HIS Excellency the Governor has directed it to be notified that His Majesty the King at a Court held at Buckingham Palace on the 21st day of September now last past was pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to approve the Rules of Court for Regulating the Procedure and Practice of the Supreme Court of Victoria in the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred by the *Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act 1890* (53 and 54 Vict. c. 27) made by the said Court with the concurrence of a majority of the Judges thereof on Monday the 2nd day of February 1914 and published in the *Government Gazette* of Victoria on the 26th day of February 1914 (No. 34) and that His Majesty was further pleased to order that the said Rules of Court should come into force in the Supreme Court of Victoria in its Admiralty Jurisdiction on the first day of the month succeeding the month in which the approval thereof should be notified in the said *Government Gazette* of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the resolution set out below and dated the second day of November One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid. And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such resolution should be a main road. And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board. Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

A By-law of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust made under the *Water Act 1905*.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

Rating By-law for 1915.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the Trust:—

(1) For every house or land valued under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal valuation, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

(2) For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings or upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

(3) For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, except in the case of the supply by meter to the Mooroopna Hospital, to which institution the charge shall be Eightpence per 1,000 gallons.

(4) For every public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

(5) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

(6) The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st day of December, 1915, and the rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1915.

(7) Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 24.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, No. 2016 (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Threepence per pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelpence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which subsection applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public parks and show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens and the Manifold-street Reserve, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of the said year.
- (r) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 1, 1915.

THE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of all lands and tenements within the district of the said Waterworks Trust comprised in and affected by any notice or notices heretofore or hereafter to be published in the *Government Gazette*, pursuant to sections 258 and 259 of the *Water Act 1905*:—

For the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (a) For all lands and tenements within the said district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described in paragraph (b) hereof, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands;
- (b) For every Crown allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected, or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of Ten shillings for every such Crown allotment or lesser piece thereof.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1915, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1915, and shall be payable in equal half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first day of January and July in the year 1915.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney, in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rate.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in each case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter, and maintain the same in good working order, and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rate following:—

- (a) For steam boilers, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For shire water troughs, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(c) In all other cases, water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons until the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Excess water over and above such amount will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to 200,000; over and above 200,000 gallons, Sixpence for each additional 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will, in each case, be fixed by the Trust.

5. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

6. The minimum amount to be paid for water supplied by measurement for domestic purposes only, or both for domestic purposes and for purposes other than domestic combined, shall be the amount which, at One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

7. For water supplied by measure, the minimum charge therefor being the same amount as the rate for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, upon the same days as the said rate is hereinbefore made payable, and shall be deemed to be in satisfaction of the said rate; and the excess over and above the amount allowed by the rate shall be paid for upon demand, in writing, immediately after the amount thereof shall be ascertained by the reading of the meter at the end of each year.

8. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than Twenty shillings sterling per annum.

9. Such person or persons as the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate, and all moneys made payable hereunder.

MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915, No. 30.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District, according to the municipal valuations of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound two shillings and sixpence.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.

4. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of the properties so supplied, and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1915, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1915.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 20TH APRIL, 1914.

Farm Allotments under Section 39, Closer Settlement Act 1912.

1. Every application for a farm allotment, under the provisions of section 39 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1912*, shall be in the ordinary form prescribed, and shall be accompanied by an instalment of at least three per centum of the capital value of the allotment, together with the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) for lease and registration fees.

2. An approved applicant who is not under twenty-one nor over twenty-five years of age shall produce evidence that he has attained the standard of competency required by the Act, and has at least three years' practical experience in agriculture.

3. Every applicant who has not obtained a diploma or certificate in agriculture, as defined by section 39 of *Closer Settlement Act 1912*, shall produce a certificate as set out in the Schedule attached hereto from the Committee appointed by the Governor in Council. Such Committee shall consist of the persons for the time being holding the offices or performing the duties respectively of the Chairman of the Lands Purchase and Management Board, the Chairman of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Director of Agriculture, and the Director of Education.

4. In every application as aforesaid, granted by the Lands Purchase and Management Board or by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the recommendation to the Governor in Council shall set forth the period for which instalments of purchase money and interest are to be postponed.

