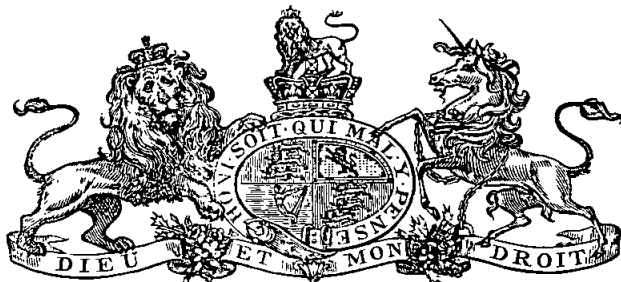

FIXING THE PRICES OF BRAN AND POLLARD UNDER THE PRICE OF GOODS
ACT 1914.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of October, 1914.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS the Prices Board appointed under the *Price of Goods Act 1914* has inquired into and reported to the Governor in Council as to what prices should be the highest selling prices for Bran and Pollard respectively, and has fixed the following on the basis delivery Melbourne—the customary scale of differences in the trade in different country centres applying as existing on the 13th October, 1914, retailers to be entitled to charge retail prices based on the wholesale price fixed (that is to say) :—

Bran.—Six pounds fifteen shillings per ton of 2000 lbs.

Pollard.—Seven pounds per ton of 2000 lbs.

NOW THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth now by this present Order declare that the prices specified in the report of the said Board for Bran and Pollard shall for the purposes of the *Price of Goods Act 1914* be the highest selling price or prices of those goods on the basis delivery Melbourne—the customary scale of differences in the trade in different country centres applying as existing on the 13th October, 1914, retailers being entitled to charge retail prices based on the wholesale price fixed (that is to say):—

Bran.—Highest Selling Price.—Six pounds fifteen shillings per ton of 2000 lbs.

Pollard.—Highest Selling Price.—Seven pounds per ton of 2000 lbs.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Treasurer for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
