Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Friday, the 4th July, 1913.

Forms of application and copies of the Regulations may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Tuesday, the 15th July, 1913, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Ten shillings (10s.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examination, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-five years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Deputy Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne, not later than Friday, the 4th July, 1913. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he be less than 5 feet 8 inches in height, or measure round his chest less than 36 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

For the position of Junior Attendant, Public Library, or Junior Messenger applicants must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty years. After attainment of the age of twenty-one years and completion of three years' service an officer may be granted a salary of £108 a year.

Officers of the General Division of the Public Service of Victoria who have had two years' service in such Division may compete at the Clerical Examination, and any officers of the General Division who have not passed the Examination for such Division may present themselves at the General Division Examination in order to qualify for promotion in that Division, on making application to the Commissioner, and furnishing evidence of good conduct and health from the Head of their Department.

REGULATIONS.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Acts and the Lunacy Act No. 1873, hereby repeals the Regulations heretofore made under such Acts, and makes the following Regulations to take effect from the 1st January, 1913 :—

In these Regulations "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane appointed under the Lunacy Act No. 1873.

The Regulations are divided into the following Chapters, viz. :—

- Chapter I.—Professional Division, Classification of.
- Chapter II.—General Division, Appointment to.
- Chapter III.—General Division, Classification of.

CHAPTER I.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE PROFESSIONAL DIVISION—LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

Public Service Act No. 1133, Section 50 (1), and Act No. 1721, Section 13, and Lunacy Act No. 1873, Section 12.

1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the Professional Division it shall, unless it be absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who, in the opinion of the Inspector-General of the Insane, possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

2. In the case of appointments, transfers, and promotions made on or after the 1st January, 1913, to any such office, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of such office in such Schedule in the "Yearly rate of Pay."

3. When a minimum rate and a maximum rate of salary are attached to any office, the person holding such office shall be paid such amount, being not less than the minimum nor more than the maximum rate, as shall be from time to time approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Service shall be paid the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office in the Professional Division shall thereupon be the junior officer in such office or grade to which he is promoted or transferred, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto, he shall be paid a salary not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion, provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office.

5. The following are the classes of the Professional Division which apply to officers appointed, transferred, or promoted under these Regulations.

CHAPTER II.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION IN THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 1133, Section 59 (v), (vi), and (vii), and Act No. 1873, Section 12).

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

1. Every applicant (except for the position of Messenger) must at the date of his application be between the ages of twenty-one and forty-one years, and must forward to the office of the Inspector-General of the Insane an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of birth, and the particular appointment or class of appointment which he desires to obtain. He must also send in a certificate of good moral character and industry, as well as a certificate of suitability for employment from either the Inspector-General of the Insane or the Medical Superintendent of one of the Hospitals.

Nurses should be 5 feet 3 inches in height, and Attendants 5 feet 8 inches, with correspondingly good physical development, and in their form of application they should state what their previous occupation or work has been.

Applicants for the positions of Messenger must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty: Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of twenty-one years.

2. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Inspector-General, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

3. On the production of these certificates applicants may have their names entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment," and will be nominated as vacancies occur. Prior to nomination, however, it will be necessary for applicants to furnish a certificate of good physical health.

4. New appointments, all things being equal, will be made from among those persons whose names are entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment" according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled, and the Educational Test Examination having been passed; but the Inspector-General may nominate any applicant who has special qualifications without regard to his position on the Register.

5. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name will thereupon be removed from the Register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the Register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Inspector-General respecting his nomination to the Lunacy Department addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Inspector-General.

6. No name of any person shall remain on the Register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one years.

7. Any person appointed under these Regulations will be on probation for twelve months, and the Attendants will be required prior to their probationary appointment to pass an examination which will prove the sufficiency of their education.

The subjects of examination shall be those specified hereunder:—

(a) Handwriting: to be tested by copying out at least 200 words from a passage of simple English.

(b) Spelling: to be tested by writing from dictation an extract from a newspaper—not less than 100 words.

