PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.; Vice-Admiral of the State of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the *Prize Courts Act 1894* it is enacted that when any commission warrant or instructions from His Majesty the King or the Admiralty for the purpose of commissioning or regulating the procedure of a prize court at any place in a British Possession have been issued, then, subject to instructions from His Majesty the Vice-Admiral of such possession may when satisfied by information from a Secretary of State or otherwise that war has broken out between His Majesty and any foreign State, proclaim that war has so broken out, and that thereupon the said commission warrant and instructions shall take effect as if the same had been issued after the breaking out of such war and such foreign State were named therein:

And whereas on the tenth day of July in the sixty-third year of Her reign Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to issue a commission to certain commissioners therein named authorizing and enjoining the said commissioners to will and require such courts (including among others courts of law being Colonial Courts of Admiralty within the meaning of the *Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act 1890*) as the said commissioners shall select, upon proclamation being made in that part of Her Majesty's Dominions Possessions or Colonies within which such court has jurisdiction in Admiralty by the Vice-Admiral thereof, that war has broken out between Her Majesty and some foreign State or States and not otherwise, to take cognisance of and judicially to proceed upon all and all manner of captures, recaptures, seizures, prizes, reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods then already seized and taken, and which thereafter shall be seized and taken, and all other matters of prize falling within the jurisdiction of Prize Courts, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the course of Admiralty, and the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations in that behalf for the time being in force, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the State or States named in the Proclamation aforesaid, or to the subjects of such State or States, or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of such State or States, or be otherwise condemnable as prize:

And whereas by warrant dated the second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, the said commissioners did in His Majesty's name will and

require the Supreme Court of Victoria in its Admiralty Jurisdiction and the Judge of the said Court and all others the Judges or Judge for the time being of the said Court, or other the persons or person executing the duties of the office of Judge of the said Court for the time being, upon proclamation being made by the Vice-Admiral for the time being of Victoria that war has broken out between His Majesty and any foreign State, and not otherwise, to take cognisance of and judicially to proceed upon all and all manner of captures, recaptures, seizures, prizes, and reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods which shall on the outbreak of any such war have been already seized and taken, and which shall thereafter be seized and taken, and which are or shall be brought within the limits of the said court, and all other matters of prize falling within the jurisdiction of the said court, and to hear and determine the same according to the course of Admiralty and the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations in that behalf for the time being in force, to adjudge and condemn all such ships vessels and goods as shall belong to the foreign State named in such proclamation or to the subjects of such State, or to any others inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the same or which are otherwise condemnable as prize, and which shall be brought before the said Supreme Court of Victoria in its Admiralty Jurisdiction as a Court under the *Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act 1890* for adjudication and condemnation:

And whereas by the *Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act 1890* it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall affect any power of appointing a Vice-Admiral in and for any British Possession or any place therein, and that whenever there is not a formally appointed Vice-Admiral in a British Possession or any place therein the Governor of the Possession shall be *ex officio* Vice-Admiral thereof:

And whereas there is not a formally appointed Vice-Admiral in the State of Victoria:

Now therefore I, Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, the Vice-Admiral for the time being of Victoria, being satisfied thereof by information received by me, do hereby proclaim that war has broken out between His Majesty the King and the German Emperor.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying:

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests:

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time; latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated

not more than twelve months previously, from such Board: provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1896, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913: or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 440.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.—DINGEE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in Dingee Irrigation and Water Supply District.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or

absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement, the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such period; and if a supply is obtained in excess of any Water Rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as Rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which Water Rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1914) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring water.

7. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands shall be:—

During the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of May in every year (beginning with the year 1915)—Six shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

During the period from the 1st day of June to the 31st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1915)—Two shillings and sixpence for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

8. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law, and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

9. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

10. Charges for water supplied for irrigation other than water supplied under a Water Right shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

11. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

12. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

13. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XII.—Teachers' College; XII. (b)—Trained Teacher's Certificate Manual Arts; XII. (c) Courses in Domestic Arts for Women Teachers—of the Regulations under the *Education Act* 1890, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

- Regulation XII.—(a) Teachers College;
 " (b) Short Course of Training;
 " (c) Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts;
 " (d) Trained Teacher's Certificate—Manual Arts.

REGULATION XII.(A).—TEACHERS' COLLEGE—
COURSES.

