SCHEDULE.

Shire of Avon.

1. *Main-Gippsland-road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Maffra-Sale road at the south-west angle of allotment 91, parish of Sale, at the southern boundary of the shire, thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 120, parish of Sale, thence north-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 13, parish of Nun-tin, thence northerly crossing the Nun-tin Creek opposite allotment 4, section 35, parish of Nun-tin, thence northerly crossing the Avon River, to the north-west angle of section 28, township of Stratford, thence easterly, crossing the Melbourne-Bairnsdale railway, to the south-west angle of allotment 36, thence north-easterly following the south boundary of the Melbourne-Bairnsdale railway to the north-west angle of allotment 6, A. 1, parish of Stratford, thence further north-easterly diverging from the railway to the most northerly angle of allotment 12, A. 2, section 9, parish of Stratford, thence continuing north-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 30, section 1, parish of Yeerung, thence easterly crossing the Perry River, thence further north-easterly and easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 11, parish of Nindoo, on the northern boundary of the shire.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.**REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.**

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 18th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) A.B.

(Date.)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, planes and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (A) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as

surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act* 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments not served with a water main situated within half a mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1914.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.**

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, do hereby make the following By-law, viz:—

(1) The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1914. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1914, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:—

(2) On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

(3) On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

(4) On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

(5) On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

(6) On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

(7) The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch in diameter.

(8) For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

Cases where Water is not laid on.

(9) On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

(10) On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

(11) Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary: the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

(12) The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) Twenty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

(13) No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit shall be £1 10s. for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an acre of any land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

(14) The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

(15) The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

(16) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each One hundred (100) gallons.

(17) In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(18) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

(19) In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1914; the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement," as used herein, shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

**HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.**

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1914 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound five shillings.

2. A rate of Six shillings and threepence shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1914.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Such rate is hereby made payable, in equal moieties, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1914, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st day of January, 1914.

2nd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.)

3rd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of the said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply

being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

CORPORATION YARDS.

By-law No. 32.

A By-law of the Borough of Hamilton, made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 32, for regulating the Market Place, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market is to be held.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the "Hamilton Corporation Cattle Market," and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market, situated on the Coleraine-road, in the Borough of Hamilton, one mile from the post-office, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle, as defined by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

2. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle on every Friday (except Good Friday), and on the Tuesday before the Hamilton Show, from sunrise to sunset. No cattle, except horses and pigs, shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on any market day, and such horses and pigs must be in the yards not later than Three p.m. on such market day. Provided, nevertheless, that should any cattle arrive in Hamilton by train on a sale day, such cattle may be admitted after Twelve o'clock noon, if notice of such arrival shall have been given to the inspector immediately after the arrival of the train wherein such cattle came. Special sales may be held in the said market on days other than ordinary market days, on application to the Town Clerk of the said borough. For such special sales the usual market dues shall be charged and payable. On engagement of the said market for a special sale, a deposit of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be paid to the Town Clerk. Such deposit shall, save as hereinafter provided, be returned after the holding of the said sale, but provided that the said deposit shall be forfeited if the said sale is not held on the day for which the market is engaged, or on some day within four weeks thereafter.

3. On every market day the sales shall be commenced not later than Twelve o'clock noon. All such sales shall be conducted in the order following:—First, fat cattle, other than the kind of cattle secondly, thirdly, fourthly, fifthly, and sixthly hereinafter described. Second, fat sheep and fat lambs. Third, store sheep and lambs. Fourth, store cattle. Fifth, horses. Sixth, pigs.

4. On the afternoon of the day prior to "Market Day," when sales are to be held in the said market, all auctioneers and salesmen, or their deputies, shall attend at the Town Clerk's office, at Four o'clock p.m., to draw lots for the order of priority of selling, first, cattle (excluding sheep and including horses and pigs); and, secondly, sheep. And on sale day the auctioneers entitled to sell cattle (other than sheep and including horses and pigs) shall first sell or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid, fat cattle as defined in section 3 of this By-law.

And after all the fat cattle yarded shall have been sold or offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid, fat sheep and lambs.

And after all the fat sheep and lambs yarded have been offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell, or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as above, store sheep and lambs, and after the store sheep and lambs yarded have been sold, or offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell, or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as above, store cattle.

And after all the store cattle yarded shall have been sold, or offered for sale, then the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell, or offer for sale, in the order of priority determined as above, horses.