(c) Arithmetic: first four rules, simple and money.

Applicants who have passed any examination for candidates for appointment in the Public Service of Victoria, or any like examination, will be exempted from this examination. Persons appointed to positions in the General Division other than those of Attendants and Nurses will not be required to pass the Educational Examination, *i.e.*, Hospital Trained Nurses, Artisans, and Servants.

First Departmental Examination.

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regulations must qualify themselves for retention on the staff of the Lunacy Department and for subsequent increments to their salaries by attending the necessary courses of lectures in Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, First Aid to the Injured, and General Duties.

Failure of an Attendant or Nurse to pass the Departmental Examinations within the times specified will be considered to be evidence of incapacity to discharge the duties of his or her office; and the retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Nurse will be retained on the staff of the Lunacy Department unless he or she has passed the First Departmental Examination.

9. The First Departmental Examination cannot be undertaken before the Attendant or Nurse has been in the service of the Lunacy Department for a period of one year. In the event of a failure to pass at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of a second opportunity to pass the examination being given.

Second Departmental Examination.

10. The Second Departmental Examination—in general and mental nursing—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the third year of service in the Lunacy Department, but the Attendants and Nurses must present themselves for this Examination before the end of the fourth year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. On the passing of this Examination a certificate will be given to the successful examinee setting forth that he or she is considered as a trained mental Attendant or Nurse of the Lunacy Department. In the event of a failure to pass this second examination at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of other opportunities to pass the examination being given. In the event of a second failure to pass, however, the services of the unsuccessful candidate may be dispensed with.

11. The first increment will only be recommended to the Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Departmental Examination having been passed, and if he or she is approved of by the Medical Superintendent and the Inspector-General, and on the production of a certificate of good conduct and diligence from the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane where he or she is employed. The second increment will not be recommended until the Second Departmental Examination has been passed.

12. In determining the claims of officers to promotion, consideration will be given in respect of merit to the following qualifications:—

(a) Ability and knowledge required to fulfil the duties of the superior office, and the possession of the necessary tact and judgment.

(b) Industrious habits and careful performance of work.

(c) Good conduct, regular attendance, and prompt and cheerful service on urgent occasions.

(d) Mental vigour and sound bodily health.

(e) Performance of valuable services of a special nature.

In determining the claims to promotion of an Attendant or Nurse in a Hospital for the Insane, consideration in respect of merit will be given to evidence of nursing qualifications as shown by having passed the examinations held by the Department.

13. No Attendant or Nurse will be eligible for promotion to the Second Grade until the Second Departmental Examination is passed.

This will not include Attendants and Nurses appointed prior to 1st January 1907, who may be promoted to the Second Grade, notwithstanding that they have not passed the Nursing Examination. A strong recommendation as to suitability for promotion to the higher grade will be required.

14. For promotion to the First Grade selection will be made from among those Attendants and Nurses who have passed into the Second Grade, and who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.

15. Except in a case in which the Inspector-General shall certify that some particular office in the Lunacy Department should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, the person to fill the position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse may be selected from among the Attendants and Nurses who have demonstrated their capacity for the special work required of them.

16. It will be necessary for the Chief Nurses, the Hospital Attendants, and the Hospital Nurses to pass a special Examination in mental nursing before their appointments are confirmed.

17. Officers appointed to any position in the Lunacy Department shall not, until they shall have served for a period of 5 years on the staff of the Department, be transferred to any other Department or Branch unless such transfer is determined to be in the interests of the Public Service.

Board of Examiners.

18. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted by a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the Inspector-General or a Deputy appointed by the Inspector-General and two Medical Superintendents or Deputy Superintendents appointed by the Inspector-General.

19. The subjects for the First and Second Departmental Examinations shall be those set forth in the syllabus of lectures adopted from time to time and issued to each Hospital for the Insane, the text-book being as prescribed from time to time.

20. The employés at the Idiot Asylum and the Reception House so far as is practicable will be subject to the same rules as the employés in the Hospitals for the Insane.

