In the matter of the Factories and Shops Act
and

In the matter of the Commercial Clerks Board
and

In the matter of the Determination of the Court of Industrial Appeals with respect to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons; or classes of persons (other than persons employed by any banking company, insurance company, building society, friendly society, trustee company, barrister, or solicitor), employed in connexion with some trade or business of a clerk, collecting clerk, time-keeping clerk, despatch clerk, store clerk, weighing clerk, cashier, typewriter, stenographer, or book-keeper.

Before His Honour Mr. Justice Cussen.

UPON the application of Mr. P. J. Clarey on behalf of the representatives of employes on the Commercial Clerks Board, and on behalf of the Federated Clerks Union of Australia and of the Accountants and Clerks Association of Victoria, and UPON READING the affidavit of Percy James Clarey sworn and filed herein this day, and UPON HEARING what was alleged by Mr. P. J. Clarey in support of the application, and by Mr. Starke of Counsel for various employers. This Court being satisfied that there exists a *prima facie* case for review of the Determination made by the Court herein on the 2nd day of December, 1914, doth hereby give leave to the Commercial Clerks Board to review such last-mentioned Determination for the purpose of considering whether there should be a classification, and if the Board determines that there should be a classification for the purpose of classifying the grades or classes of clerks within the scope of the Order in Council dated the 20th day of November, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd day of November, 1911, and of determining the lowest rates of wages to be paid to clerks in such grades and classes, but so that the minimum wages fixed by the said Determination of the Court be not amended or altered, and so that the differential rate of wages between town and country fixed by the said Determination be preserved in the classification (if any) made by the said Board.
