ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million eight hundred and sixteen thousand six hundred and three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fourteen and One thousand nine hundred and fifteen.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

SHIRE OF BANNOCKBURN.

By-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Bannockburn, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 10.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Bannockburn order as follows:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the townships of Bannockburn, Inverleigh, and Lethbridge, and shall apply to the township of Lethbridge and to the Bannockburn and Inverleigh sanitary areas set out below.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the Council at cost price.

4. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

6. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street.

7. Once at least in every week, or so much more frequently as the Council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid and removed in the day-time to such place as the said Council may have appointed.

No one except the person authorized by the said Council shall be employed to remove the same.

8. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable for every such offence to pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

9. All former By-laws on the matter and things herein provided are hereby repealed.

Bannockburn Sanitary Area.

10. Whole of township of Bannockburn together with that portion of land bounded on the north by the

southern township boundary; on the south by the Cemetery-road to a point, where, if this road were extended, it would meet the Bannockburn-Inverleigh road; on the west by the Bannockburn-Inverleigh road; on the east by the road that bounds the township on the east, together with allotment 34 and any houses on section XIX., parish of Waddallah.

Inverleigh Sanitary Area.

11. Whole of township of Inverleigh, together with that portion of land beginning at the junction of Barwon and Leigh Rivers; thence bounded on south by Barwon River till allotment 29c, parish of Carrah, is reached; thence northerly along the west boundary of this allotment till the main road is reached; thence north-westerly along the eastern boundary of allotments 14 and 13, parish of Carrah; thence south-westerly along the northern boundaries of allotments 14 and 15, parish of Carrah; then southerly to the Barwon River at its boundary line between allotments 20 and 21, parish of Carrah.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Bannockburn on the thirteenth day of January, 1914, and confirmed on this 10th day of February, 1914.

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. CONNIBERE, GRIEVE, & CONNIBERE, HAT MAKERS, 3-9 HOWARD-STREET, WEST MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 8th July, 1914, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

By-law No. 15, Making a Rate for 1914.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements within the District of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1914, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1914.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

WARBURTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.

THE Warburton Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1914.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of £25 or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under £25 sterling, the minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

4th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

5th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of under Ten pounds sterling (£10), the minimum sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

6th. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, or plastering.

*Education Act 1890.*REGULATION RESCINDED, REGULATION
SUBSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXXV.—District High Schools—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXV.—DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

Establishment of District High Schools.

1. District high schools shall be of two types—high schools, and agricultural high schools.

2. A district high school may be established by the Minister of Public Instruction upon the following conditions:—

(a) At least 50 qualified pupils shall be guaranteed before the proposal to establish a district high school may be entertained.

(b) Before any application for the establishment of a district high school will be entertained, an area of land which, in the opinion of the Minister, is suitable as a site for a high school, and in the case of an agricultural high school an additional area of not less than 20 acres for a school farm must be provided, and the title vested in the Minister of Public Instruction. The area of 20 acres must be situated in a position convenient to the agricultural high school.

Advisory Councils.

3. An advisory council consisting of not fewer than five nor more than nine members—except in cases approved by the Honorable the Minister of Public Instruction—may be appointed by the Governor in Council, for each district high school. Each council will be appointed for a period of three years, beginning from 1st July, 1914.

NOTE.—Advisory councils appointed prior to 1st July, 1914, will continue in office till 30th June, 1917.

4. Except as otherwise approved by the Minister, the duties of the advisory council for a district high school shall be—

- (a) To exercise a general oversight over the buildings and grounds, and to report to the Minister the condition thereof when necessary.
- (b) To promote measures for the beautifying and improvement of the school grounds, the establishment and maintenance of the school

gardens and agricultural plots, the decoration and equipment of the school rooms, and the formation of a school library and museum.

(c) To take measures to foster and promote local interest in the school, and to extend its usefulness to the community.

(d) To advise the Minister in all matters pertaining to the school, more especially in any suggested developments in the course of study, and in efforts made to secure suitable employment for exit pupils, so as to bring the school closely into touch with the industrial interests of the district.