21. In accordance with the exigencies of the Department, and in order to facilitate the better training of Attendants and Nurses, the Inspector-General may transfer an Attendant or Nurse from one Hospital to another, or from the female side to the male side of the same Hospital where the nursing of male patients is undertaken by female Nurses.

22. All probationers and persons appointed on the staff of the Lunacy Department will be required to sign the agreement hereunder at the time of entry on duty.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

I hereby acknowledge to have received and read a copy of rules and instructions appended hereto and marked A and B which are now in force for the guidance of in the Lunacy Department. I fully understand that during my connexion with this Department and in consideration of being employed, I am obliged to obey and carry out these rules and instructions, and all other rules, instructions and orders which may be in force during my employment within the Hospital for the Insane in which I may at any time be employed, and also that I must be careful of the property of the Government of Victoria and must promote so far as I am able the interests and objects of any such Hospital, avoid gossiping about its inmates or affairs, and endeavour generally by my own conduct and demeanour to sustain the reputation of the establishment. I further understand that I am liable to be called upon to perform any duty assigned to me, although not of a nature I usually perform, should I be required to do so by the Medical Superintendent or his representatives; that it is my duty if anything improper is done in my presence or to my knowledge in the Hospital wherein I may be employed, to report it to the Medical Superintendent; and I understand and agree that I am liable to be punished or have my services dispensed with or be dismissed for any transgression of any instruction, order or rule of the Hospital, or of any instruction, order or rule applying to and further I understand the principles laid down in the Rules and Regulations for promotion by merit, good behaviour and suitability (and, for the Attendants and Nurses, that the possession of the Departmental Nursing certificates), are the only means by which I may expect promotion, and that any attempt to gain promotion by other influences than these will be taken as an acknowledgment on my part of my unfitness for such promotion; further that one month's notice at least is required before an application to be allowed to leave the service of the Lunacy Department will be considered.

CHAPTER III.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 1133, Section 59 (viii), and Act No. 1721, Section 13, and Act No. 1873, Section 12).

1. In the case of appointments, promotions or transfers to any office in the General Division in the Lunacy Department, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay (1)," provided, however, that the rates of pay specified in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay (2)" shall apply to officers appointed as described in the heading or the footnotes.

2. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.

3. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate, every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General of the Insane, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Department shall be paid at not more than the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any class or grade shall thereupon be deemed to be junior to any officer already in such class or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion. Officers who are transferred to the Attendants' or Nurses' staff from the Artisans' and Servants' staff, and who are in receipt of salaries at or above the maximum of the Third Grade, may be transferred to the Second Grade on the recommendation of the Inspector-General without regard to their seniority. They will, however, be required to pass the Educational and Departmental Examinations prior to being so transferred.

5. In the case of Attendants and Nurses, promotion from Grade to Grade may be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, and shall be regulated in accordance with the special regulations for Attendants and Nurses.

6. Increments may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the following Schedule, and at the rates set forth in the Schedule.

7. Where an officer previously to his transfer from one office to another has been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

8. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department and of the Inspector-General that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service.

9. If any officer is in receipt of pay greater than the maximum rate, he shall continue to receive such pay until he can be employed upon work equivalent to his salary.

10. Failure on the part of Attendants and Nurses to pass the Nursing Examinations will be taken as inefficient service, and, should the examinations not be passed, increments will not be granted.

11. *Grade II.*—Attendants who have been for two years in receipt of the maximum salary of Grade III may, on promotion to Grade II, be paid the maximum salary of that grade. Attendants who have been promoted to Grade II, and who have been paid at the rate of £144 in either Grade II or Grade III for a period of two years, may be paid at the maximum rate of Grade II.

12. If any officer be absent from duty on account of illness, and such illness shall have extended beyond seven days, no deduction shall be made from the salary of such officer on account of allowances after the expiration of such period of seven days if the officer is under medical treatment at his own home or at a general hospital. In the case of the single men and the members of the female staff, it shall be at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent as to whether the officers shall remain at the Hospital for the Insane for treatment or be allowed to leave the institution. (This Regulation to take effect from 19th March, 1913.)

SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Tullaroop, numbered 9, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and section 2 of the *Health Act 1900*, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans and yard refuse and other matter referred to therein.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1890* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, Part VII, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop make the following By-law :—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Tullaroop, but the Council of the Shire may exempt from the operation of this By-law any premises within the said shire.

3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

4. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be interchangeable, and one of which shall be provided by and remain the property of the householder, and the other of which shall be provided and owned by the Council.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid which shall be provided by the Council and removed between such hours as the Council may direct in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for each service payable to the nightman. Any amount in default to be recovered in a Court of Petty Sessions by such nightman.

6. A pan cleansed by efficient means approved by the Council shall be left in the place of the one removed.

7. Every closet shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings and flues to provide sufficient ventilation. The floor of the closet shall at no point be less than 3 inches above the natural surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with the requisite means for the application of earth or some deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

8. The night-soil removed shall be rendered inoffensive by being trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the said Council.

9. No occupier or person shall deposit in any closet-pan any house or yard rubbish or any other material other than night-soil (except for deodorizing), nor shall they damage such pan or lid in any manner.

10. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper and reasonable supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, saw-dust, or other effectual deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all such night-soil which shall be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a reasonable quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of the pan.

11. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall employ the person authorized by the Council for the removal of night-soil, and shall employ or contract for the employment of no other person (except in cases of exemption), for that purpose.

12. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the said Council over all depôts and places of deposits and premises which may be entered upon and inspected by the Council or its officer or officers from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the Council.

13. Every person offending against any one or more of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or any penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the Justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or any part (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the eleventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and confirmed and sealed this 8th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

VII No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890* or any Act amending the same, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate certain roads in the parishes of Denison and Wurruk Wurruk: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act No. 1893 aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new roads in the parishes of Denison and Wurruk Wurruk, indicated by red colour on the plan marked "A," attached to Correspondence C.13/58235, and deposited in the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, to be public highways in lieu of the existing roads in the same parishes, denoted on such plan by blue colour.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors for the Shire of Maffra for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to carry out works for the supply of the Township of Maffra with water, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That the Councillors for the Municipal District of the Shire of Maffra for the time being, and one other person, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
3. That the amount of the loan hereby granted to such Trust shall be Six thousand five hundred pounds (£6,500).
4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the north-west corner of Crown section 41, parish of Bundalaguah; thence along the western boundaries of sections 41 and 42 to the south-west angle of section 42; thence north-east

along the south boundary of section 42 for a distance of twenty-five links to the north-west corner of section 43; thence south-east along the western boundaries of sections 43, 44, and 45 to the south-western corner of section 45; thence easterly along the north shore of a lagoon forming part of the southern boundary of section 45 to the southern corner of the said section 45; thence easterly for a distance of one hundred links along the south-eastern boundary of section 45 to a Government road one chain wide, which forms the eastern boundary of the said section; thence northerly along the west side of the said road for a distance of fifty-three links along the eastern side of section 45; thence easterly for a distance of about forty-one chains along a line in the parish of Bundalaguah parallel to the south boundary of the Government subdivision known as the Township of Maffra, in the parish of Maffra, county of Tanjil, distant twelve chains south from the south side of the road which forms the southern boundary of the aforesaid Government subdivision to a point distant sixteen chains east from the production of the east side of the road which forms the eastern boundary of the said Government subdivision; thence northerly for a distance of about one hundred and two chains along a line, partly in the parish of Bundalaguah and partly in the parish of Wa De Lock parallel to and distant sixteen chains east from the east side of the road which forms the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Government subdivision to a point ten chains north of the north side of the road which forms the northern boundary of the aforesaid Government subdivision; thence westerly for a distance of about one hundred and twenty-one chains, partly in the parish of Wa De Lock and partly in the parish of Maffra, along a line parallel to and distant ten chains north from the north side of the road which forms the northern boundary of the aforesaid Government subdivision to the Macallister River; thence along the left bank of the said river south-easterly to a point in line with the north side of Station-street produced; thence along a line bearing south-east to the commencing point. 5. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of pumping plants, settling tanks, and reticulation of the township of Maffra.

