DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

BY-LAW relating to fishing in the reservoirs connected with the Donald Water Supply:—

1. No person will be permitted to angle for fish in the reservoirs or waters connected with the Donald Waterworks Trust without a licence, to be issued by the Commissioners.
 2. Application for a licence to be made at the office of the Commissioners, each application to be subject to approval.
 3. The subscription for each licence shall be Ten shillings for each open season, from the dates 1st September to the 30th April following (both dates inclusive). Angling to be permitted only between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 (nine) p.m. of each day during the season.
 4. No angling or fishing shall be permitted on Sunday.
 5. The licence shall be non-transferable, and any person other than the one to whom the licence is issued using the same shall be treated as a trespasser, and the licence shall be forfeited and cancelled.
 6. The holder of a licence shall, while fishing, wear attached to the lapel of his coat a distinctive badge or card, to be issued by the Commissioners, and shall produce his licence if called upon to do so by any officer or employé of the Commissioners; and in case of refusal or failure to produce the same he shall be liable to be treated as a trespasser.
 7. The use of ground bait, fixed engine, or other means to capture fish (except with one rod and line by each holder of a licence) is strictly prohibited.
 8. No empty tins, bait, paper, and other refuse or *débris* shall be left within or about the contour lines of the reservoirs, and all such must be cleared, removed, or carried away by the person using same.
 9. The holder of a licence shall agree and undertake to obey all By-laws now or hereinafter in force made by the Commissioners relating to and affecting visitors and other persons entering into and upon lands, reservoirs, and works vested in or under the control of the Commissioners; and also to agree to undertake to assist the Commissioners and their officers and employés by all legal means to prevent the pollution or contamination of the water supply by persons standing, wading, washing, or bathing therein, or by any other means whatsoever.
 10. In the event of a breach of any of the foregoing provisions being committed by the holder of a licence, such licence shall be forfeited, and the Commissioners may cancel same, and the person offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

WHEREAS by Part II of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules respecting Explosives within Port Phillip, that is to say :—

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

Hours of Loading or Unloading Explosives within Port Phillip.

20A. Explosives shall be discharged from or loaded into any ship by the Ports and Harbors Department only between the hours of Eight a.m. and Five p.m. on week days, except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be Eight a.m. till Twelve noon, and at other periods, including Government holidays, only if suitable men can be obtained for the work, and subject to payment by the Agent of the ship of a charge to cover overtime (Holiday or Saturday afternoon rates paid to the men employed.

SHIRE OF ARAPILES.
 REGULATION No. 1.

A Regulation of the Shire of Arapiles, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and the By-laws of the Shire for the purpose of regulating bathing in the open.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and the By-laws of the Shire of Arapiles, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Arapiles order as follows:—

1. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his or her clothing or bathing costume, in any place open to view from a public thoroughfare.
2. No person shall bathe in any place open to view from a public thoroughfare unless dressed in a bathing costume

which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knees, so as to observe proper decency.

3. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, loiter on, lie, or run along the river banks, creek banks, banks of lakes, or other waters, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing place.
4. No person shall play games, loiter, misconduct himself or herself, commit a nuisance, bring any rubbish, filth, or any offensive matter into, or damage or disfigure or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosures set apart for bathers.
5. No person shall behave in an unseemly, riotous, improper, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner on or in any part of the river bank, creek bank, bank of lake, or other waters, dressing shed, or enclosures.
6. Except for the purpose of rendering assistance in the case of accident no male person over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of females; and, except as aforesaid, no female person shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of males.

This regulation to apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Arapiles.

Resolution for passing this regulation was agreed to at a meeting of the Arapiles Shire Council, held on the 18th February, 1913, and confirmed on the 18th March, 1913.
