**SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.**

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1913.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1913 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of Sunbury Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments, a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For all water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied; and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 30,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 18th June, 1913, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

REGULATION RESCINDED AND REGULATION  
MADE.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
sixteenth day of June, 1913.*

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulations XXVI and XXXV of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXV.—DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

1. District high schools shall be of two types—high schools, and agricultural high schools.

2. A district high school may be established by the Minister of Public Instruction upon the following conditions:—

(a) At least 50 qualified pupils shall be guaranteed before the proposal to establish a district high school may be entertained.

(b) Before any application for the establishment of a district high school will be entertained, an area of land which, in the opinion of the Minister, is suitable as a site for a high school, and in the case of an agricultural high school an additional area of not less than 20 acres for a school farm must be provided, and the title vested in the Minister of Public Instruction. The area of 20 acres must be situated in a position convenient to the agricultural high school.

3. An advisory council nominated by local bodies and consisting of not fewer than five or more than nine members—except in cases approved by the Honorable the Minister of Public Instruction—to be appointed by the Governor in Council, may be established for each district high school, the period of the appointment of any such member not to exceed three years.

4. Except as otherwise approved by the Minister, the duties of the advisory council for a district high school shall be—

(a) To exercise a general oversight over the buildings and grounds, and to report to the Minister the condition thereof when necessary.

(b) To promote measures for the beautifying and improvement of the school grounds, the establishment and maintenance of the school gardens and agricultural plots, the decoration and equipment of the school rooms, and the formation of a school library and museum.

(c) To take measures to foster and promote local interest in the school, and to extend its usefulness to the community.

(d) To advise the Minister in all matters pertaining to the school, more especially in any suggested developments in the course of study, and in efforts made to secure suitable employment for exit students, so as to bring the school closely into touch with the industrial interests of the district.

(e) To arrange, in conjunction with the head master, for suitable board and lodging at reasonable rates for the accommodation of resident pupils, and to exercise general supervision over such pupils.

5. The qualifications for enrolment shall be as follows:—

(a) Pupils must have passed the Qualifying Examination, or an approved equivalent examination, or a satisfactory entrance examination equal to the standard of the Qualifying Examination.

(b) They must furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good general health, and are likely to profit by a further course of study.

(c) They must be at least twelve years of age at the date of enrolment.

6. During their course in a district high school, pupils shall be required to attend lessons regularly and punctually in the subjects prescribed for their course.

7. The fees to be paid by the pupils over the age of 14 years shall be £6 per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

8. The Minister may remit the fees in the case of a pupil whose parents are not in a position to pay them, provided that such pupil shows special aptitude and promise as certified to by an inspector of schools, or by the head master of the high school which the pupil is attending.

9. The school year shall be of forty-two weeks, beginning on the first Tuesday in February, except in cases specially approved by the Director.

10. No pupil shall be enrolled after the expiration of four weeks from the commencement of the first term unless with the special sanction of the Director. Pupils may, however, be transferred from one district high school to another, or from a higher elementary school to a district high school under the same conditions as regards transfer notes as are provided in the case of pupils attending elementary schools.

11. Subject to the approval of the inspectors on their annual visits to the school, the classification of pupils, whether at their entrance or at any subsequent period of their attendance at a district high school, shall be determined by the head master of such institution.

12. The district high schools will provide a four years' course of study and such further course as the Director may from time to time prescribe.

13. During the first two years, there shall be provided in district high schools:—

(a) An industrial course leading to technical and trade pursuits.

(b) A common course for pupils intending to remain at school for four years.

14. Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the subjects forming the course of study mentioned in clause 13 (a) (b) above shall be:—

A.

INDUSTRIAL COURSE.

*First and Second Years.*

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) History and Civics.
- (3) Geography.
- (4) Mathematics.
- (5) Elementary Science.
- (6) Drawing and Modelling.
- (7) Manual Work.
- (8) Physical Training.
- (9) Class Singing.

An extended course of instruction in the above-named subjects will be provided for pupils taking a third year of the industrial course.

B.

COMMON COURSE.

*First and Second Years.*

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) (Optional) A second language—(a) Latin; (b) French; or (c) German.
- (3) Mathematics.
- (4) History and Civics.
- (5) Geography (including simple field-work).

At the beginning of the third year, the course of study for the first two years as set out in clause 14 B above will be developed into special courses, each extending over two years, and leading to the teaching profession and to courses of study at the University, to employment in the Public Service, to domestic arts, to commercial, agricultural, and higher technical pursuits. These courses may include one or more of the following or other approved courses:—

- (a) Preparatory Professional (Secondary) Course.
- (b) Commercial Course.
- (c) Domestic Arts Course.