1. The members of the Teachers' College shall be a principal, two vice-principals, masters and mistresses of method, lecturers, and students. The students in attendance at the College shall be:—

- (a) Studentship holders—those to whom the course of instruction is free.
 (b) Students who pay the fees hereinafter prescribed.

2. Training will be conducted in the College and at the University of Melbourne and in such other institutions as the Director may determine. Practising schools for the training of students in teaching shall be associated with the College, and training therein shall be conducted under the supervision of the Principal and such officers of the College as he may appoint.

3. The duration of the courses of training shall be:—

- (a) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate—3 years.
 (b) Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—2 years (of which only the second is spent at the College).
 (c) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—2 years.

4 (a) Awards of studentships will be made annually by the Director in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

(b) The number of studentships to be awarded for each of the certificates mentioned in clause 3 above shall be determined annually by the Director.

TRAINED SECONDARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

5. The qualifications for studentships admitting to the first year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age on the 1st of February of the year in which they desire to enter upon the course.
 (b) Applicants must have passed the Senior Public or the Leaving Certificate examination or hold an approved equivalent qualification.

(c) Applicants must have had at least one year's teaching experience in an approved school and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

6. Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or the third year of the course may at the discretion of the Principal be admitted to the year for which they are qualified, provided that any such applicant who has not had sufficient preliminary teaching experience may be required to spend a year upon the staff of a school, and during this year, if employed in a State school, he shall be paid the salary of a junior teacher of the second class.

7. When the number of applicants qualified as in clause 5 above exceeds the number of vacancies at the College, awards of studentships will be determined by a consideration of:—

- (a) The number and standard of the subjects passed. (Studentships will be distributed among applicants specially qualified, in the following groups:—English and history, mathematics, science, modern languages classics).
 (b) The records of the applicants as teachers.
 (c) Length of service and age of applicant.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in the above clauses, holders of senior scholarships under the provisions of Regulation XXI. may enter at once upon the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate.

9. The course of training for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be the course for the Diploma of Education at the Melbourne University, together with a course in drawing, music, manual work, and physical training.

TRAINED PRIMARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

10. The qualification for studentships admitting to the first year of the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age on the 1st of February of the year in which they desire to enter upon the course.
 (b) Except as hereinafter provided applicants must have passed the Matriculation examination (including a pass in the subject of arithmetic) or hold an approved equivalent qualification.
 (c) Except as hereinafter provided applicants must have had at least one year's teaching experience in an approved school, and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 10 (c) above, applicants who have spent at least a year in a district high school in qualifying for the Senior Public examination may be awarded a studentship without having served a year as a junior teacher in a school.

12. The first year of the course for Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate will be spent in gaining further experience as teachers on the staff of a school, and during this year persons awarded studentships shall be paid the salary of a junior teacher of the second class; but if, prior to the award, they are receiving a higher salary they shall during this year continue to receive the salary they were receiving at the time of nomination. They will also be required to attend classes in such subjects as the Director may from time to time determine.

13. Applicants who have had at least two years' service as teachers, and who have passed the Junior Public examination, and are at least eighteen years of age, may be awarded studentships and then be required to spend the first year of training in an approved district high school undergoing such course of study as the Director may determine.

14. (a) The course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate shall extend over two years, the first of which shall be spent either as a teacher on the staff of a school or as a student in an approved district high school. But studentship holders who have served for at least two years as teachers may be permitted to enter at once on the second year of the course.

(b) The course for the second year shall include:—

(i) *Professional Subjects.*

1. Regular and continuous practice in teaching and observation, extending over at least 150 hours, of which at least 30 hours shall be devoted to a study of country school organization and methods.
2. Attendance and taking part in criticism and demonstration lessons.
3. Psychology and theory and history of education.
4. Methods of teaching English and English literature, mathematics, science and agriculture, nature study, history and geography.
5. Blackboard work—writing and illustration.
6. Hygiene.
7. Voice culture.
8. Physical training.

(ii) *Culture Subjects.*

1. English literature.
2. History (including European history).
3. Choral singing and music.
4. Drawing.
5. Manual arts.
6. Nature study and physiography.

TRAINED INFANT TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

15. The qualifications for studentships admitting to the first year of the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age on the 1st of February of the year in which they desire to enter the course;
- (b) Applicants must have passed the Junior Public or the Intermediate Certificate examination or hold an approved equivalent qualification;
- (c) Applicants must have had at least two years' teaching experience in an approved school, and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

16. The course of training for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate shall, except as hereinafter provided, extend over a period of two years.