And after all the horses yarded have been sold, or offered for sale, the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell, or offer, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid, pigs. And after all the pigs yarded have been sold, or offered for sale, then the auctioneers entitled to sell shall sell, in the order of priority determined as aforesaid for sale of sheep, any other cattle for which no special order has been sufficiently defined above, or about which there is any doubt, in the opinion of the inspector, as to when such cattle shall be sold, and the decision of the inspector as to the order of such sales, and the time thereof, shall be final and binding on all parties.

All such sales as aforesaid shall be subject to and within the time limits set out in section 5 of this By-law, and if any salesman shall have concluded the

sale or offering of his lot before the time allowed as a time for such sale (as to which the decision of the inspector shall be final), the salesman next in order shall immediately begin his sales.

The first salesman shall be entitled to summon his customers five minutes before the time appointed for commencing the sale. Each succeeding salesman shall commence to sell as soon as the salesman immediately preceding him in the order of priority shall have concluded his sale, or, if such preceding salesman shall not have concluded his sale at the expiration of the time limit appointed by the next succeeding section of this By-law, then at the expiration of such time limit. In all cases time shall be taken from the watch of the inspector, who shall act as timekeeper, and whose decision shall be final.

5. The limit of time to be allowed each auctioneer or salesman in selling, or offering for sale, the various kinds of cattle shall be as follows, and no auctioneer or salesman shall exceed any such limit of time:—

For fat cattle.—Two minutes for each lot.

For fat sheep and fat lambs.—For a pen of 5 sheep or under, one minute; for a lot exceeding five but not exceeding 100 sheep, two minutes; for a lot exceeding 100 sheep, three minutes.

But no auctioneer or salesman shall, in selling or offering for sale fat sheep and fat lambs, exceed twenty minutes in all from the time when he shall be entitled to start his sales thereof till finishing the same. Upon the expiration of such period of twenty minutes, or earlier if the salesman first in order shall have earlier concluded his sale of such fat sheep and fat lambs, the salesman next in order of priority shall proceed to sell upon the like conditions and limits as those hereinbefore mentioned, and so until all the salesmen entitled to sell shall, subject to the said conditions and limits, according to their right of priority, have disposed of the fat sheep or fat lambs which they respectively have for sale.

For store sheep (including rams) and lambs.—

For a pen of 10 or under, one minute.

A lot over 10, but not exceeding 150, two minutes.

A lot over 150, three minutes.

But if any ten sheep belonging to one owner are offered singly, then three minutes only in all shall be allowed for sale or offer of the ten. Provided, further, that any salesman having only one lot shall be allowed five minutes in all.

The total maximum time limit for each salesman of store sheep shall be thirty minutes.

For store cattle—

Lots of 10 or under, two minutes.

A lot exceeding 10, three minutes per lot.

Provided that lots known as singles, being less than three in number, shall not be offered till after the larger lots have been offered.

The total maximum limit for each salesman of store cattle shall be thirty minutes.

For horses.—The limit of time for each salesman of horses shall not exceed three minutes a lot, and twenty minutes in all.

For pigs.—The time limit for each salesman of pigs shall not exceed ten minutes in all.

Any auctioneer or salesman who shall have sold his lot or lots before the expiration of his time limit shall at once give place to the salesman next entitled to sell, which salesman shall forthwith proceed to offer his lot or lots.

6. At any special sale on other than the ordinary market days, the auctioneers and salesmen interested shall arrange amongst themselves as to the order and time of selling. Should they fail to do so, the provisions of clauses 3 and 4, and 5 of this By-law shall apply.

7. Each auctioneer shall declare to the inspector the correct number and description of the lot and lots of stock he intends to offer before he shall start selling. The inspector shall allot the times for selling such lot or lots. No auctioneer shall neglect or omit to give the inspector the correct number and description of any lot or lots of stock as aforesaid.

8. All cattle brought to the market for sale shall be placed in such pens or yards as the inspector may direct. No person shall remove cattle from one pen or yard to another without the consent of the inspector. After allotment, each pen and yard, and all pens and yards allotted which is or are unoccupied or unused after the hour of half-past Eleven a.m., is and are to revert to the inspector, who may re-allot same. In case of any dispute arising as to the overcrowding of pens or yards, or as to priority or occupancy, the inspector alone shall be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The inspector shall have authority to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen or yard to another, and any order or orders he may give in that respect shall be promptly carried

out and obeyed by any auctioneer, salesman, or other person placing, or who has placed, cattle in the said pens or yards, or any of them.

