The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will be ± 10 per allotment.

The amount of loading (3s. per acre) is to be collected in instalments, therefore its cash value, about is, 11d. per acre only, will be the limit of expenditure for road and water improvements.

The half-yearly payment on each allotment, set out in Schedule hereto, includes the amount of loading.

A By-law of the Shire of Doncaster, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered seven (7), for the purpose of regulating traffic.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Doncaster do hereby order as follows

- 1. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse, cow, or other beast upon or along any footpath except in order to cross the footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
- 2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon or along any footpath except in order to cross the footpath direct to or from any premises abutting there-
- footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

 3. No person shall, between one-half hour after sunset of any day and one-half hour before sunrise of the next day, drive, ride, or impel a vehicle or machine along any street or road, or be in charge of a vehicle or machine standing on any street or road, without having securely attached to such vehicle or machine a good, serviceable, and effectual lamp with a light burning therein sufficiently bright and so placed as to be distinctly and continuously visible at the front and also at the rear of such vehicle or machine for a distance of at least fifty yards.

 4. No person driving, riding, or impelling a vehicle or machine shall leave such vehicle or machine on any street or road in such a position as to obstruct any other vehicle or machine,
- 5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, or in charge thereof when used on any street or road, shall comply with the regulations hereinafter set forth, namely:—
 - (a) He shall carry a bell, horn, or other instrument capable of giving at the will of such person audible and sufficient worning of the approach

- capable of giving at the will of such person audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of the machine.

 (b) He shall whenever necessary, by sounding the bell, horn, or other instrument, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of the machine.

 (c) He shall when meeting any vehicle, horse, or cattle, keep the machine on the left or near side of the street or road, and when nassing any vehicle, horse, or cattle proceeding in the same direction, keep the machine on the right or off side of the same.

 (d) He shall not negligently or wilfully prevent, hinder, or interrupt the free passage of any person, vehicle, horse, or cattle on any street or road, and shall keep the machine on the left or near side of the street or road for the purpose of allowing such passage.

 (e) He shall, at the request or signal by hand of a constable in uniform or at the request of any person having charge of a horse, cause the machine to stop and to remain stationary so long as may be reasonably necessary. Any person who, being in charge of a horse, shall without good cause request the stoppage of a machine shall be guilty of an offence.