First Year's Course.

1. Psychology and child study.
2. Kindergarten principles and Biography.
3. Management and method of kindergarten.
4. English literature.
5. Voice production, physical training, games.
6. Music—Singing (theory and practice), instrumental music.
7. Drawing.
8. Kindergarten gifts, and occupations; needlework.
9. Nature study.
10. Practice and observation in the kindergarten and infant school extending over at least 200 hours.

Second Year's Course.

1. Psychology and child study.
2. Mother play.
3. History and principles of education.
4. Infant school management, method and organization; country school method and organization.
5. Art studies, myths, stories and storytelling.

6. Voice production, physical training, games, drills.
7. Music—Singing (theory and practice), instrumental music.
8. Drawing.
9. Gifts and occupations, needlework.
10. Nature study and gardening.
11. Hygiene.
12. Practice and observation as for First Year, but mainly taken with sub-primary grades, and extending over at least 200 hours.

METHODS OF AWARD OF STUDENTSHIPS.

17. When the number of qualified applicants for studentships at the Teacher's College in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate under clause 10 or the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate under clause 15 exceeds the number of studentships to be awarded, studentships will be awarded in order of merit determined by the following considerations:—

- (a) The number and standard of the subjects passed in examinations by the applicants.
- (b) The records of the applicants as teachers.
- (c) Length of service and age of applicants.

ALLOWANCES.

18. (a) Persons awarded studentships under clause 13 above who are spending a year in an approved district high school will receive free tuition and an allowance at the rate of £30 per annum.

(b) Holders of studentships may be allowed to reside at the College upon the payment of £12 per annum towards the expense of their board and residence. In the event of the holder of such studentship not being in a position to pay the amount above stipulated (viz., £12 for each year during the currency of his studentship), the Minister may allow him, on his entering into a bond by himself and an approved surety, to pay such amount at such time and in such instalments as the Minister may determine.

(c) Holders of studentships who do not reside at the Teachers' College will be entitled to an allowance at the rate of £18 per annum towards board and residence.

(d) Holders of studentships will be granted an allowance at the rate of £12 per annum towards defraying their personal expenses during the currency of their studentships.

(e) The provisions of sub-clauses (b), (c), and (d) of this clause shall not apply to those holders of studentships who are also holders of senior scholarships under the provisions of Regulation XXI.

AGREEMENT TO SERVE.

19. Every person awarded a studentship will be required as a condition of such studentship to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and, for four years after the termination of his studentship, to teach in any school to which he may be appointed. Women students may, in the event of their marriage, be permitted to resign at the expiration of three years' service after the termination of their studentships.

EXAMINATIONS.

20. Examinations in the subjects of the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and of the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and in such subjects of the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate as are not provided for in the course for the Diploma of Education shall be conducted by the Board of Examiners for the College appointed for the purpose by the Director, and composed of representatives of the College staff and of external examiners.

21. Students who complete successfully any of the courses set out under clauses 9, 14, and 16 above shall be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate for that course, but in no case shall the certificate be issued to any student till such student has satisfactorily performed the duties of a teacher for a period of two years after the termination of his studentship.

22. (a) Any student who is a candidate for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, and who fails to pass in either the first or second year of his course may at the discretion of the Board of Examiners for the College be allowed to enter upon the second year of the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, and upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects for this year of the course shall be regarded as having completed such course, or such student may have his studentship suspended for one or more years in order that he may, at his own expense, complete such first or second year of his course. Any student who fails to pass in the third year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate may, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners be permitted to complete the course at his own expense, or he may apply to the Board to review the examinations and tests he has passed during his course of training, in order to determine if he has qualified for a pass in the second year of the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.

(b) Any student who fails to pass in not more than two subjects of the first year for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, but who shows satisfactory progress during that year, may, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners for the College, be allowed to enter upon the course for the second year, and upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of such year of the course may be regarded as having completed the course.

(c) Students who at the end of their course of training have failed to pass in any subject or subjects prescribed for a Trained Teacher's Certificate may be allowed to present themselves in such subject or subjects at any examination for such Trained Teacher's Certificate.

EXTENSION OF STUDENTSHIPS.

23. (a) Students, not exceeding six in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training, may be selected to undertake a further course for one or two years under such conditions as the Director may from time to time determine.