9. The inspector shall, two minutes before the expiration of the time limit for selling any kind of cattle, give the auctioneer selling notice of the time, and shall, at the expiration of the said time, ring a bell, and thereupon the auctioneer selling must immediately cease selling.

10. No auctioneer shall offer, or attempt to offer, any kind of cattle for the second time on the same sale day unless such cattle are offered in conjunction with another lot not previously offered.

11. No person shall on any day sell, or offer for sale, by auction in the said market any kind of cattle before sunrise or after sunset.

12. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges due or accruing due thereon. No cattle shall be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

13. No cattle which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production and delivery of a written authority from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale in the market.

14. All cattle of any kind not removed from the said market by the hour of Ten o'clock on the morning next after any sale day may be removed by the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle.

15. Every auctioneer or firm of auctioneers paying a yearly rent of Twenty pounds shall be entitled to the use of an office in the said market, provided that such rent be paid half-yearly in advance. And provided that a firm of auctioneers shall between them be entitled to the use of one office only.

16. In all matters not specially provided for in this By-law, and relating to the conduct of sales and the control of the market, the inspector's decision shall be final and binding on all persons.

17. No person shall obstruct the inspector of the said market in the performance of his duties, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or from one part of the said market to any other part thereof, without the consent of the inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, fixtures, appurtenances, or chattels of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any profane or indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said market, or in the immediate approaches thereto.

18. No person shall hold any sale in the said market after 1 o'clock p.m. on Saturday in any week.

19. The word "cattle," as above used, shall (except where the context otherwise requires) include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, rams, lambs, wethers, goats, and swine.

20. By-law No. 25 of the Borough of Hamilton, and made under section 510 of the *Local Government Act* 1890, is hereby repealed.

A Regulation of the Borough of Hamilton, made under section 610 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, for appointing stallage, rents, tolls, and dues to be demanded, received, and had by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton from every person exposing or offering for sale, or selling any cattle, and for selling any cattle exposed or offered for sale in any market provided by the said Council within the municipal district and outside any market provided by such Council.

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton, make the regulation following:—

The Council of the Borough of Hamilton shall demand, receive, and have of or from every person exposing, selling, or offering for sale any cattle in any market provided

by the Council the several sums of money as for stallages, rents, tolls, or dues hereinafter appointed in that behalf, except as hereinafter provided, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

BY-LAW No. 19.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 19, for prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander on certain streets and roads, and on lands not enclosed by a substantial fence, within portion of the Township of Maffra, between sunset and sunrise.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Maffra order as follows:—

1. No person, being the owner, hirer, drover, shepherd, or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle, shall allow such cattle to graze or wander without any person having charge of same, between sunset and the following sunrise, upon certain streets and roads, and upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence in the Township of Maffra, in the said shire.

2. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the following part or parts of the Shire of Maffra, viz.:—All streets, roads, and lands not enclosed by a substantial fence in the said township, lying to the south of sections 24, 25, 29, 32, 33, 37, 38, 43, 44, and 45.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding 20s. for and in respect of every head of such cattle so found.

The foregoing By-law was passed by the Maffra Shire Council on the third day of July, 1912, and confirmed on the 7th day of August, 1912.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Shire of Nunawading, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered No. 25, for Regulating and Restraining the Erection of Removed Wooden Buildings in the Shire of Nunawading.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, into any part of the Shire of Nunawading, or from any one part of the shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. No building or erection shall be removed into the shire, or from any one part of the shire to another, unless the owner or person carrying out the removal shall first obtain written permission from the Council so to do, and shall, in applying for such permission, give to the Council, its secretary, or building surveyor, not less than ten clear days' notice, in writing, of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall, accompanying such notice, supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.

- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, any alterations or additions thereto (and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council).
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building, and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.
- (e) Satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation.
- (f) Such further particulars, in writing, regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its building surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law, and the building By-laws and Regulations of the shire applicable thereto, are complied with.
3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-erected within the shire.
4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the shire, unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner, or of the health inspector of any municipal council.
5. Every building or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling house, which shall be removed and re-erected within the shire, shall, when completed, comply with all the provisions of By-law No. 21, or other building By-laws or Regulations of the shire for the time being, in the same manner as if it were a building or erection originally built, constructed, or erected in the part of the shire to which it is removed and re-erected. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c. :—
- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. red gum or jarrah, spaced to 4-ft. centres, and fixed on 8 in. x 8 in. x 2 in. sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 in. x 1½ in., spaced not more than 18 in. apart centre to centre, and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in., spaced 3 ft. centre to centre.
- Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in., spaced 18 in. apart centre to centre, on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers spaced 6 ft. apart.
- (d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.
- (e) Floors to be fixed level, and to be in no part less than 12 inches above the surface of the ground.
- (f) Part of all windows to be made to open, and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.
- (g) All timber and material which, in the opinion of the building surveyor, is unsound or defective, shall be removed and replaced with sound material.
6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road, or public place.
7. If the building surveyor shall certify, in writing, that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving from the Council, its secretary, or building surveyor, a notice, in writing, requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure, shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice, the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building, upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law :—
- (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the Shire of Nunawading, whether the same is approved of or not, but including the issue of a permit when the building is approved, £2.

