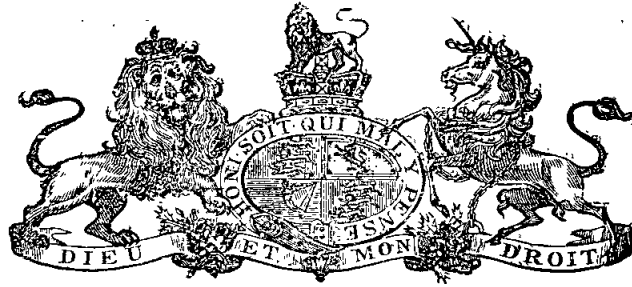

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of May, 1913: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of June, 1913:

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1913.

IT is hereby notified that Monday, the 2nd day of June next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council.

Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions *before* or on that date.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province.

Each applicant for an Elector's Right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the duty stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

The Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby repeals Chapter VI. of the Regulations made on the 28th June, 1909, and all amendments thereof, and makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—[to take effect from the 1st January, 1913.]

REGULATIONS.—CLASSIFICATION OF GENERAL DIVISION.

CHAPTER VI.

1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the General Division, it shall, unless it be found absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Commissioner possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.
2. In the case of appointments, transfers, or promotions to any office in the General Division, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule.
3. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the Schedule, every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.
4. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate, within the minimum and maximum limits, to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Service shall be paid at the minimum rate of his office, except in the cases of persons appointed under the provisions of Section 9 of Act No. 2383, who shall be entitled to be appointed at a salary not less than that they were in receipt of immediately prior to their appointment permanently to the Public Service.
5. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office or grade in the General Division shall thereupon be junior to any officer already in such office or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule he shall be paid an amount not less than that he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office or grade.
6. Increments of Twelve pounds each—at intervals of not less than twelve months—may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the Schedule.
7. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation (after independent inquiry) of the Commissioner.
8. Where an officer has, previously to his transfer, been paid the same salary as in his new office; time served in such former office may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

TALBOT BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1913.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1913 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Borough of Talbot, which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1913 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound.
3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.
4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Trust, the following charges shall be made:—
 - Post office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum.
 - Police station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons: minimum, 30,000 gallons per annum.
 - State-school, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons, or less.

7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half-acre and 200,000 gallons per acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from the open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1913, and the 1st day of July, 1913, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; for Lara, from the Superintendent of the Inebriates Retreat, and the Receiver and Paymaster at Geelong; for Greenvale, from the Superintendent at the Sanatorium; for Aborigines, from the police at stations as follow:—Coranderk, at Healesville; Lake Condah, at Heywood and Portland; and Lake Tyers, at Bairnsdale and Cunninghame; for Rutherglen, from the Superintendent, Viticultural College; for Wyuna, from the manager, at the Irrigation Farm, and from the police at Kyabram; for Wahgunyah, from the manager, at the Vine Nursery; and for the Forest School, from the senior master, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete by lodging the security and contract form; duly signed, within the prescribed period. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period, when notified of acceptance, may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the prices are considered reasonable. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; Williamstown includes supplies for a.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert*; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wynna, the Irrigation Farm; Wangunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the Forest School. The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods, in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring

it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at not less than the minimum wage fixed by the Factories and Shops Act and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

BY-LAW NO. 16.

A By-law of the Shire of Mansfield, made under subsection 7 of section 197, and sections 610, 630, and 635 of *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 16, for regulating the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the Municipal District, for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences, and for appointing tolls and dues to be demanded from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling any cattle in the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, and from any person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the Municipal District.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mansfield order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market situated in the Shire of Mansfield, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle on every lawful day from sunrise to sunset. A "fortnightly market" shall be held, commencing on Friday, 30th May, 1913, and subsequently on every alternate Friday, provided that in the event of any "fortnightly market" day falling on Christmas Day or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the Council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said "fortnightly market."

3. The sales of cattle shall be commenced not earlier than Eleven o'clock a.m. during May, June, July, and August, and Ten o'clock a.m. for the rest of the year, and shall be conducted in the order following:—

First Pigs.
Second Fat Sheep.
Third Store Sheep.
Fourth Fat Cattle.
Fifth Store Cattle.
Sixth Horses.

4. No sale shall be held in the yards on any day other than that specified in the By-law except such days which may be appointed by the President for the time being and Secretary of the Shire of Mansfield.

5. The Council shall appoint a market inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—

1. To see that this By-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, relating to markets, are duly observed.

2. To demand and collect all market tolls and dues.

3. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before Five o'clock p.m. on the day of sale, except with the consent of such inspector.

6. No person shall obstruct the market inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market without the consent of the market inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

7. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied; and if any cattle be not removed within 28 hours after the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

8. The fat and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers, who shall draw lots for precedence of selling, and no two auctioneers will be allowed to sell in the yards at the same time without first obtaining the permission of the yard inspector, and no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than five (5) minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale, or occupy more than one (1) hour in disposing of all similar stock in his hands for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands within the specified time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale.

9. No auctioneer or his agents shall tout or otherwise solicit stock for sale in the precincts of the market yards on sale days.

10. All auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than ten (10) minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time.

11. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction the market inspector's decision shall be final.

12. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

13. The Council may license any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, and the annual licence fee shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each yard or premises so licensed.

14. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Appointing Tolls and Dues.

1. The Council of the Shire of Mansfield shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling any cattle in the Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, and may from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district and outside the said Mansfield Corporation Sale Yards, the several sums of money as for tolls or dues hereinafter appointed in that behalf, that is to say:—