(b) Students, not exceeding ten in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training, may have their studentships extended for one year for the purpose of undertaking a special course in some branch or branches of study, and of attending such courses of study as the Director may determine.

(c) Students, not exceeding four in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training, may be appointed as teachers to act for this purpose for one year upon the staffs of practising and observation schools connected with the Teachers' College, or to assist in the work of the College. During this year they may be required to attend such classes of instruction as the Director may determine, and they shall be paid the salary to which they are entitled according to their classification as teachers.

(d) Each year two students of the College will be selected, by reason of special merit and aptitude, to undertake at the University the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science. During the currency of this course such students will

retain all the rights and privileges of studentship holders in the matter of status and allowances. They will spend the fourth year of this course at Dookie College or other institution recommended by the Professor of Agriculture, and the cost of their maintenance during this year will be defrayed by the Council of Agricultural Education.

24. In special cases any person awarded a studentship may have his studentship suspended for one year, at the discretion of the Director, but shall not be entitled to any rights and privileges as a studentship holder other than those accruing to him in virtue of his original studentship.

FEES FOR STUDENTS NOT HOLDERS OF STUDENTSHIPS.

25. (a) Students, other than holders of studentships, on payment of a fee of £6 6s. per annum to the Accountant of the Education Department, and £6 6s. per annum to the University of Melbourne, may be admitted to the course of instruction at the College for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, provided that they have passed the Matriculation examination, and are at least seventeen years of age, and are of good character and physique.

(b) Students, other than studentship holders may, on payment of a fee of £10 10s. per annum, be admitted to the course of instruction to the second year of the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate. The above fee must be paid to the Accountant of the Education Department, and the receipts presented at the Training College on or before the first day of each College term. Students admitted under this sub-clause must be at least seventeen years of age, of good character and physique, and must have passed the Junior Public examination or an approved equivalent examination.

(c) Persons, other than students specified above, may, on payment of a fee of £5 5s. per annum to the Accountant, Education Office, Melbourne, and £5 5s. per annum to the Treasurer, Free Kindergarten Union of Victoria, be admitted to the course of instruction for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate at the College. Students admitted under the provisions of this sub-clause must be at least seventeen years of age on the date of entry, of good character and physique, and must have passed the Junior Public or other examination deemed an equivalent by the Education Department.

(d) Students may be admitted to the College for portions of any of the courses mentioned in clause 3. The fees payable for subjects not taken at the University are:—

- (1) For education (theory and practice), £6 6s. per annum;
- (2) For other subjects, £1 1s. per annum.

26. Special students, such as graduates of the University, holders of the Infant Teacher's Certificate (First Class), or persons holding Trained Teacher's Certificates entitling them to registration as primary or secondary teachers, may be allowed to complete the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate in one year. Such students will be required to pass in the subjects of the second year's course and in hygiene, and in gifts and occupations of the first year's course, and will be required also to pass the tests in practice of teaching prescribed for both years.

27. Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who have attended a course of instruction and training specified above, and who have complied with the conditions prescribed, will be admitted to the final examination for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, as the case may be, without further payment.

28. Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who qualify for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or

for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, will be awarded certificates, but such certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment in State schools. Such persons, however, are eligible to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions in State schools as classified teachers.

DISCIPLINE.

29. Students will be required to attend such lectures, courses of instruction, criticism lessons, and teaching practice as the Principal may direct.

30. (a) Students will be liable to dismissal from the College for idleness, misconduct, unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breaches of the rules of the College.

(b) Students who at any period of their course fail to show satisfactory progress, or fail to pass the annual examinations, may have their studentships withdrawn, and thereupon all allowances under this regulation shall cease and determine.

(c) Students will be examined from time to time by a medical officer, and if the medical report is not satisfactory a student may have his studentship withdrawn.

31. The Principal will furnish an annual report to the Minister, and he will also twice each year furnish to the Director a report on the conduct, efficiency, and aptitude of each student, and for purposes of classification will assign to each a numerical estimate.

32. No person shall be allowed to enter upon a course of training for any certificate mentioned above until he has submitted a certificate from a School Medical Officer or qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, certifying that he is of sound constitution, and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher. When the medical examination of such person discloses minor defects of a remediable character, such as unsound teeth, post-nasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, such student may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months on probation. At the end of such probationary period the studentship may be withdrawn from such student if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.