(e) To arrange, in conjunction with the head master, for suitable board and lodging at reasonable rates for the accommodation of resident pupils, and to exercise general supervision over such pupils.

(f) To expend the maintenance allowance granted to the school, and in the case of agricultural high schools the maintenance allowance for the farm, and to exercise such supervision as the Minister may authorize over the farm operations.

(g) The advisory council of any agricultural high school may nominate qualified pupils for free instruction in the agricultural course in that school, provided that the number of pupils so nominated in any year shall not exceed ten per cent. of the total number of students paying full fees enrolled in that year.

(h) Advisory councils of district high schools shall have all the powers assigned by regulation to school committees in elementary schools as regards—

- (i.) Use of school buildings;
- (ii.) Works that may be done under the direction of school committees;
- (iii.) Relations to teachers.

5. Advisory councils are authorized to incur expenditure on the high school buildings and grounds in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister to an amount not exceeding £20 in each year. Payments will be made by the Education Department upon presentation of claims setting forth clearly the character of the work done, and certified by the chairman or the secretary of the council.

NOTE.—This clause will come into operation on 1st July, 1914.

6. The accounts for each advisory council will be made up to the 30th June in each year, when all unexpended balances will lapse.

7. Advisory councils shall meet at least six times in each year, and any member absent without reasonable excuse from three consecutive meetings to which he has been duly summoned, shall thereby forfeit his seat on the council.

8. Whenever during the triennial period for which an advisory council is appointed a vacancy occurs through death, resignation, forfeiture of seat or other cause, the council may nominate some suitable person to fill such vacancy. If the nomination is approved by the Minister, such person shall hold office until the triennial period has expired for which the council was appointed.

9. Three members of the council shall form a quorum.

10. The qualifications for enrolment shall be as follows:—

(a) Pupils must have passed the Qualifying Examination, or an approved equivalent examination, or a satisfactory entrance examination equal to the standard of the Qualifying Examination.

(b) They must furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good general health, and are likely to profit by a further course of study.

11. During their course in a district high school, pupils shall be required to attend lessons regularly and punctually in the subjects prescribed for their course.

12. The fees to be paid by the pupils over the age of 14 years shall be £6 per annum, payable for each term in advance.

13. (a) The Minister may remit the fees in the case of a pupil whose parents are not in a position to pay them, provided that such pupil shows special aptitude and promise as certified to by an inspector of schools, or by the head master of the high school which the pupil is attending.

(b) If he considers the circumstances warrant it the Minister may make grants in aid of school requisites up to £2 per annum, and of travelling expenses up to £5 per annum, or of maintenance up to £26 per annum, to any pupil in a district high school or higher elementary school, but no grant in aid of maintenance shall be paid in respect of any pupil who has not obtained the Merit Certificate or an approved equivalent, and as a general rule no such allowance shall be paid except where it is necessary for the pupil to reside apart from his parents. In every case of a grant under this clause the parents or guardians of the pupil concerned must show by statutory declaration their income during the previous year.

14. The school year shall be divided into three terms, and shall be of forty-two weeks, beginning on the first Tuesday in February, except in cases specially approved by the Director.

15. No pupil shall be enrolled after the expiration of four weeks from the commencement of the first term unless with the special sanction of the Director. Pupils may, however, be transferred from one district high school to another, or from a higher elementary school to a district high school under the same conditions as regards transfer notes as are provided in the case of pupils attending elementary schools.

16. Subject to the approval of the inspectors on their annual visits to the school, the classification of pupils, whether at their entrance or at any subsequent period of their attendance at a district high school, shall be determined by the head master of such institution.

Courses of Study in High Schools.

17. The district high schools will provide a four years' course of study and such further course as the Director may from time to time prescribe.

18. During the first two years, there may be provided in district high schools:—

(a) An industrial course leading to technical and trade pursuits.

(b) A common course for pupils intending to remain at school for four years.

19. Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the subjects forming the course of study mentioned in clause 18 (a) (b) above shall be:—

A.

INDUSTRIAL COURSE.

First and Second Years.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) History and Civics.
- (3) Geography.
- (4) Mathematics.
- (5) Elementary Science.
- (6) Drawing and Modelling.
- (7) Manual Work.
- (8) Physical Training.
- (9) Class Singing.