- (b) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove from any one part of the shire to another, whether the same is approved or not, 10s.; and for the issue of a permit for the removal when the building is approved, 10s. in addition.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Surrey Hills, Box Hill, Blackburn, and South Ridings of the Shire of Nunawading; and to the portions of the Mitcham Riding of the Shire of Nunawading where the land fronts, adjoins, or abuts on White Horse-road; Mitcham-road, from the south-east corner of Crown portion 120 northwards; Calcutta-street; Simla-road; Benares-road; Meerut-street; Agra-street; Delhi-street; Colombo-street; Station-street; Doncaster East-road; Victoria-avenue; Britannia-street; Edward-street; Albert-street; Purches-street; McDowall street; William-street, from Mitcham-road to Doncaster East-road; Burnett-street, from Mitcham-road to Doncaster East-road; Harrison-street, from Mitcham-road to Doncaster East-road; but shall not apply to any Government railway or municipal building.

10. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day, and not exceeding Five pounds per day, for each day such offence is continued.

By-law No. 17 of the Shire of Nunawading, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the said shire, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF WIMMERA.

BY-LAW NO. 4.

Regulation of Traction-engine Traffic.

A By-law of the Shire of Wimmera, made under section 594 (Part XXIII.) and sub-section 29 of section 197 (Part VII.) of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating the hours during which and the conditions on which traction engines within the meaning of said Parts XXIII. and VII. may proceed over any street or road within the district of the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wimmera order as follows :—

1. In the construction of this By-law—

- (a) The term "engine" shall have the meaning assigned to the term "traction engine" by section 580 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (*inter alia*, any ordinary steam or oil engine used for haulage purposes on roads).
- (b) The term "driver" shall include the owner or hirer or lessee or charterer of the engine, and the person for the time being in charge of the engine.
- (c) The term "truck" shall include any vehicle being hauled by an engine on a road.
- (d) The term "weight" means "dead weight," and in relation to engine shall mean weight of the engine as fully equipped in travelling trim, with boiler, water tanks, and fuel bunkers full.
- (e) The term "weight" in relation to truck shall mean the actual weight of truck and load for the time being on truck.
- (f) The term "net weight" in relation to truck shall mean weight of truck exclusive of any loading.
- (g) The term "shire" shall mean the Shire of Wimmera.
- (h) The terms "secretary" and "engineer" shall mean respectively the secretary and engineer of the shire, and the term "shire officer" shall include both the secretary and/or the engineer.
- (i) The term "road" shall mean any public road or street within the shire.
- (j) The term "owner" in relation to engine shall mean the party for the time being entitled to sell and give immediate delivery to a purchaser of the engine, subject to any hire or charter of the engine then subsisting.

2. Duties or obligations imposed on the driver by this By-law may be discharged by the owner, and vice versa.

3. An engine shall not be driven or hauled on any road, except under the following conditions:—

PART "A," AS TO ENGINES PASSING THROUGH THE SHIRE OR ENTERING THE SHIRE TO MAKE DELIVERIES, AND THEN TO DEPART OUT OF THE SHIRE.

(a) Before entering the shire, the driver shall give twenty-four hours' notice to the secretary or engineer containing the following particulars:—

(i) The name of the maker, nominal horse-power, maker's number (if any), weight of the engine, name and address of the owner, and, if the engine be hired, leased, or chartered, the name and address of the hirer, lessee, or charterer.

(ii) The number, the weight, and the net weight of each truck.

(iii) The weight of the maximum loading intended to be carried on each numbered truck, and the diameter and width of tire of the wheels of the same, and the wheel base and width of track of the wheels.

(iv) The width of tire of the driving wheels, and the diameter of same, and the number and width of tire of all travelling or supporting wheels of the engine.