REGULATION XII.(B).—SHORT COURSE OF TRAINING.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish short courses of training to be conducted at the Teachers' College, and such other institutions as the Director may determine, for persons desiring to qualify as teachers in rural schools. These courses will be under the supervision of the Principal of the College and such other officials as he may appoint.

2. Studentships at the rate of £40 per annum for country candidates, and £20 per annum for metropolitan candidates, will be awarded under the following conditions:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least 17½ years of age and not more than 30 years of age on the date of the commencement of the course upon which they desire to enter.
- (b) They must have passed the Junior Public or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, or must possess an equivalent qualification, and
- (c) They must furnish satisfactory certificates that they are of good moral character, are of sound bodily health and free from defects likely to impair their usefulness as teachers, and must furnish a certificate from an inspector of schools, or from the head teacher of a State school, or other approved school, that they are temperamentally suitable and possess aptitude for the work of teaching.

3. (a) All candidates selected for studentships under clause 2 above shall be required to spend at least one month on probation.

(b) At the end of the probationary period each candidate must enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish the course of training, and, for a period of two years after the completion of his training, to serve the Department in any school to which he may be appointed.

4. The Minister may require the withdrawal of any candidate guilty of misconduct or of idleness, or for general unsuitability for the work of a teacher.

5. The work to be undertaken during the course of training shall be:—

(a) *Professional Training.*—Lectures on the principles and on the general and special methods of education; preparation of notes of lessons and attendance at weekly criticism lessons; practice in teaching and observations with special reference to the work of the small school.

(b) Instruction in English, nature study, drawing, voice production, hygiene, physical training, and such other subjects as may be directed by the Principal of the College.

6. Students who upon the completion of the course of training pass a satisfactory examination in the subjects set out above, and pass an examination in the practice of teaching, will be granted the certificate to which they may be entitled under Regulation XI.

7. Pending their appointment to an advertised vacancy, candidates qualified as under clause 6 above will be appointed as temporary head teachers of small schools, and will be paid the following salary:—

Males, £120 per annum.

Females, £100 per annum.

8. After receiving a favorable report from an inspector of schools such teachers will be recorded on the Employment Register, and subject to the provisions of the Public Service Acts, will be eligible to apply for advertised vacancies. Upon appointment to an advertised vacancy such teachers will be classified and paid as teachers of the Sixth class.

REGULATION XII.(C).—TRAINED TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE—DOMESTIC ARTS.

1. (a) Studentships entitling the holders to a course of training for the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts will be awarded to qualified candidates.

(b) The course of training shall extend over three years, and shall be free to holders of studentships. Each studentship will entitle the holder to an allowance at the rate of £50 per annum for the first year, £50 for the second year, and £70 per annum for the third year.

(c) Students may be required for the first two years of their course to enter into residence at the Teachers' College Hostel, and may be required to perform such domestic duties as may be assigned to them by the Superintendent of the Hostel. They will defray the cost of their board and residence out of the annual allowance paid them, and will be required to meet reasonable charges for material for cookery and other training out of such allowance.

2. Applicants must be at least 17 years of age, and must be free from any physical defect likely to impair their services as teachers. In addition, they must produce evidence that they—

(a) have attended at a district high school or higher elementary school, and have completed the full course of study (fourth year) prescribed; or

(b) have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, and have completed a course of study equivalent to that prescribed for the Third and Fourth years of the course of study for district high schools; or,

- (c) have been adjudged "meritorious" at the competitive examination for awarding senior scholarships under the provisions of Regulation XXI.; or
- (d) have passed the Senior Public examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University; or
- (e) generally that they possess qualifications adjudged by the Director to be equivalent to those set out in (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this clause.

In the selection of candidates for studentships preference will be given to those who can furnish satisfactory evidence of their interest and success in domestic work.

3. (a) All candidates selected for studentships under clause 2 above shall be required to spend at least three months on probation, and no award of a studentship shall be made to any candidate who fails to show satisfactory promise and aptitude as a teacher of domestic arts or who fails to pass a satisfactory medical examination. During the probationary period the allowance mentioned in clause 1 (b) above will be paid to candidates selected for studentships.

(b) At the end of the probationary period candidates to whom studentships are awarded will be required to enter into an agreement by themselves and an approved surety not to relinquish their course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four years after the termination of their course to teach in any school to which they may be appointed. Students may in the event of their marriage be permitted to resign at the expiration of three years' service after the termination of their course of study.