5. The Conditional Purchase Lease issued to applicants under section 39 aforesaid shall be for a period not exceeding thirty-six and a half years, and shall be in the form prescribed for farm allotments, with such alterations and additions as may be necessary to give effect to these Regulations.

6. The first instalment paid with any application approved under section 39 aforesaid shall be deducted from the capital value of the allotment, and no further amount shall accrue due in respect of the allotment until the period fixed for postponement has expired.

The balance of purchase money, with simple interest thereon added thereto, covering the period of postponement, shall be payable by sixty-seven half-yearly instalments, calculated according to the table adopted by the said Board or the said Commission. The first instalment of such balance, being the second instalment due under the lease, shall be paid on the last day of the six months next following the last day of such period of postponement.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW No. 82.

Removal and Re-erection of Wooden Buildings.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eighty-two, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the City of Fitzroy.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, into any part of the City of Fitzroy, or from any part of the city to another part thereof, for erection therein, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. Before any building or erection is removed into the city, or from any part of the city to another part thereof, the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council or to the City Surveyor not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall with such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, particulars of any alterations or additions proposed to be made thereto, and a tracing or copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of such building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make thereto when the building is re-erected. And shall at the same time produce to the City Surveyor satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the City Surveyor shall inspect such building or erection before removal, and shall report to the Council whether in his opinion such building when removed and re-erected will be in compliance with the provisions of this By-law and the Building Regulations of the Council, or not. If the Building Surveyor certifies that such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law and the Building Regulations, then the Council may grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the City.

3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-erected within the City.

4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling-house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the City unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner, or of the Health Inspector of any Municipal Council.

5. No dwelling or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be removed or re-erected within the City unless the same, when re-erected, shall cover an area of 800 square feet at the least. Such

building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) Stumps not to be less than 4 inches x 4 inches red gum or jarrah, spaced to 4 feet centres, and fixed on 8 inches x 8 inches x 2 inches sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced not less than 18 inches apart centre to centre, and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced 3 feet centre to centre.
- (d) Floor joists to be not less than 4 inches x 2 inches spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4 inches x 3 inches bearers spaced 6 feet apart.
- (e) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.
- (f) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part less than 12 inches above the surface of the ground.
- (g) All window sashes to be made to open, and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.
- (h) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 11 feet between the floors and ceilings.
- (i) The internal lining of walls and ceilings to be of lath and plaster, stamped steel, or sheet asbestos preparations; matchboard lining may be retained in rooms other than the main or living rooms, but if so retained must be thoroughly cleaned down and painted with three coats of oil and white lead.
- (k) All roof coverings to be of incombustible material.

All timber and material must be, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, sound and in good condition. Such building, when completed, shall also comply with the Building By-laws and Regulations of the Council.

6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

7. If the Building Surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or re-erected within the City contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving from the Building Surveyor a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure, shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—

- (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the City of Fitzroy, whether the same be approved of or not—Two pounds.
- (b) For issue of a permit to remove any building and re-erect same in the City of Fitzroy, additional to the fee of inspection—One pound.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Fitzroy.

10. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to or have operation in respect of Government buildings of any kind.

11. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence be a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law, No. 82, agreed to by the Council the Twenty-fourth day of August, 1914; and confirmed the Twenty-first day of September, 1914.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 86.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Eighty-six (86), for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections, or hoardings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows:—

(1) The By-law numbered eighty-two, confirmed by the Council of the said municipality on the twenty-eighth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and six, for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections, or hoardings; and the By-law numbered eighty-five, for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections, or hoardings, confirmed by the Council of the said municipality on the sixth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and nine, are hereby repealed.

(2) No wooden building shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool bounded on the north by the south side of Raglan-parade; on the east by the west side of Banyan-street; on the south by the north side of Merri-street and Artillery-crescent; and on the west by the east side of Henna-street at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any "wooden building," nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building.