An extended course of instruction in the above-named subjects will be provided for pupils taking a third year of the industrial course.

B.

COMMON COURSE.

First and Second Years.

- (1) English Language and Literature.
- (2) (Optional) A second language—(a) Latin; (b) French; or (c) German.
- (3) Mathematics.
- (4) History and Civics.
- (5) Geography (including simple field-work).
- (6) Elementary Science.

20. At the beginning of the third year, the course of study for the first two years as set out in clause 91B above will be developed into special courses, each extending over two years, and leading to the teaching profession, and to courses of study at the University, to employment in the Public Service, to domestic arts, to commercial, agricultural, and higher technical pursuits. These courses may include one or more of the following or other approved courses:—

- (a) Preparatory Professional (Secondary) Course.
- (b) Commercial Course.
- (c) Domestic Arts Course.

- (2) Practical Mathematics for Farm Students.

- (6) Manual Work—(a) Farm Carpentry; (b) Forge-work, where practicable.
- (7) Science, including a treatment of Elementary Physics, Elementary Chemistry, Nature-study (Plants and Animals) in its relation to Agricultural Pursuits.
- (8) Agriculture—(a) Principles; (b) Practical Work on the School Farm.

25. Agricultural high schools shall be under the control of the Minister, who will be assisted in the questions affecting the course of study and general policy by a committee consisting of the Minister of Agriculture, the Director of Education, and the Director of Agriculture.

26. Pupils in agricultural high schools who desire to become teachers will undertake such modified courses as the Director may, from time to time, prescribe.

27. Pupils who complete any of the courses set out in clauses 21, 22, 23, and 24 above, who pass a satisfactory examination in at least six subjects, including the compulsory subjects specified below, and who are certified to by the head master as having spent the allotted time in the study of, and as having made satisfactory progress in, the remaining subjects of the course, will be awarded an Intermediate Certificate for the course taken. The compulsory subjects are:—

- (a) *Preparatory Professional (Secondary Course).*—(1) English language and Literature; (2) Latin, or French, or German; (3) One branch of Mathematics; (4) One Science, or History, or Geography, or Drawing.
- (b) *Commercial Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) One branch of Mathematics; (3) Commercial Correspondence, or Office Routine and Business Methods, or Shorthand; (4) Bookkeeping.
- (c) *Domestic Arts Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) Physiology; (3) Cookery and Laundry Work; (4) Needlework, Dressmaking, and Millinery.
- (d) *Agricultural Course.*—(1) English Language and Literature; (2) Manual Work or Mathematics; (3) Science; (4) Agriculture.

28. In determining whether a pupil shall be awarded the Intermediate Certificate, the examiners shall take into account the marks obtained by such pupil at the terminal examinations held by the head master of the school attended by the pupil during the two years immediately preceding the examination for the Intermediate Certificate, and the report of the head master upon such pupil's capacity and attainments. The examiners may also, at their discretion, call for the terminal examination papers of any pupil for the two years immediately preceding the examination for the Intermediate Certificate or the Leaving Certificate.

29. The examination for the Intermediate Certificate will be held in December of each year.

NOTE.—The first examination will be held in December, 1915.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TRAMWAYS IN THE CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

WHITEHORSE-ROAD LINE.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the Council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the City of Camberwell has made an application, under the common seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said City of Camberwell: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Council of the municipality of the City of Camberwell shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Town of Camberwell.

ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—

Commencing at the intersection of Whitehorse-road and Burke-road (the western boundary of the municipality) thence easterly along Whitehorse-road to Union-road.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 8 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway, with hand-brake equipment on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power-brakes and life guards, the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of twelve (12) months from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and their luggage only.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the Council of the said municipality.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway shall be the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

- (a) For the section between Burke-road and Balwyn-road, and *vice versa*—One penny.
- (b) For the section between Balwyn-road and Union-road and *vice versa*—One penny.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for one or two sections.

That power be given to the Council to enter into arrangements with the Council of the Town of Kew or other authority conferring the right to provide for a penny overlapping section on the tramways of the Council and the tramways of the Council of the Town of Kew.