(v) If it be intended to travel directly through the shire, the notice shall specify the points of entry and exit, and the road between these points to be travelled, by naming the townships on the road or farms therealong sufficiently to enable the shire officer reasonably to identify the road proposed to be followed, and the time of intended entry and exit.

(vi) If it be intended to make deliveries and then depart out of the shire, the notice shall specify the point of entry, the places where deliveries are intended to be made, and the point of exit and the road to be travelled, by naming the townships or farms therealong as in preceding clause, and the time of intended entry and exit.

(b) The engine and trucks shall conform to the conditions of clauses 5 and 7 of this By-law.

PART "B," AS TO ENGINES LOCATED WITHIN THE SHIRE AT THE COMING INTO OPERATION OF THIS BY-LAW.

(a) The driver shall, within fourteen days of such coming into operation, deliver to the secretary or engineer a notice, in writing, containing the following particulars:—

(i) The name of the maker, nominal horse-power, maker's number (if any), weight of the engine, name and address of the owner, and, if the engine be hired, leased, or chartered, the name and address of the hirer, lessee, or charterer.

(ii) The number, the weight, and the net weight of each truck.

(iii) The weight of the maximum loading intended to be carried by each numbered truck, and the diameter and width of tire of the wheels of the same, and the wheel base and width of track of the wheels.

(iv) The width of tire of the driving wheels, and the diameter of same, and the number and width of tire of all travelling or supporting wheels of the engine.

(v) The head-quarters or place where it is intended principally to keep, and from which to operate the engine.

(b) On temporarily shifting head-quarters of the engine for the purposes of haulage contracts, notice of the change shall be given to the secretary or engineer at least twelve hours before shifting, specifying the new head-quarters.

(c) On entering into haulage contracts, notice of the points between which haulage is to be made and the estimated length of time involved in each contract, and the road to be travelled in performing each contract, and the name and address of the party for whom the haulage is being done, and the time of beginning the first hauling and estimated time of finishing the contract, shall be given to the secretary or engineer twelve hours at least before the first trip on each contract.

(d) The engine and trucks shall conform to the conditions of clauses 5 and 7 of this By-law.

PART "C," AS TO ENGINES COMING INTO THE SHIRE, AND INTENDED TO BE USED FOR HAULAGE PURPOSES WITHIN THE SAME.

(a) All engines entering the shire, not subject to the provisions of Part "B," and in respect of the entry of which notice under Part "A" shall not have been given, shall be deemed to be engines within the meaning of Part "C."

(b) The driver shall, at least twenty-four hours before entering the shire, give to the secretary or engineer notice, in writing, containing the particulars required by clause (a) and sub-clauses (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), and (v) of Part "B."

(c) Clauses (b), (c), and (d) of Part "B" shall apply to engines under Part "C."

4. An engine or truck shall not be driven or hauled on or across any bridge of greater length than 6 feet on any road if notice, in writing, signed by the shire officer, forbidding such being done, be given to the driver of the engine.

5. An engine shall not be driven or hauled on any road, if—

(a) the tires of the driving wheels be less than half of 1 inch in width for every 2½ cwt. of weight of the engine;

(b) the tires of the travelling or supporting wheels be less than half of an inch in width for every 4½ cwt. of weight of the engine;

(c) the ground-contacting surface of the tires of the driving wheels of the engine be not a smooth surface, free from any projections or depressions, except as follows:—

Bars may be fixed to such ground-contacting surface within these limits:—

(i) Bars fixed across the tires parallel with the centre line of the axle box or at an angle therewith, provided the dimensions of such bars conform to the following specification:—

Length—Not less than full width of tire.

Width—Not less than 3 inches.

Depth—Not more than three-quarters of an inch.

Distance apart—Not more than 3 inches.

(ii) V-shaped or helical bars fixed across the tires, provided the dimensions of such bars conform to the following specification:—

Length—Not less than full width of tire.

Width—Not less than a proportion at the rate of 1 inch for every lineal inch of space between the bars.

Depth—Not more than a proportion of a quarter of an inch for every inch of width of the bars.

Distance apart—Not more than a proportion of 1 inch for every inch of width of the bars, but with maximum distance of 3 inches.

(iii) Such bars shall not project beyond the sides of the tires, and all bolt-heads shall be countersunk, and the ground-contacting surface of such bars shall be smooth and free from spikes, bolt-heads, nuts, or projections of any kind;

(d) there be not attached in a conspicuous position on the side of the engine a plate on which shall be painted or otherwise figured and lettered in legible characters at least 1 inch long the weight of the engine;

(e) the engine be not equipped with at least four sound wooden planks, each of the minimum dimensions of 12 feet x 1 foot x 4 inches.