METHODS OF MEASURING THE DIMENSIONS OF NETS AND OF THE MESHES OF NETS PRESCRIBED.

PROCLAMATION

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, do by this Proclamation prescribe that the methods to be adopted in measuring the dimensions of nets and of the meshes of nets shall be as follows:—

(1) Every net for the purpose of ascertaining the length thereof shall be measured along the cork line on which such net is hung, and for the purpose of ascertaining the depth shall be measured from the cork line to the lead line.

(2) The size of mesh, in every case, shall be ascertained by measuring the length between knot and knot of opposite corners, with the mesh closed. In case of dispute or doubt, a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh, in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the top and bottom knots of the mesh shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net to be measured is dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked in either fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured.

(1) That the use of "seine" nets exceeding four hundred fathoms in length shall be prohibited; that the use of "mesh" or "set" nets, or lines of such nets, exceeding seven hundred fathoms in the case of those containing meshes measuring less than four and a quarter inches, or exceeding twelve hundred fathoms in the case of those containing meshes measuring four and a quarter inches and upwards, shall be prohibited; and that no person shall use more than one fleet of net (of any class) at the same time.

(2) That the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited between Ten o'clock in the morning of every Friday and sunrise on the following Sunday.

(1) That the use of all seine nets (including garfish nets) within half a mile from the north-eastern and eastern shore, between Lyall's or Pelican Point and the Queensferry Jetty, shall be prohibited during the whole of each year.

(2) That the use of "seine" nets (including garfish nets) containing meshes measuring more than one inch and a quarter and less than one inch and a half, and of "set" or "mesh" nets containing meshes measuring less than one inch and three-quarters, shall be prohibited during the whole year.

(3) That the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited between noon on every Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

(4) That the taking of oysters shall be prohibited between midnight on every Friday and midnight on the following Sunday; and that the quantity of oysters to be taken in the "open season," by each person licensed therefor, between midnight on any Sunday and midnight on the following Friday, shall be limited to seven bags of three bushels' capacity each.

(5) That no boat having attached thereto or on board or in tow any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing (including any oyster dredge or oystering gear), shall be moved from any mooring, anchorage, wharf, or jetty between noon on any Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.

No conditional purchase lease of a Farm Allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value. This does not apply to Homestead Allotments.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

No conditional purchase lease of an Agricultural Labourer's allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £350, or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

The lessee must enclose his allotment with a substantial and sufficient fence within two years from the date of his lease unless sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1890*, and erect a house to the value of at least £30.

The lessee must reside on the estate. (Personal residence by the lessee's wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Commission.) In special cases the Commission has power to allow persons other than those above mentioned to reside for a limited period in lieu of lessee.

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

Leases will be subject to a condition providing for resumption of land required for necessary drains or channels through any allotment.

Lessees are not permitted to destroy or remove timber from the land unless by written consent of the Commission.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money, and will be subject to a condition that the owner for the time being of the land, or a member of his family over eighteen years of age, or any person approved by the Governor in Council, shall reside thereon for at least eight months in every year, and that a breach of this condition may lead to the forfeiture of the land to the Crown.