4. (a) During their course of training students will attend such courses of lectures and practical demonstrations at the Melbourne University, the Teachers' College, and the College of Domestic Economy as may be from time to time prescribed.

(b) At the end of the second year students will be examined in the subjects of the course of study, and those who pass a satisfactory examination will be allowed to continue for a third year.

(c) In the third year students will be required to assist in the teaching of domestic subjects in a school, in order that they may gain practical experience in teaching.

5. The subjects of the course of study shall be as follows:—

First Year.—(1) English; (2) Elementary science; (3) Short courses in elementary bacteriology, elementary anatomy, and elementary biology; (4) Cookery; (5) Laundry work; (6) Household economics; (7) Sanitation and applied hygiene; (8) Art work; (9) Plain needlework.

Second Year.—(1) English; (2) Education; (3) Physiology; (4) Cookery; (5) Short courses in first aid, home nursing, care of children; (6) Art Work; (7) Dressmaking or Millinery.

The Director shall from time to time prescribe the details of the above subjects.

6. Students who have completed the three years' course of training satisfactorily will be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts. For the purpose of Part II. of the Second Schedule to the *Teachers Act 1905* the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts—shall be held to be equivalent to the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.

7. Persons who have been awarded studentships and have obtained the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts—shall be eligible for employment as teachers of special subjects in State schools, in higher elementary schools, in district high schools, or in continuation classes.

REGULATION XII.(D).—TRAINED TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE—MANUAL ARTS.

1. (a) Studentships entitling the holders to a course of training for the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Manual Arts—will be awarded from time to time to qualified candidates.

(b) The course of training shall extend over three years, and shall be free to holders of studentships. During their course of training, students will receive an allowance at the rate of £40 per annum for the first year, £50 for the second year, and £60 for the third year. The continuance of such allowance to any student and the yearly increment after the first year shall be conditional upon satisfactory progress being shown.

2. Candidates for studentships under clause 1 (a) above must furnish satisfactory evidence of their having the following qualifications, namely:—

- (a) that they are at least 17 years of age, and that they are free from any physical defect likely to impair their services as teachers; and
- (b) that they have passed the Intermediate Certificate, the Junior Public, or an approved equivalent examination; and
- (c) that they have had experience in teaching extending over at least one year, and have completed the examination prescribed for junior teachers of the second class; and
- (d) that they possess aptitude for teaching and special interest in manual arts; and
- (e) or, generally, that they possess qualifications adjudged by the Director to be equivalent to those set out under (a), (b), (c), and (d) of this clause.

3. (a) When the number of applicants qualified as in clause 2 above exceeds the number of studentships to be awarded, a selection will be made by the Director.

(b) All candidates selected for studentships under clause 1 (a) above shall be required to spend at least three months on probation, and no award of a studentship shall be made to any candidate who fails to show satisfactory promise and aptitude as a teacher of manual arts. During the probationary period the allowance mentioned in clause 1 (b) above shall be paid to candidates selected for studentships.

(c) At the end of the probationary period those candidates to whom studentships are awarded will be required to enter into an agreement by themselves and an approved surety not to relinquish their course of training without the permission of the Minister, and, for four years after the termination of their course, to teach in any school to which they may be appointed.

4. (a) Studentship holders who pass in English and one other subject of the Senior Public Examination, or its equivalent, and make satisfactory progress in Art, and Woodwork, for men, or in Art, Plain Needlework, and Dressmaking for women, will thereby complete the First Year.

(b) Students who complete successfully the course of study for the first year will then enter for the second and third years of the course, but such students shall not be entitled to any allowance other than those specified in clause 1 above.

5. The subjects for the second and third years are—

(a) (For Men Students) Theory and Practice of Teaching, Art, including Drawing, Modelling and Applied Art, Cardboard Modelling, Woodwork, Carpentry, Building Construction, Sheet Metal Work, Simple Glass Work, Blacksmithing. (b) (For Women Students) Theory and Practice of Teaching, Art, including Drawing, Modelling and Applied Art, Needlework, Dressmaking, Decorative Needlework, Millinery.

6. (a) Students who have satisfactorily completed the full course of training set out in clauses 4 and 5 above, and have passed the final examination, will be

eligible for employment as teachers of Drawing, Manual Arts, Woodwork; and as teachers in Elementary Schools, High Schools, or Junior Technical Schools.

