FIXING THE PRICES OF WHEAT, FLOUR, AND BREAD UNDER THE PRICE OF GOODS ACT 1914.

WHEREAS the Prices Board appointed under the Price of Goods Act 1914 has inquired into and reported to the Governor in Council as to what prices should be the highest selling prices for Wheat, Flour, and Bread, and has fixed the following (that is to say):—

Wheat.—Four shillings and ninepence per bushel, ex Railway Siding, Melbourne or Geelong. Flour.—Ten pounds ten shillings per ton of Two thousand pounds.

Bread.—Sevenpence per Four pound loaf.

Now THEREFORE I, SIR ARTHUR LYULPH STANLEY, K.C.M.G., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do now, by this present Order, declare that the price or prices specified in the report of the said Board for Wheat, Flour, and Bread shall, for the purposes of the *Price of Goods Act* 1914, be the highest selling price or prices of those goods (that is to say):—

Wheat.—Highest Selling Price.—Four shillings and ninepence, ex Railway Siding, Melbourne or Geelong.

Flour .- Highest Selling Price .- Ten pounds ten shillings per ton of Two thousand pounds.

Bread .- Highest Selling Price .- Sevenpence per Four pound loaf.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty Kiug George V.