CONTINUOUS SECTIONS.

That power is also given to the Council to enter into arrangements with the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, or other authority or authorities, conferring the right to charge for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Council and the tramways of the said Trust and the tramways of any other authority or authorities, an entire fare of Twopence (2d.) for any three continuous sections, of which one is on the tramways of the Council, and two are on the tramways of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, or any other authority or authorities, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four (4) years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three sections referred to.

That power is also given to the Council to enter into arrangements with the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, or other authority or authorities, conferring the right to charge for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Council and the tramways of the said Trust, and the tramways of any other authority or authorities, an entire fare of Threepence (3d.) for any four continuous sections, of which one is on the tramways of the Council and three are on the tramways of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, or any other authority or authorities, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Twopence (2d.) for any four sections referred to.

COMBINED FARES OVER LINES IN CITIES OF CAMBERWELL, CAULFIELD, HAWTHORN, MALVERN, AND ST. KILDA, AND TOWN OF KEW.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into arrangements with any of the Councils of the Cities of Caulfield, Hawthorn, Malvern, and St. Kilda, the Town of Kew, and the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust conferring the right to charge an entire fare of not less than Sixpence (6d.), and not exceeding Sevenpence (7d.) for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Council and the tramways of any of the Councils of the Cities of Caulfield, Hawthorn, Malvern, and St. Kilda, the Town of Kew, and

the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, from the terminus at the corner of Whitehorse-road and Union-road, Camberwell, to the terminus at the corner of Carlisle-street and Ackland-street, St. Kilda, or *vice versa*, or from further entering into arrangements with the said Councils and the said Trust conferring the right to charge an entire fare of not less than Threepence (3d.) and not exceeding Fourpence (4d.) for such continuous trip for each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free.)

SPECIAL CABS.

That the charge to be made for the hire of a special car with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons shall be 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.

That the charge to be made for the hire of a special car with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons shall be 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot till its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of sixteen years over any two sections shall be One penny, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Council may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

Tramway where passing over Outer Circle Railway Line at Whitehorse-road, Deepdene, to be under control of Railways Commissioners, &c.

(a) That in respect of the tramway crossing over the Outer Circle Railway at Whitehorse-road, Deepdene, the Council shall defray the whole cost of the tramway crossing over the railway line, and one-half of the cost of the interlocked gates and signals, and of such other interlocking, catch points, and safety appliances as may be necessary in connexion with such crossing:

(b) That the Council shall reimburse the Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, and one-half of the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of the gates, signals, interlocking catch points, and other safety appliances:

(c) That the Council shall reimburse the Commissioners one-half of the cost of the wages and expense of the signalmen required to operate the gates and signals, less the cost (£58 per annum) previously incurred by the Commissioners as the remuneration of the Gate-keeper of the crossing:

(d) That the tramway shall, so far as regards its use, running, and maintenance on or across the lines of the Commissioners, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such By-laws, Regulations, and Orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injury which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said tramway crossing the railway line except such damage or injury arise from the negligence or default of the Commissioners, and the tramway service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements:

(e) That in the event of the regrading of the line between East Camberwell and Deepdene, the municipality shall pay to the Commissioners such sum of money towards the cost of the regrading as may be determined by the Governor in Council, having regard to the benefits which will arise from the abolition of the level crossing: provided that such contribution shall not exceed the capitalized amount of the annual value of the benefits to the municipality earned by the abolition of the level crossing, and that, in arriving at the value of such benefits, any expenditure incurred by the municipality in the alteration of road levels as the result of the regrading of the line shall be taken into consideration:

(f) That in the event of the adoption of electric traction for the purpose of operating the trains on the Deepdene and Ashburton railway line the municipality or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall

bear one-half of the cost of any special work or works in connexion with the electrical plant and equipment of the railways or of the tramway which in the opinion of the Commissioners may be necessary in order to provide for the safe working of the railways and tramway traffic over the railway line on the level, but the municipality or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall not be entitled to a reimbursement of the cost of any such special work in the event of the subsequent construction of a bridge to carry the vehicular and tramway traffic over or under the railway line and in such event the municipality or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall also bear the cost of any other work or works or alterations which may be necessary to the tramway line in consequence thereof.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would, if placed above ground, cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or be in a position likely, if special precautions are not taken, to prejudicially affect telegraphic or telephonic communication on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded and maintained as not to be capable of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into any agreement with the Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the City of Camberwell shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure,

and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Frederick Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF YARRA PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors in respect of Yarra Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of the Tennis Courts in Yarra Park:—

YARRA PARK TENNIS COURTS.