(b) The Trained Teacher's Certificate—Manual Arts—will be issued to teachers who have satisfactorily completed the prescribed course of training, and who have subsequently spent at least one year in teaching manual-arts subjects and are recommended for the certificate in a special report by an inspector of schools authorized by the Director to report on the teaching.

7. For the purpose of Part II. of the Second Schedule of the *Teachers Act 1905* the Trained Teachers' Certificate—Manual Arts—shall be held as equivalent to the Trained Primary Teachers' Certificate.

DETAILS OF SUBJECTS.

I. THEORY AND PRACTICE OF TEACHING.

Second and Third Years—*Practice* one half day in each week, to consist mainly of practice in the teaching of Art and Manual Arts subjects. *Theory*, as arranged by the Principal of the Teachers' College in consultation with the Art Inspector.

II. ART.

- A. (a) Geometrical drawing—Art.
- (b) Perspective—elementary stage.
- (c) Drawing from a photograph of ornament (O.L.1, advanced stage).
- (d) Drawing from models or objects. Advanced stage. (O.L.2A.)
- (e) Drawing plant-forms from nature. (L.N.3.)
- (f) Drawing from memory.
- (g) Drawing with the brush.
- (h) Drawing ornament from a cast. (O.L.2B.)
- (i) Drawing in light and shade from models or from a cast—elementary stage. (O.S.2 or L.N.S.2.)
- (j) General design. Advanced stage. Grade 1.
- (k) Modelling ornament from a cast. (O.M.2.)
- (l) Modelling plant-forms from nature. (L.N.M.3.)

In addition to passing in the subjects named above, candidates, after due notice, must give a satisfactory lesson in any of them selected by the Department.

B. Satisfactory elementary work in any three of the following crafts:

- Roussé metal.
- Wood carving.
- Embossed leather.
- Stencilling.
- Decorative needlework.

C. Satisfactory examples of the following work to be submitted:—

1. A drawing in light and shade from any two simple models arranged as a group. To be executed in pencil, chalk, charcoal, or monochrome water colour.
2. A drawing in outline from a cast, in lead pencil.
3. A drawing in outline from a freely growing plant. To be executed with the pen or the brush.
4. A study of a flowering plant in water colour, together with one design from it in monochrome or colour, to fill a simple shape, such as a square or circle.
5. An elementary example of craft work in any material.

The works detailed under C, above, will be retained by the Department.

III. CARDBOARD MODELLING.

To make, bind, and cover the following models:—

1. A square mat. 2. A time table. 3. A cube. 4. A money box. 5. Puzzle card case. 6. Pair of small covers. 7. Needle case. 8. Tetrahedron. 9. Specimen boxes. 10. School Paper covers. 11. Hexagonal prism. 12. Handkerchief box. 13. Pentagonal prism. 14. Rectangular tray. 15. Sliding pin box. 16. Sections of cube (various). 17. Hexagonal tray. 18. Octagonal tray. 19. Album case. 20. Pen and ink tray. 21. Octahedron. 22. Sections of hexagonal prism. 23. Sections of square pyramid. 24. Square collar box. 25. Hexagonal collar box. 26. Serviette ring. 27. Round pencil case. 28. Portfolio with pocket. 29. Pamphlet case. 30. Original model.

Students should also have additional practice in the development of more difficult and complicated forms such as oblique sections of the cylinder and cone; oblique prisms; pyramids; cylinders and cones; elbows of rectangular and cylindrical sections; roof surfaces.

IV. WOODWORK.

Syllabus for Preliminary Examination.

Benchwork.—Candidates must have completed the course for the first two years in high schools, and submit any or all of the exercises, with drawings, as may be required, to the examiner for inspection.

Candidates will be provided with suitable pieces of wood, and will be required to construct some simple model, or other exercise, from dimensioned sketches, involving any of the more simple manipulations of all the ordinary tools in the Sloyd room.

They should also be familiar with the proportions and methods of constructing some of the commoner joints, such as housing, lap and dovetail halving, angle bridle, mortise and tenon, &c.

Timber and Tools.—Candidates should have a clear knowledge of the structure and growth of cone-bearing and leafy timber trees. Occurrence, description of tree, characteristic properties, and uses of the timber of the following trees:—Kauri pine, Queensland cedar, blackwood, basswood, clear pine, red deal.

