NOTICE TO BOATMEN, ETC.

[No. 2 of 1914.]

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with their Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley course, on the Upper Yarra, on the 24th October, 1914, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or any objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day, provided that all motor boats shall be at their moorings not later than 12.30 p.m., and remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Customs House, Flinders-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

All motor boats to be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must either use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, or provide their own mooring pegs at places directed by the officer controlling the course.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

Ships' cutters, fishing, and other large boats, or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

TRAMWAYS WITHIN THE TOWN OF KEW.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the *Tramways Act 1890* was amended by the *Kew Tramways Act 1914*, No. 2491, extending the powers contained in the *Tramways Act 1890* so as to allow of a tramway being constructed within the Town of Kew: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the Town of Kew has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Acts and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Town of Kew: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Council of the municipality of the Town of Kew shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Town of Kew.

ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing in Victoria-street at the terminus of the present cable tramway of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, thence easterly along Victoria-street to the bridge connecting Victoria-street with Barker's-road, thence easterly across the said bridge to Barker's-road, thence easterly along Barker's-road to its intersection with High-street, thence north-easterly along High-street to Burke-road.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of the said tramways shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 8 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway with hand-brake equipments on the cars shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power brakes and life guards the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the portion of the tramway commencing at the terminus of the present cable tramway of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, thence proceeding easterly and north-easterly to the intersection of High-street and Harp-road, shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of twelve months from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramways and that the remaining portion of the tramway commencing at the intersection of High-street and Harp-road thence proceeding north-easterly along High-street to Burke-road shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of three years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and their luggage only.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said municipality.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramways as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections or part thereof:—

- (a) Between the Victoria-street terminus and the junction of High-street with Cotham-road.
- (b) Between the junction of High-street with Studley Park-road and Harp-road.
- (c) Between the junction of High-street with Harp-road and Burke-road.
- (d) Between the junction of High-street with Barker's-road and the Boroondarra Cemetery.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections or for any two continuous sections, provided however that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

With power to make a charge of Twopence (2d.) for a continuous journey over any three continuous sections of the tramway of the Council, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three continuous sections referred to.

With power also to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charge to be made—

- (1) For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity not exceeding 36 persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity exceeding 36 persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depôt until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eight years over any two sections shall be One penny, and for any four sections Twopence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Council may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically, with the proper use of any such wire.

TRAMWAY WHERE IT CROSSES THE RAILWAY LINE.

That the tramway upon so much of the route as crosses by overhead bridge the railway line (at present unused) from Fairfield to Deepdene shall be constructed in such a manner as may be determined by the Victorian Railways Commissioners to meet railway requirements should the line be again opened for traffic at any time.

TRACK, ETC., ON RAILWAY BRIDGE TO BE MAINTAINED BY COUNCIL.

All costs and expenses of and incidental to the laying and maintaining of the tram track on and over the railway bridge in High-street where it crosses the railway line from Fairfield to Deepdene, and the approaches to the same, shall be paid and borne by the Council, as shall also, as hitherto, be all costs and expenses of and incidental to the maintaining of the public highway and paths and channels on such bridges and their approaches.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

COUNCIL NOT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN ARRANGEMENTS WITH MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.

It is a condition of this Order that the Council shall not enter into any arrangement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, nor be a party, directly or indirectly, to any arrangement whereby through passengers, that is, passengers travelling over both the tramway now so controlled as aforesaid (hereinafter called the "Melbourne Tramway") and the Council's tramway, may travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways, nor shall the Council sell Melbourne tramway tickets or furnish passengers intending to travel by the Melbourne tramway with transfer tickets or any means of identification or in any way assist or facilitate passengers travelling over both tramways to travel for lower fares than the sum of the local fares on both tramways.

COUNCIL NOT TO RUN OVER LINES CONTROLLED BY MELBOURNE TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY LIMITED.

It is a further condition of this Order that the Council shall not acquire the right to run, nor shall it run any of its cars or other vehicles on or along any or any part of the lines now controlled by the Melbourne

Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or on or along any extension of any such lines, or any part of the same, nor give a better service in connexion with the trams of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited than the service connecting with the trains of the Commissioners, nor shall the Council permit the cars or other vehicles of the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company Limited, or other, the authority for the time being concerned in the tramways now controlled by that company, to run over the tramways of the Council, nor shall such cars be so run.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the Town of Kew shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Frederick Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Forests shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of violence. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Forests being made known.
