## BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

### BY-LAW 28.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1915:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land, houses, and tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1915, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1915, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government, Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens, shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
  - (1) For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.  
For the domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of Forty pounds or over, a three-quarter of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.
  - (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.



## BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

## Rating By-law for 1915.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1915:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.
2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.
3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.
5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.
6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.
7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per annum.
9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.
10. For water supplied to any house or tenement upon which no annual municipal value is made, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.
12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.
13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.
15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a regulation of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

(3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1915, and on the 1st day of July, 1915.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

## NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*), do hereby present to and in exercise of the power conferred by the said *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

## By-law making a Rate for 1915.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements within the Urban District of Nagambie Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the said Trust:—

- For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.
- For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling of such valuation.
- For all water supplied by the Trust (by meter), the sum of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.
- For all water sold from the standpipe a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 100 gallons will be charged and paid on delivery.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1915, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1915, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the secretary of his intention so to do.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of an officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1915, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1915, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1915, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1915. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR ATHLETIC SPORTS, CRICKET, AND GENERAL RECREATION AT BRANXHOLME.**

**W**E, John Coutts, Simon Black, William Henry Vines Read, James Raymond Gough, and Peter Cameron, a majority of the duly appointed Trustees of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 2nd December, 1870, as a site for athletic sports, cricket, and general recreation at Branhholme, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of ever adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission in writing of the Trustees first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person, club, society, or association shall put or bring any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals into the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall cross or trespass upon that portion of the reserve used for games or sports, when crossing or trespassing would interfere with any such games or sports.
10. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis, or any game whatever in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, unless such person, at the time of playing, is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play in the reserve, or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club.
11. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and

then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- (a) That he be duly registered as a bookmaker, and pay to the Trustees such fee as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) for each meeting.
- (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied to him by the Trustees, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

##### BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 35, for the regulation of traffic in, upon, approaching, and leaving the subway under the railway line at the corner of Bridge and Main streets, Bairnsdale.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. No person shall drive any horse or other animal or vehicle in, through, or upon the subway under the railway line at or near the corner of Bridge-street and Main-street, Bairnsdale, in the Shire of Bairnsdale, or in or upon any highway leading to or from the said subway within two chains from such subway at any pace exceeding the rate of 4 miles an hour.

2. No horses or vehicles shall pass or repass in, through, or upon the said subway or upon any highway leading to or from such subway within two chains from such subway at any pace exceeding the rate of 4 miles an hour.

3. Every person will also be guilty of an offence against this By-law who, driving any vehicle or animal in, through, or upon such subway or any highway leading to or from such subway, drives, rides, or leads any such animal or vehicle on the wrong side of the road without justifiable cause, or fails without justifiable cause to conform to any of the following provisions:—

- (a) When meeting any other vehicle or animal to keep on the left or near side of the road.
- (b) When passing by another vehicle or animal going in the same direction to go to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.
- (c) When being passed by any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction to permit such vehicle or animal to pass on the right or off side.

Any person guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.