Candidates should understand the principles of the construction of the tools used in the construction of the first 25 models, and be able to sharpen and keep them in proper order.

Syllabus for Final Examination.

Candidates for the final examination must have previously passed the preliminary examination; they must have completed not less than 40 models, and submit any or all of them, with drawings, as may be required, to the examiner for inspection.

Benchwork.—Exercises similar to those for the preliminary examination, but of a more difficult character. Correct methods and accuracy of measurement will be considered of first importance, both in the preliminary and final tests.

Drawing.—More advanced problems on the syllabus for the preliminary examination, with the addition of diagonal scales. Candidates should cultivate facility in making freehand sketches of all the tools, models, and joints involved in the same.

Timber and Tools.—As for first year, with the addition of the object and principal methods of seasoning timber; the cause and effect of warping and shrinking; felling; preservation of timber; common defects and diseases of timber.

Occurrence and description of tree; characteristic properties, uses, and identification of the timber of the following trees:—Oak, ash, walnut, beech (English, Tasmanian, and New South Wales), mahogany, teak, stringybark (*E. obliqua*), bluegum (*E. globulus*), redgum (*E. rostrata*), ironbark (*E. leucoxylon*).

Tools as for preliminary examination, but to include all the tools, fittings, and appliances usually found in a Sloyd room.

Theory.—Candidates should have a thorough knowledge of the theory of education as applied to manual training, and be familiar with the characteristics, aims, and methods of the Sloyd and other systems of woodwork.

Practice.—Students should be encouraged to suggest new models as substitutes for, or alternatives to, existing models and to design new forms for them.

To design, make working drawings, and then construct the following articles:—

1. Small mirror frame and bracket.
2. Flower box.
3. Corner bracket.
4. Footstool.
5. Drawing board.
6. Medicine chest.
7. Hanging book case.
8. Small cabinet.
9. Hall bracket.
10. Small tray.
11. Octagonal pedestal lamp stand.
12. Small fancy table.
13. Flower stand.
14. Book rest.
15. Coal scuttle.
16. Small garden seat.
17. Hall chair.

The Art Instructor responsible for the teaching of Design in Section II. must be consulted in connection with the design of all the above articles.

V. CARPENTRY.

1. Joints commonly used in carpentry and joinery, such as halving, trenching, housing, mortise and tenon, dovetail, &c.

2. Joints used in the construction of drays and waggons.

3. Construction of gates, doors, troughs, bins, ladders, door and sash frames, jambs, boxes, crates, and a small sash.

4. Construction of framework and roofs of sheds, stables, silos, and buildings of various sorts.

5. Making and fixing of the fittings to the buildings above mentioned.

6. Finding bevels for roof and oblique timbers generally.

7. Proportions in joints and general construction.

8. Setting out framework and erecting the same.

Working drawings must always be made by the student before attempting the construction of an exercise or object.

VI. BUILDING CONSTRUCTION.

1. Drawing plans, elevations, and sections to scale of sheds, stables, silos, and buildings generally.
2. Drawing details of the various kinds of fittings required for the above buildings.
3. Drawings of small rough bridges and flumes.
4. Description of local and imported building materials, stock sizes, quantities, and prices.
5. Taking out quantities for simple wood and brick buildings, and estimating their cost.
6. Ordering materials and checking accounts.

The exercises in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 above should also be drawn freehand on the blackboard from memory in orthographic and isometric projection.

Assuming there are 40 school weeks in the year, about 24 lessons should be devoted to Sheet Metal Work, 10 to Soldering and Brazing, and 6 to Glass Work.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 14 (1) (a) of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907* (7 Edw. VII. No. 2106) it is provided that the Governor in Council, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, may set apart any prison or other suitable place to be a Reformatory Prison under the said Act; and whereas by Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the State of Victoria, made on the 25th day of September, 1909, certain buildings and premises within the Pentridge Penal Establishment were set apart to be a Reformatory Prison within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907*; and whereas by another Proclamation bearing date 23rd day of January, 1912, certain other buildings and premises within the aforesaid Penal Establishment were set apart to be added to the said Reformatory Prison; and whereas it is expedient to redefine and re-proclaim the site on which such Reformatory Prison is situate within the Pentridge Penal Establishment: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the said several Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned, and do by this my Proclamation set apart that portion of the Pentridge Penal Establishment described in the Schedule hereunder to be a Reformatory Prison under the provisions of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act* aforesaid.