REMOVAL OF DEAD BODIES IN THE
MELBOURNE DISTRICT.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Thursday, 26th June, 1913, from persons willing to undertake Funerals of Destitute Persons at the Necropolis (Springvale) and The New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, and Removals of Dead Bodies to the Melbourne Morgue, as required by the several Departments of the Government, from 1st July, 1913, to 30th June, 1916, in the Melbourne district, which includes the following police sub-districts:—Melbourne City, Bourke-street west, Little Bourke-street, East Melbourne, West Melbourne, Albert Park, Alphington, Armadale, Ascot Vale, Auburn, Balaclava, Brunswick, Brunswick East, Brunswick West, Burnley, Camberwell, Carlton, Carlton North, Clifton Hill, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Essendon North, Fitzroy, Malvern, North Fitzroy, Flemington, Hawthorn, Hawthorn West, Hotham Hill, Kensington, Kew, Middle Park, Montague, Northcote, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Port Melbourne North, Prahran, Prince's Hill, Richmond, South Richmond, Royal Park, St. Kilda, East St. Kilda, St. Kilda West, St. Kilda-road, South Yarra, South Melbourne, South Wharf, Toorak, and Windsor. Burials of deceased persons from sub-districts north of the Yarra, with the exception of those buried in the Morgue, will take place at The New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, and those from sub-districts south of the Yarra, including burial from the Morgue, at the Springvale Necropolis respectively.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either funerals or removals, but if both services be included in one tender it may, if advisable, be accepted for one service only.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, Railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenders are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £5 for burials and £5 for removals (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete the security or sign the contract within the pre-cribed period.

Security will be required, in the sum of £25 for burials, £25 for removals, Melbourne District; and £5 Bourke District, either in cash, Victorian Government debentures, Bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the necropolis, or to the New Melbourne General Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine

timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1-inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried in the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and watertight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles.

13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

14. Under no circumstances will the contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under subsection 20 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating the keeping or storage of petroleum and other volatile fluids in or on any premises.

No greater quantity than 250 (two hundred and fifty) gallons of petroleum, or any of the products of petroleum, turpentine, kerosene, benzine, gasoline, or other similar volatile fluid, the flash point of which, according to the "Abel-Pensky" test, is not less than seventy-three degrees Fahrenheit, shall be placed, stored, or retained at any one time on any premises or in any building unless the site of such premises and the plans of the buildings thereon shall have been first approved by the Council for that purpose, and under and subject to such conditions in regard to the storage of such fluids thereon or therein as the Council may impose.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Footscray.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall for each offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not more than Twenty pounds nor less than Five pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Melbourne.

A Regulation of the City of Melbourne, numbered 1, made under section 4 of Part VI of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the City by virtue of a By-law of the above-named City, numbered 126, for appointing the times during which any registered hall or other building in the City of Melbourne used for public meetings or any registered building or any registered ground within the said City in which public amusements are conducted shall be closed.

SHIRE OF LEXTON.

A By-law of the Shire of Lexton, numbered 15, and made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within the boundaries of the said shire, for the suppression of nuisances, and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lexton order as follows:—

1. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large on any roads of the Shire of Lexton be impounded.

2. That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said shire and occupiers of land fronting the said roads shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of ten head of either or all cattle or horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

3. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Lexton, half-yearly in advance, at the rate of Eight shillings (8s.) per annum for every head of cattle and Twelve shillings (12s.) per annum for every head of horses so exempted, such payment to be a remuneration for the officer appointed by the Council as the person in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

4. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register such head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and in the case of such horses and cattle shall fasten a chain and tag to the neck of each beast in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

5. Any exemption from impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law shall not extend to any stock found wandering between sunset and sunrise within the boundaries of the following townships, viz.:—Lexton, Amphitheatre, Waubra, and Evansford. Any stock found within such boundaries, even though registered, between sunset and sunrise, will be impounded by the herdsman.

6. The Council will not be responsible or liable for loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water; and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.

7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers, free of charge, up to that limit of age.

9. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

10. The half-yearly periods shall start on the first day of July and the first day of January respectively, and owners of stock requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year shall then give to the herdsman, in the form of the schedule attached hereto, a description of the stock to be registered, and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period the exemption fee shall be Two shillings (2s.) in the case of cows and Three shillings (3s.) in the case of horses.

11. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, together with the books in which such entries are made.

12. The Council or the herdsman shall not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning lands on any situation whatever.

13. No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two (2) miles per hour, and in the case of sheep at the rate of not less than six (6) miles in each day between sunrise and sunset.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock of similar kind for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

15. The Council shall have exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious diseases to be removed from such roads; and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the herdsman or inspector of nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Violations of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