16. COURSE (A)—PREPARATORY PROFESSIONAL (SECONDARY) COURSE.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) A second language (French, German, or Latin).
- (3) Mathematics—(a) Arithmetic; (b) Algebra; (c) Geometry; (d) Trigonometry (4th year only).
- (4) Elementary Science—Two of the following subjects to be taken:—(a) Physics; (b) Chemistry; (c) Physiology; (d) Botany; (e) Geography and Geology; (f) Nature-study (for teacher students only).

- (5) History and Civics.

- (7) Manual Work—Needlework, Woodwork, Modelling, Agriculture.
- (8) Physical Training and Hygiene.

As in the First and Second Years of the Course of Study for High Schools.

*Third and Fourth Years.*

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) Practical Mathematics for Farm Students.
- (3) History and Civics.
- (4) Geography and Physiography.
- (5) Drawing.
- (6) Manual Work—(a) Farm Carpentry; (b) Forge-work, where practicable.
- (7) Science, including a treatment of Elementary Physics, Elementary Chemistry, Nature-study (Plants and Animals) in its relation to Agricultural Pursuits.
- (8) Agriculture—(a) Principles; (b) Practical Work on the School Farm.

20. Agricultural high schools shall be under the control of the Minister, who will be assisted in the questions affecting the course of study and general policy by a committee consisting of the Minister of Agriculture, the Director of Education, and the Director of Agriculture.

21. Pupils in agricultural high schools who desire to become teachers will undertake such modified courses as the Director may, from time to time, prescribe.

22. Pupils who complete any of the courses set out in clauses 16, 17, 18, and 19 above, who pass a satisfactory examination in at least six subjects, including the compulsory subjects specified below, and who are certified to by the head master as having spent the allotted time in the study of, and as having made satisfactory progress in, the remaining subjects of the course, will be awarded an Intermediate Certificate for the course taken. The compulsory subjects are:—

- (a) *Preparatory Professional (Secondary Course).*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) Latin, or French, or German; (3) One branch of Mathematics; (4) One Science, or History, or Geography, or Drawing.
- (b) *Commercial Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) One branch of Mathematics; (3) Commercial Correspondence, or Office Routine and Business Methods, or Shorthand; (4) Bookkeeping.
- (c) *Domestic Arts Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) Physiology; (3) Cookery and Laundry Work; (4) Needlework, Dressmaking, and Millinery.

- (d) *Agricultural Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) Manual Work or Mathematics; (3) Science; (4) Agriculture.

23. In determining whether a pupil shall be awarded the Intermediate Certificate, the examiners shall take into account the marks obtained by such pupil at the terminal examination held by the head master of the school attended by the pupil during the two years immediately preceding the examination for the Intermediate Certificate, and the report of the head master upon such pupil's capacity and attainments. The examiners may also, at their discretion, call for the terminal examination papers of any pupil for the two years immediately preceding the examination for the Intermediate Certificate or the Leaving Certificate.

24. The examination for the Intermediate Certificate will be held in December of each year.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the necropolis, or to the New Melbourne General Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1-inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne General Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried in the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. 14. 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#### SHIRE OF KOWREE.

##### By-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree, made under section 197, sub-section 24, of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 11, for prohibiting the use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged projections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree order as follows:—

1. The use of barbed wire or any wire with spiked or jagged projections on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road, save and except the consent of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree shall have been first obtained, is hereby prohibited.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Apsley, Boorookpi, Edenhope, Harrow, Goroke, Gymbowen, Minimay, Toolondo, Wombelano, and within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of the said townships.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council this nineteenth day of May, 1913, and confirmed this sixteenth day of June, 1913.

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#### SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

##### By-LAW No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Nunawading, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 21, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, *viz.*:—Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof, and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Shire of Nunawading, for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the 30th day after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. (1) No person shall commence any building, or any addition to any building, without first having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the following scale:—New buildings, 4 rooms or less, 10s.; new buildings, over 4 rooms, £1. Additions to buildings:—Where the value of the addition, as estimated by the Council or its Building Surveyor, does not exceed £20, 2s.; where the value exceeds £20 but does not exceed £50, 5s.; where such value exceeds £50 but does not exceed £100, 10s.; where such value exceeds £100, £1.

(2) No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its Secretary, or Building Surveyor, the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, together with such further particulars, in writing, regarding the same, as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its Building Surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are complied with.

4. No building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used, as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

5. Except as hereinafter provided, no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used, or which shall be used, as a dwelling-house, and no addition

with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used, as a dwelling-house shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) within a distance of three feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building;
- (b) within a distance of three feet measured horizontally of and not in the same possession or occupation;
- (c) within a distance of six feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation.

Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building-line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation used or intended to be used wholly or partially as a dwelling, provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane, right-of-way, land not in the same possession or occupation, or building or erection, as the case may be, shall be of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back, and at least one foot through the roof, covering, or gutter adjoining the same.