(3) Within the boundaries of the following area of the Town of Warrnambool, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the intersection of Merri and Henna streets; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Merri-street to its junction at the south-west angle with Hyland-street; thence northerly along the western boundary of Hyland-street to the intersection with Koroit-street at the north-west angle; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Koroit-street to the intersection at the north-west corner of Koroit and Murray streets; thence northerly along the western boundary of Murray-street to the intersection at the north-west angle of Murray and Kerr streets; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Kerr-street to its intersection at the north-west angle of Hider-street; thence northerly along the western boundaries of Hider-street and Ardlie-street to the intersection of Ardlie-street and Botanic-road at their north-west angle; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Botanic-road to the intersection of Botanic-road and Canterbury-road at their north-west angle; thence south-easterly along the northern side of Canterbury-road, Princess-street, and Coulstock-street to the intersection at the north-east corner of Coulstock and Japan streets; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Japan-street to the intersection at the south-east angle of Japan and Merri streets; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Merri-street to the intersection at the south-west angle of Merri and Banyan streets; thence northerly along the western boundary of Banyan-street to the intersection at the south-west angle of Banyan-street and Raglan-parade; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Raglan-parade to the intersection of Raglan-parade and Henna-street at their south-west angle; and thence southerly along the western boundary of Henna-street to the commencing point at the south-west angle of the intersection of Henna and Merri streets—no wooden building shall be constructed, erected, or placed at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from any wooden, stone, or brick building, nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from the boundary line between the owners of land.

(4) No building constructed or made of iron, and having iron walls supported upon or attached to wooden frames or supports, shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clauses two (2) and three (3) of this By-law, at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from any other building.

(5) No building constructed or made of iron, and having iron walls supported upon or attached to iron or metal frames or supports, shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clauses two (2) and three (3) of this By-law, at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage.

(6) Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law to the contrary:—

- (a) Additions may be made in wood or iron to any wooden building existing within the area described in clause (2) of this By-law at the date of the confirmation of this By-law, provided that upon the completion of such additions the whole building, inclusive of such

- additions, shall be at least twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, twenty (20) feet from any wooden building, and ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building.
- (b) Additions may be made in wood or iron to any wooden building existing within the area described in clause three (3) of this By-law, provided that upon the completion of such additions the whole building, inclusive of such additions, shall be at least twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, ten (10) feet from any wooden, stone, or brick building, and ten (10) feet from the boundary line between the owners of land.
- (c) Additions may be made in iron to any iron building existing at the date of the confirmation of this By-law, provided that upon completion of such additions the whole building, inclusive of such additions, shall be at least twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, ten (10) feet from any wooden building, and ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building.
- (d) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Japan-street on the western side at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Merri-street, Timor-street, Koroit-street, Lava-street, Raglan-parade, Skene-street, and Coulstock-street.
- (e) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Coulstock-street on the southern side from Japan-street to Cramer-street, at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Japan-street and Cramer-street.
- (f) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Princess-street on the southern side from Cramer-street to Jamieson-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Cramer-street, Banyan-street, Liebig-street, Howard-street, Manifold-street, Muckle-street, Spence-street, and Jamieson-street.
- (g) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Canterbury-road on the southern side from Jamieson-street to Botanic-road at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Jamieson-street, King-street, Bromfield-street, and Botanic-road.
- (h) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Botanic-road on the southern side from Canterbury-road to Ardlie-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said road is intersected by Canterbury-road and Ardlie-street.
- (i) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Ardlie-street on the eastern side from Botanic-road to Raglan-parade at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Botanic-road and Raglan-parade.
- (j) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Hider-street on the eastern side from Raglan-parade to Kerr-street at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Raglan-parade and Kerr-street.
- (k) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Kerr-street on the southern side from Hider-street to Murray-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Hider-street and Murray-street.
- (l) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Murray-street on the eastern side from Kerr-street to Koroit-street at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Kerr-street, Lava-street, and Koroit-street.
- (m) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Koroit-street on the southern side from Murray-street to Hyland-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Murray-street, Redford-street, and Hyland-street.
- (n) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Hyland-street on the eastern side from Koroit-street to Merri-crescent at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Koroit-street, Timor-street, and Merri-crescent.
- (o) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Merri-crescent on the northern side from Hyland-street to Ryot-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said crescent is intersected by Hyland-street, Merri-crescent, and Ryot-street.
- (p) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Merri-street on the northern side from Ryot-street to Kepler-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Ryot-street, Henna-street, Fairy-street, and Kepler-street.
- (q) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Artillery-crescent on the northern side from Kepler-street to Liebig-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said crescent is intersected by Kepler-street, Gillies-street, and Liebig-street.
- (r) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Merri-street on the northern side from Liebig-street to Japan-street at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Liebig-street, Banyan-street, Kelp-street, and Japan-street.
- (7) Every person desirous of constructing, erecting, or placing any building described or referred to in clauses two, three, four, five, or six of this By-law shall submit to the Council of the Town of Warrnambool a plan, specification, and description of any such proposed building, and until the consent of the said Council shall have been obtained in writing, no person shall construct, erect, or place any such building within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clauses two (2), and three (3) of this By-law.
- (8) The roof of every building hereafter constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clauses two (2) and three (3) of this By-law shall be composed of slate, tiles, iron, or other non-inflammable material.
- (9) No building, the outer walls or roof of which shall consist either wholly or partially of canvas, calico, or similar inflammable material shall be constructed, erected, or placed on any land or in any position within the boundaries of the Town of Warrnambool without the consent, in writing, of the Town Council having been first obtained.
- (10) No person shall construct, erect, or place any hoarding for advertisement or other purpose within ten (10) feet of any street or public highway without the previous consent of the Council in writing.
- (11) It shall be lawful for the Council of the said municipality to pull down and remove any buildings, erections, or hoardings erected, placed, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any penalties due by the owner thereof.

