.
- 7. Methods of seasoning and preservation of timber for
- 8. Plants and animals (fungi, insects, vermin, parasites, &c.) destructive or injurious to timber, and timber trees, and the means of combating their attacks.
- 9. Effects of fire in forests and plantations, and mea-sures necessary to prevent, control, and extinguish fires.
- 10. Knowledge of the Forests Acts in force in Victoria, and regulations thereunder.
  - 11. The writing of a short essay on a forestry subject.

#### Trainees at Forests School, Creswick.

Applicants must be between the age of 14 and 17 years, and must forward to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners an application in writing, together with a certificate of birth and a certificate of sound health and freedom from physical defects or organic disease, signed by a physician or surgeon practising in Victoria. The subjects for examination will be as follows:—

Compulsory.—English and composition, arithmetic, writing from dictation, and reading.

Optional.—Elementary geology, elementary Latin, French, or German, elementary physics, elemen-tary chemistry, and elementary botany.

Candidates are requested to state, when making applica-tion, the number of optional subjects they intend to take up. Candidates may also be orally examined in any or all of the subjects for which they may present themselves.

Successful candidates, before acceptance, must undergo a special medical examination as to physical fitness by the Government Medical Officer; and, when finally accepted as pupils in the Forests School for a term of three years' instruction, must give a band to serve in the Forests Service of Victoria for a further term of two years. The students will be charged a reasonable sum for board and bodging, but a weekly allowance will be made as a set-off to cover work performed in the nurseries and plantations.

### Conditions.

1. That clause 57 of Regulation No. 126 be excised, and the following clause inserted in lieu thereof:—Every dwelling-house hereafter built, rebuilt, or altered within the area bounded by Kerferd-road, Canterbury-road, Fraser-street, and Beaconsfield-parade must have an enclosed back yard or onen space of at least 400 square feet, and every dwelling-house hereafter built, rebuilt, or altered within the City and outside of the above-mentioned area must have an enclosed back vard or open space of at least 200 square feet; such yard areas to be exclusive of any building thereon unless all the rooms of such dwelling can be, in the opinion of the Surveyor, sufficiently lighted and ventilated from a street or way. This clause shall not apply in a case where a dwelling is completely or partially destroyed by fire. In such a case the vard area existing prior to destruction of building may be adhered to when repairing or re-erecting such dwelling. dwelling.

2. After clause 4 of Regulation No. 126 insert the following clause, to be numbered A.:—No building of the dwelling-house class shall hereafter be built fronting any street or lane less than 20 feet in width situated within the area bounded by Kerferd-road, Canterbury-road, Fraser-street, and Beaconsfield-parade, always excepting Park-grove and Little Page-street from Kerferd-road to Mills-street.

(3) Every person driving, riding, or impelling a bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle to the right or off side of such waggon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, or horse or beast of burden, and any person overtaking with such bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage, way, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle.

(4) In every case where a person driving or riding a bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and such horse or other beast of burden shall, on such meeting, become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden, the person driving or riding such bicycle, crievele, or motor-cycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary. be reasonably necessary.

(5) No person shall drive, ride, or impel a bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle along or across any street or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle is being ridden, driven, or impelled. (6) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any bicycle, tricycle, or motor-cycle along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such manner or in such order that more than two bicycles, tricycles, or motor-cycles shall