6. An engine shall not be driven or hauled across any culvert or bridge on any road unless its wheels be kept continuously on planks of the minimum dimensions in the preceding sub-clause (e).

7. A truck shall not be hauled or propelled by an engine on any road if—

(a) the weight of the truck shall exceed 4½ cwt. for every ¼ inch of the aggregate width of the tires of its wheels, calculated on the basis that all the tires are of the width of the narrowest tire;

(b) there be not painted or otherwise lettered or figured in legible characters at least 2 inches high a numeral, being the number of the truck, for the purpose of notice under clause 3, which numeral shall be different from that borne by any other truck included in such notice.

8. More than two trucks coupled together shall not be hauled by an engine on any road at the same time without the permission of the shire officer first obtained.

9. A truck shall not be hauled on any road if the loading exceed the maximum weight of loading intended to be carried, as specified to the shire officer in the notices under clause 3.

10. An engine shall not enter the shire unless the driver shall be authorized by the owner of such engine to sign the agreement to make good damages in the form in the 1st Schedule hereto, if so required by the shire.

11. An engine shall not be driven on any road unless, if called upon to do so by the shire officer or any official of the shire, the driver shall sign the agreement referred to in the preceding clause.

12. The driver of an engine not conforming to the conditions of clause 5, or hauling therewith any truck not conforming to the conditions of clause 7, forthwith,

on being directed so to do by the shire officer or by any person authorized in writing by the shire officer, shall drive the engine or truck not conforming either—

- (a) to such position at the roadside as may be directed by such officer or person, and there keep such engine or truck not conforming until it shall be made to conform to the conditions of the said clause; or
- (b) at the option of the driver, the latter may deposit with such officer or person such sum not exceeding £25, as he may demand, as a guarantee for the making good of any damage to roads, bridges, or culverts done by the engine or truck on the journey into or out of the shire, whereupon the driver may drive or cause to be hauled the engine and trucks out of the shire subject to the conditions of clause 4, forbidding the crossing of any bridge exceeding 6 feet in length, and to compliance with the conditions of clauses 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, and 14.

13. An engine shall not be driven along any road further than may be necessary to take it and the trucks, if any, attached to it close up alongside a boundary of the road if the wheels, or any of them, of the engine or trucks, whether by reason of the softness of the ground or the weight of the engine, or both, sink to a greater depth in any metalled part of a road than 1 inch, or in any other part of a road than 4 inches.

14. An engine in using the roads of the shire shall not contravert any of the following Regulations:—

- (a) It shall not be halted or allowed to come to rest—
 - (i) on any bridge or culvert;
 - (ii) nor on any formed portion of any road, the length of which portion in the direction in which the engine may be proceeding is less than 1 mile ahead of the engine;
 - (iii) nor on any formed portion of any road under any circumstances, unless the engine and all trucks be hauled up to one side of the formation, leaving the beaten or customary track free and amply clear for traffic;
 - (iv) nor on any portion of any unformed road, unless it be drawn to one side close to the fence.
- (b) It shall not be driven or hauled between sunset and sunrise without the written permission of the shire officer, and, if driven or hauled between sunset and sunrise, shall carry two side or front white lights and one rear red light.
- (c) When traffic requires to be passed by the engine or to pass it, the engine shall draw to the correct side of the track, according to the rule of the road, leaving the actual track clear for traffic to the extent that there be room for the engine between the actual track and the fence or any drain, excavation, or embankment forming the side of the same.
- (d) When, either by reason of softness of the ground or weight of the engine or of the truck or trucks, or for any other reason, the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, it shall at once be stopped, and shall not attempt to proceed unless and until effective means be taken, by placing planks under the driving wheels, to enable the engine to proceed without tearing up or working holes in the road.
- (e) If any holes or other damage be made in or done to the road by the engine or trucks, or if any damage be done to any bridge or culvert, the driver shall, before proceeding more than five chains from the place of damage, effectually repair such damage in a workman-like manner, and bring the damaged surface to the condition of repair it was in before the damage was done; and further, in the event of any hole being made in a bridge or culvert, he shall effectually flag the same during day-time, and light the same at night-time as a warning to traffic.

15. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For a first offence, a fine not exceeding £3.
- (b) For a second offence, a fine not exceeding £5.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding £10.