(12) Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law to the contrary, any person may construct, erect, place, or make at any place within the Town of Warrnambool any wooden or iron building, provided always that the same shall not be constructed, erected, placed, or made nearer to the frontage of any street or road or public highway than a distance of forty (40) feet at the least.

(13) In the interpretation of this By-law a "wooden building" shall mean and include a building of any kind of which any or all of the outer walls thereof are constructed, erected, or placed or made either wholly or partially of wood, save and except such interpretation shall not mean or include any building or erection, the outer walls of which are constructed of metal or iron supported upon or attached to metal or wooden frames.

(14) The provision of this By-law shall not apply to or have operation in respect to Government buildings of any kind.

(15) Any person wilfully constructing, erecting, or placing any building or hoarding upon any land contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and for every successive conviction in respect to any successive similar offences against any of the provisions of this By-law to a penalty not exceeding One pound (£1) for each day such building or hoarding is suffered to remain after such conviction.

(16) Clauses two, three, four, five, six, seven, and eight of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts of the municipal district of the Town of Warrnambool described in clauses two and three of this By-law, and clauses one, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, and fifteen of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Warrnambool.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council the eleventh (11th) day of August, 1914, and confirmed the eighth (8th) day of September, 1914.

BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 14, for suppressing nuisances and for compelling residents or occupiers of premises to keep them free from offensive or unwholesome matters.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises within the Borough of Oakleigh shall cause to be provided and kept therein one or more covered galvanized-iron receptacles, not exceeding one and one-half cubic feet in contents, and of a uniform size and pattern corresponding with the following:—Every receptacle to be cylindrical in shape of galvanized iron 2½ gauge, coated inside with distilled tar, strengthened at the top with a wrought-iron band, and at the bottom with wrought-iron band 1½ inches wide and one-eighth of an inch thick to keep bottom off ground, stiffened with two hoop-iron bands crossing beneath the bottom and carried up the sides to rim. Receptacles to be 14 inches in diameter and 15 inches deep, and provided with two rigid side handles and conical cover.

2. Every such occupier shall cause all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles, which receptacles must be constantly kept covered, and must at all times be kept as clean as practicable, and maintained in good order and condition, and, when necessary, such receptacles shall be sufficiently disinfected.

3. Every occupier shall cause such receptacles to be placed within four feet inside the gateway or doorway of his premises on the days appointed by the Council for emptying the same.

4. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

6. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903* in the *Government Gazette*.

SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadmeadows made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 9, for:—

A. Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
B. Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.

C. Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

D. Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of its officers under such Regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

(1) In the erection of the internal or external walls, floors, roofs, ceilings, or any part of any building to be erected, no unsound material shall be used. The Engineer or Surveyor of the Shire shall be the sole judge as to soundness of materials.

(2) No building which has been removed as a whole or in part, whether from without the Shire or from another part of the Shire, shall be erected or placed upon land within the Shire without the consent of the Council. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of, or removal of, any building within the boundary of the land in the same possession upon which it stands, always provided that such alteration or removal is carried on in strict conformity with the general provisions of this By-law in other respects.

(3) Before any building or portion thereof is removed to, placed upon, or erected upon any land within the Shire, at least seven clear days' notice in writing shall be given by the owner of such building to the Shire Secretary, and such notice shall be accompanied by the fee as set out hereunder for new buildings, and also by such special inspection fee as the Council may direct. The building shall then be inspected by the Shire Engineer within such period as the Council may deem reasonable, and should his report thereon be favorable, a permit to remove the building will be issued. Should the report of the Shire Engineer be unfavorable no permit will be issued, but in such case the Council may, at its discretion, refund such proportion of the fees lodged as may be decided by resolution of the Council.

(4) After a permit has been issued for the removal or erection of any building, such building may be erected or placed upon the land described in the permit, but the issue of such permit shall not restrict the Council's powers in regard to the clauses of this By-law dealing specially with sound material or construction.

(5) The internal walls of all wooden buildings shall be properly framed with studs and plates, and covered with lath and plaster, tongued and grooved wood, steel plates, or any other similar lining which has been approved by the Engineer. The external walls shall be similarly framed, with sufficient studs and plates, and covered with sound new boards or material approved by the Engineer. The Engineer shall be the sole judge as to the necessary sizes and spacing of studs and plates, but no studs or plates shall be of a less thickness than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

(6) Wherever sheds or other buildings are erected upon or within 1 foot of the boundary of property not in the same possession or occupation, the external walls shall either be built of brick, concrete, or stone, of such thickness as may be directed by the Engineer, or they shall be covered with iron or other fire-resisting material as directed. This shall not apply, however, to buildings erected abutting upon or within 1 foot of a right-of-way, nor to shop fronts abutting upon a road. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Engineer shall have power to compel the owner or builder of any building to construct any or all of the external walls in such fire-resisting material as he may direct. Provided also that should the Engineer consider that the erection of any building is detrimental to adjacent property, he shall have power to refuse permission to erect such building.

(7) Any hoarding erected for advertising or other purposes shall be erected under the supervision of the Engineer, who shall require complete plans of the construction of such hoarding to be submitted to him before the same is erected, and, further, shall have power to insist on such additional strengthening as he may deem necessary in the interests of public safety. The Engineer shall have power to prevent the erection of any hoarding within a distance from the street frontage equal to the height of the said hoarding, should he consider that the position of the hoarding necessitates this requirement being observed.

(8) Before the erection of any building or hoarding is commenced there shall be submitted a plan of the building or hoarding, showing clearly all of the buildings, sheds, hoardings, or other structures which it is proposed to erect, and the distances from boundaries of the same, and there shall also be submitted a tracing or exact copy of the plan, such copy to be retained by the Engineer for office use.

(9) Upon the certificate in writing by the Engineer that any building, erection, or hoarding is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or insanitary state as to be dangerous to health or safety, or is not being erected in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, the Council shall cause to be served on the owner of such building, erection, or hoarding a notice to pull down or remove the said building, erection, or hoarding within any period which the Council may consider sufficient, such period, however, to be not less than three (3) days from the date on which the notice shall be served.

(10) In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any building, erection, or hoarding, the said Council shall have power, immediately on the expiration of the period hereinbefore mentioned, to pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and, further, shall have power to sell the material of such building, erection, or hoarding, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down or removing such building, erection, or hoarding, and shall pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

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The title (£5 Reward, Dissolution of Partnership, &c.) forms one or more lines, as a heading.

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, &c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional letter under the first is charged as a line.

Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

Signatures (in particular) and proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

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