6. The roof of every building or erection which is intended to be or shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings and approved sound boards shall be used for any external wall or walls thereof if of wood.

7. Stables, coach-houses, and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling-houses by clauses 4, 5, and 6 hereof, except that clause 5 (a) shall not apply to them as far as it relates to any lane or right-of-way.

8. (1) The main rooms in every dwelling-house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

(2) Provided, nevertheless, that the main rooms in every dwelling-house of more than one story hereafter built or rebuilt, except rooms on the ground floor, shall not be less than nine feet in height from floor to ceiling. Main rooms on the ground floor shall be subject to the preceding sub-clause hereof. Living rooms wholly or partly in the roof shall not be less than nine feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not less than one-third of the area.

(3) For the purposes of this clause the expression "Main Rooms" shall be deemed to mean rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, ordinary living-rooms, but not kitchens. The decision of the Council or of the Building Surveyor, subject to review by the Council as to whether a particular room comes within the scope of this clause or not, shall be final and conclusive.

9. The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall or may be used, as a dwelling-house shall be constructed of lath and plaster, wood, or approved fire resisting materials.

10. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, constructed, or built, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only, or as a combined shop and dwelling within the area and streets mentioned in Schedule A hereto, unless the whole of the said building or erection, of whatever material constructed, shall, in the case of the area or streets mentioned in the said Schedule, cover an area of not less than 750 square feet. In calculating the area of all such buildings or erections the area of verandahs shall be included where they are floored with approved sound boards or tiles or other approved material. In the case of any buildings or erections subject to the said Schedule which shall be two storied, the area of both floors shall be included in calculating the prescribed area of 750 square feet, but the ground floor must have an area of at least 500 square feet.

11. Every building, with the exception of buildings used for business purposes only, hereinafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space at the rear of the building of at least 500 square feet, exclusive of any buildings thereon.

12. Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt or other impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials.

13. The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

14. Two or more buildings or houses, may be erected together in one block, provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete of approved

thickness or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness projecting, in the case of wooden houses, at least one inch through the woodwork front and back, and in all cases projecting one foot at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, whether belonging to the same owner or not.

15. No shop shall be erected in the area and streets mentioned in Schedule B hereto unless the walls thereof are constructed of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone. Dwelling-rooms attached to shops may subject to this By-law be wood.

16. Clauses 4, 5, and 6 hereof shall apply to any building which is intended to be or shall be used as a shop or combined shop and dwelling, provided, nevertheless, that with the consent of the Council the said clauses, or either of them, may be modified in the case of any such building by permitting the same to abut wholly or partially on the building line of the street or road in front, or to be less than the prescribed distance therefrom.

17. No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications adopted by the Council, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than eight feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

18. No opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with approved glass, protected underneath with a fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass, to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

19. No fowlhouses shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this clause of this By-law shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

20. No privy, closet, or urinal, which is not connected with the underground sewerage system and approved by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, shall be erected at a less distance than nine feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining, or a less distance than nine feet from any street, and shall in each case be properly screened from public view. Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, or urinal may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way.

21. The distances mentioned in clauses 4, 5, 10, and 20 of this By-law shall be respectively measured from the verandah or any other projection nearest to the point at which such building may be from such other building, street, lane, right-of-way, or boundary line.

22. The Building Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law, may, and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the Building Surveyor or Shire Secretary for the time being for the inspection the original plans and specifications approved by the Council for the building demanded by him.

23. If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, by its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor, or other authorized agent, may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice, in writing, to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, by its Building Surveyor or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building, and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which such building is situate, and to demolish, and pull down the said building, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor, or other authorized agent, in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

24. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

25. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, or the Shire of Nunawading, nor to the building or construction of any building or addition in respect of which it is proved, to the satisfaction of the Council, that a material amount of work has been done on the site thereof before the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, and which building or addition shall be completed within 12 months of such date.

26. Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

27. Except where a different intention is expressed herein this By-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the whole of the Surrey Hills, Box Hill, Blackburn, and Mitcham Ridings of the Shire of Nunawading.

28. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the Council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, declare that clauses 4 and 11 hereof, either in the whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building.

29. In this By-law, save where the context is inconsistent therewith, "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Nunawading.

"Secretary" means the Shire Secretary or Acting Shire Secretary for the time being of the said Shire.

"Building Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor or Acting Building Surveyor for the time being of the said Shire.

"Approved" means approved by the Building Surveyor subject to review by the Council.

"Dwelling-house" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

"Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers, and offices of agents and auctioneers. A *bona fide* private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.

"Street" or "road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1903*, section 3.

"Lane" or "right-of-way" means a street or road less than 33 feet wide.

(2) Carts and carter's, 50 and clauses following up to 74, both inclusive. (3) Boats and boatmen, 75 and clauses following up to 86, both inclusive. (4) Porters, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91.
