Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE TIE MAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of men's and boys' ties, has made the following Determination, namely :-

1. That this Determination shall come into force on the 22nd May, 1913.

IMPROVERS.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an mprover. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

4. That the number of male improvers who may be employed in any factory or place shall be two improvers to each male worker receiving at wages rates or piece-work prices not less than 40s. per week of 48 hours.

OVERTIME.

- 6. That the following rates shall be paid for all work done:-
 - (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (5) (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (5) in excess of 48 hours in any week

SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 7. That the rates of payment to any person for all work done on :-
 - (a) Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday,

shall be at the rate of double time.

(b) On the undermentioned public holidays (that is to say):—

New Year's Day,
Boxing Day,
The 26th day of January (Foundation Day)
The 21st April (Eight Hours Day),

or such other day as may by authority of Act of Parliament or Proclamation
be observed as a public holiday in lieu
thereof

Easter Monday, shall be at the rate of time and a half.

PIECE-WORK.

8. The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Acts 1912 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piecework prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