Regulations for the Management of the Courts.

1. The tennis courts in the park shall be open from Six a.m. to sunset from the 1st October to 31st March, and from sunrise to sunset from 1st April to 30th September. The courts will not be open on Sundays.

2. The charges for playing on the courts are as follow:—

Monthly tickets for males, 2s. 6d.; for females, 2s.

For casual players—

Per set—Singles, 3d.

„ Doubles, 6d.

3. The caretaker at the lodge, Yarra Park, is authorized to issue tickets and collect payment from all persons using the courts.

4. Players using the courts must exhibit their tickets at any time when requested to do so by the caretaker or by any officer or employé of the Trustees.

5. All players using the courts shall have equal rights in regard to playing thereon.

6. Players upon arrival must register their names on the notice boards at the courts.

7. The right to play shall be in the order of registration on the board.

8. Should other players be waiting to play on the courts in their turn, the players then using the courts must make way for them at the conclusion of the set then being played.

9. Tennis shoes must be worn by all persons using the courts.

10. Dressing rooms are provided for males and females, and these must be used only by players of the sex for which they are set apart.

11. Onlookers must not trespass on the courts, or dressing-rooms, nor interfere with persons playing on the courts.

Each person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TARNAGULLA BOROUGH COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the eighth day of January, 1902, the Council of the Borough of Tarnagulla, as Managers of the Tarnagulla Borough Common, having drafted the following substituted and additional Regulation for the management thereof in lieu of Regulations 4, 7, and 8 of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 29th day of May, 1894, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATION.

Every person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any stock on the common, give to the herdsman a true and correct description of such stock and their brands and other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate of having done so, and shall at the same time obtain a badge and chain from the herdsman—both of which shall be the absolute property of the managers—for any number of stock he wishes to depasture. He shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for that number from the time the herdsman delivers the badge or badges to him to the date of delivery of same back to the herdsman. No person shall use other than registered badges in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the common. Should the badge or badges aforesaid be from any cause removed from the stock they must be at once replaced at the expense of the person depasturing, and shall be supplied by the herdsman at a cost of One shilling each: and any person who shall place or allow to be placed a chain and badge on any stock without the authority of the herdsman shall be liable to be prosecuted.

Every person offending against the foregoing Regulation shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

SHIRE OF BALLAN.

BY-LAW No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Ballan, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ballan order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use, or cause or procure any other person to use, on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections:—

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last mentioned case—

(i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(ii.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf), to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted, in legible letters not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself Sufficient Motive Power to Move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motor power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain Parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use, or cause or procure to be used, on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The owner of every carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle, being driven or stopping during such driving in any street, road, or other public place within the Shire of Ballan, after sunset on any day, and before sunrise on the following day, shall cause such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle to be provided with proper lamps, securely fixed and kept properly trimmed and ready for lighting, and the driver or person in charge of such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle between sunset on any day, and sunrise on the following day, shall cause such lamps to be properly lighted, and to be kept lighted whilst such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle is being so used.

2. The driver or person in charge of every carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle being driven or stopping during such driving in any street, road, or other public place within the said Shire after sunset on any day, and before sunrise on the following day, shall keep a light attached to or suspended from the off or right side of such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle so as to be plainly visible to the driver or person in charge of any carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle proceeding along or through such street, road, or other public place, whether in the same or a contrary direction to that in which such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle is being driven or stopped in the course of being so driven, so as to indicate to the front and rear the approach or position of such carriage, cart, waggon, dray, or other vehicle.

3. Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole municipal district.
